**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Agolla): Order Hon. Members and welcome to this afternoon session. Mr. Clerk, can you take us through the business of the day?

**COMMUNICATION FROM THE CHAIR**

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Agolla): Hon. Members, this is a good afternoon and I have the following Communications to put across:

First, according to our Standing Orders No. 20 and the County Government Act, 2012 Section 30 (a), The Governor of Kisumu County will give his official State of the County Address on Thursday, 06<sup>th</sup> September, 2018. So, I would like to bring to your attention on that regard according to the Kenya Gazette dated Friday, 31<sup>st</sup> August, 2018. It was gazetted that our Sittings of Thursday, 06<sup>th</sup> August, 2018 be at the Royal Swiss Hotel. So, Members should be aware of that as this has already been gazetted in the Kenya Gazette and the laws requires for that to be done.

Secondly, the other day I did direct that all Chair of Committees liaise with the Liaison Chairperson to work on their reports that were committed or given the mandate to act upon and bring a report to the House. So, I am stressing again Hon. Members, now that we are in the new Financial Year and we have a lot of pending reports because in our Standing orders if you take

time to go through, you will find that you are permitted to bring a Progress Report of the same. This one goes especially to the Chairpersons, if at all you are not through with your report, can you please bring a Progress Report from your Committee. Please take note.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Agolla): Next order!

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Agolla): Hon. Carren Muga, you have the floor.

**Hon. Muga:** Thank you Mr. Speaker. I have the following notices of motion to bring before this House.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Agolla): Next order!

### STATEMENTS

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Agolla): Hon. Leader of Majority, you have the floor.

**Leader of Majority** (Hon. Onyango): Thank you Mr. Speaker, I have two statements to give this afternoon.

Mr. Speaker, the first statement, I give it in my capacity as the Majority Leader and more so to members of the Orange Democratic Movement in the House. Hon. Members, the Party requires us to be submit Kshs. 5,000 every month to the Party Headquarters. Initially, we had made arrangements that these monies be deducted directly from our salaries, but, that is not possible because of the two-thirds rules.

So, I wish to appeal to Members.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Agolla): Hon. Majority Leader, I beg to advice you that there are some matters that are party issues that should not be captured in our Hansard. So, you need to convene a meeting of Party Members to iron such issues.

**Leader of Majority** (Hon. Onyango): Most obliged, My only worry is that I had brought it to the attention of Members but there seems to be selective amnesia over this matter.

Mr. Speaker, secondly, it is on this issue of the 16% VAT on fuel levy. We are all aware that Members of Parliament had discussed this matter and suspended the implementation of the 16% VAT on Fuel.

**Hon. Kanga:** On point of Order, As much as I respect the Leadership of my Party in this House. Mr. Speaker, this is a House of Procedure and Rules and under Statement, the Majority Leader should base his arguments on the basis of Standing Orders No. 41 (c) or (d). Mr. Speaker, I do not get the basis of this argument of the Leader of Majority on the issues of 16% VAT on fuel as far as Standing Orders No. 41 (c) and (d) is concerned. Please give direction as per procedures of the House, thank you.

**Leader of Majority (Hon. Onyango):** Mr. Speaker, we are all aware that there is provision of Standing Orders No. 41 which gives leeway on Matters of National Importance to be discussed at any given time in the House. So, I would wish Hon. Kanga whom I know has got a very firm grip of Standing Orders to understand that there are matters that are very critical to this Country. Mr. Speaker, you are aware that this issue of the 16% VAT on Fuel is causing outrage all over the republic and I believe that we are duty bound to discuss it as a matter of national importance, thank you.

**The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Agolla):** The Hon. Member for Kondele, Hon. Joackim Oketch.

**Hon. Oketch:** Thank you very much Mr. Speaker. I would wish to give a Personal Statement. Aware that one of our Hon. Members, Hon. Misachi is not around.

**The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Agolla):** Hon. Oketch, if you are on Personal Statement you hold your horses a bit for the Leader of Majority to conclude. I thought you had point of Order and if it is a Personal Statement, kindly hold your horses, you will be accorded time.

**Hon. Oketch:** Most obliged Mr. Speaker.

**The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Agolla):** Leader of Majority, are you through with your statements because you said that you had two to make?

**Leader of Majority (Hon. Onyango):** Mr. Speaker, I was unfortunately and rudely interrupted by the Hon. Member for Market/Milimani.

**Hon. Kanga:** Thank you Mr. Speaker. In matters of grammar and decorum in this House, I usually use procedures in putting across my points. The Majority Leader is using the term *rudely* while I believe I used the necessary procedures and you gave the permission to talk. Is it in order to use that particular word? Thank you.

**The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Erick Agola):** Very well, Hon. Kanga, you are very right. You stood on the Standing Order that is provided for in our Standing Orders. Hon. Majority Leader,

you must strict yourself within the House decorum. I therefore ask you to withdraw and apologize.

**Majority Leader** (Hon. Kenneth Onyango): Most obliged Mr. Speaker. If you read...

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Erick Agola): I am afraid you have not followed the instructions that I have just given.

**Majority Leader** (Hon. Kenneth Onyango): Mr. Speaker, I do not know how we interpret language. You directed me to withdraw and apologize and I have said most obliged, in sense that means I have done so.

Let me give you a little tutorial on this. The problem with my friend is that he wants me to use the normal words. We have what we call synonyms. We do not have to use the same words every day.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Erick Agola): Hon. Majority Leader, can you please withdraw and apologize.

**Majority Leader** (Hon. Kenneth Onyango): I withdraw Mr. Speaker.

*(Laughter)*

Majority Leader (Hon. Kenneth Onyango): Mr. Speaker if you look at Standing Order No. 41 (2) (a).....

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Erick Agola): Order. You must apologize after withdrawing.

**Majority Leader** (Hon. Kenneth Onyango): Thank you Mr. Speaker. I withdraw and apologize. I was saying that the 16% VAT on fuel prices is not just going to affect the prices of fuel alone. It has spiral effects on most of the consumer products that the ordinary Kenyans usually use. One of the quickest ways of causing inflation is by increasing the prices of fuel.

I do want to join other Kenyans in petitioning the Cabinet Secretary for Finance Mr. Henry Rotich that this increment of 16% VAT on fuel is unnecessary. It is uncalled for and it is going to burdensome to ordinary folks of this country.

Mr. Speaker, we are already burdened by very high tax rates. If you go to countries like Ethiopia a price of a litter fuel is around Kshs. 70, it is Kshs 80 in Uganda and in Kenya the price is so astronomical. So, I would want to urge the CS to look at this matter so that Kenyans do not suffer any longer. Thank you.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Erick Agola): Very well. Yes, Hon. Oketch.

**Hon. Oketch:** Thank you Mr. Speaker. Mine is a short one. One of our colleagues and senior member Hon. Prisca Misachi is not around. She travelled out of the country to United Kingdom to attend her daughter's graduation. Mr. Speaker, I am just informing the House that Kaloleni-Shaurimoyo is not vacant and I am standing in for our Honourable Member. I am now the acting MCA for Kaloleni-Shaurimoyo until our senior Member returns.

Am just informing our Members that if there is any issue that touches on that ward then.....

**Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Erick Agola): Hon. Oketch Joachim, you are absolutely out of order. There are no such provisions in the law. Yes Hon. Arao.

*(Laughter)*

**Hon. Arao:** Thank you Mr. Speaker. My statement is to the Finance Committee. I have a lot of challenges in my Ward concerning the PMCs. Since I took over the MCA for Railways Ward, we have several projects being put in place and the PMCs who don't know the amount they are supposed to be earning. We even don't know if the PMCs are supposed to get this money from the contractor or from the County Government.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Erick Agola): Hon. Arao, are you seeking statements from the Committee Chair?

**Hon. Arao:** Yes, Mr. Speaker.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Erick Agola): If yes, make it in writing so that we follow it up with the committee. That is as per our Standing Orders. It will be so easy for us to make a follow up with the Office of the Clerk.

**Hon. Arao:** I had done that and I wanted it to be captured in the Hansard too.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Erick Agola): Very well. Yes, Honourable Member for East Seme Ward.

**Hon. Okumu:** Thank you Mr. Speaker. I am rising on Standing Order No. 41 (3). To help my friend have the right direction. You have made a ruling on the same and I therefore rest my case. Thank you.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Erick Agola): Yes Hon. Joseph Olale.

**Hon. Olale:** Thank you Mr. Speaker. I wish to put the following statement on the floor of this House: There is a rogue crocodile that is feeding on the people of Nyalenda. We have lost a bread winner and a mother due to this crocodile. I am calling for an action from the relevant authority so that we don't lose more lives.

If you go to Maasai Mara and if a lion eats a human being, that lion will be killed immediately. I would wish to put this statement that the KWS should be reprimanded to kill that crocodile. Thank you.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Erick Agola): Yes, Hon. Guya.

**Hon. Guya:** Thank you Mr. Speaker, I wish to seek for the following Statement from the Chairperson of Water, Environment and Natural Resources concerning the going on at a Company called NYANAS that covers both Nyakach, Nyando and Muhoroni. I wish to know;

1. How many people work under NYANAS Water Company, what are their Terms of Services and who are their employers?
2. How much Revenue is generated from the various regions of NYANAS, which are Sondu, Awasi, Ahero, Muhoroni and Koru Minara?
3. What is the Percentage of Non-revenue Water from NYANAS? What steps are in place to improve on that percentage?
4. How much has the County Government of Kisumu pumped in NYANAS since the Year 2013 and for what purposes?
5. Does the County Government profit from the revenue generated by NYANAS? If so, by how much?

Thank you.

**Hon. Okumu:** Thank you Mr. Speaker, I rise to give my personal statement regarding statements that are sought in this House. Mr. Speaker, I am perturbed that I come to this House and I hear Hon. Members raise very pertinent issues, some of them discussed and you give directions that reports need to be brought back to the House and I do not see relevant committees acting on some of those reports.

Mr. Speaker, I can recall sometimes back Hon. Kanga of Market/Milimani asking questions on the progress on Village Councils and on all the Taskforces that was constituted in this County. Your office gave directions, nothing has been done. We have been in this House and motions are discussed and you have given directions for action to be taken, very little or nothing has been done. As a Hon. Member, I am perturbed, because I don't know whether we are in this House to sit, seek statements and go home and no action is taken. Mr. Speaker, I am rising today for your office to give your last guidance on this and what will be binding as we run the Assembly moving forward, thank you.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Agolla): Hon. Seth Ochieng, you will hold your horses a bit so that I dispense with the two matters.

Hon. Members, I hereby commit the statement that was sought by Hon. Guya to the Committee on Water, Environment and Natural Resources to act upon and report back to this House within 14 days.

Hon. Members, on the same, I don't want to disappoint Hon. Members, this is the best practice that if you wish to seek for any statement put it in black and white for ease of follow-up. In relation to what Hon. Okumu has just asked, it is within the tradition of this House that the Chair is always blind. If there is no Member who sought for such statement, it is upon you to refer into your diary that I sought for this statement on such a date it was given two weeks. So, it is upon you to stand and inform the House on the statement that you had sought, then the Chair will give directions. If you remain mum and you sought for a statement and I directed that it be brought into this House in 14 days then it is upon you to rise on your feet and ask for your statement. So, Hon. Seth you are right but it is upon individual Members to demand for their reports, then I give directions. This is the reason I advised us that we need to be proactive before we commence our session of today.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Agolla): Hon. Guya, what is it?

**Hon. Guya.** On appoint of Order. I want to applaud you for the ruling. Mr. Speaker, we have always been standing here and you have been making the same rulings and I would have wished that this should be the last. Mr. Speaker, even before you rule, the various chairs are here, maybe we have reports and they have not been given the opportunity and it is always been the norm for the Chair to say that they are not ready rather than give them more time.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Agolla): Hon. Guya, I have given you the opportunity but you are out of order because the Chair had made a ruling on the same. Please resume your seat.

**Hon. Guya.** Thank you Mr. Speaker, it was only a reminder that you have always ruled like so in the previous sessions.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Agolla): Hon. Member, it is upon the Hon. Members to ask for the Statements and we know all Hon. Members who are Chairpersons of Committees. For instance if you sought for a Statement from Chair of Water and he is here. You as the Member you have to rise and ask the Speaker if you can get the statement that you from the relevant Committee and if the Chair is there or his Vice, he will give direction. So, that is the tradition.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Agolla): Hon. Seth Ochieng'

**Hon. Ochieng':** Thank you Mr. Speaker. I am rising while citing Standing Orders No. 41(2) (d). Mr. Speaker, two weeks ago, the Hon. Ojok who is the Minority Leader brought a motion on the Equipment in the Transport Department and the House approved that motion. Mr. Speaker, you did direct that the Committee of Public Works, Roads and Transport do deliberate on the motion and bring a report to this House in a fortnight.

Mr. Speaker, I am on my feet on appoint of Order on General Statements No. 41 (2) (d) and I may read if you permit me. (reading standing order No. 41 (2)(d)

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Agolla): Hon. Seth, I agree with you, but it seems that you are out of order...

**Hon. Ochieng'**: Mr. Speaker, I am giving out a progress report as far as you did direct.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Agolla): Chairman, Roads and Transport, if you are giving out a Progress Report, you cannot rise under statements. Just stand up and quote the Standing Orders on the Progress Report on the motion. If you have the report you don't quote the Standing orders on Statements and that is where you are going wrong.

**Hon. Ochieng'**: Mr. Speaker, I am making a Statement in relation to my responsibility in the County Assembly or the activities of a Committee. It states that the Majority Leader or a Committee Chair as the case maybe or their designees may make a statement related to their responsibilities to the County Assembly on the activities of a Committee. Mr. Speaker, are you getting that grammar.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Agolla): Hon. Member, on that grammar you are out of order.

**Hon. Ochieng'**: Mr. Speaker, I am giving a Progress Report on the Activities of our Committee, if you allow me with your permission.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Agolla): Hon. Member, if you only seek for the leave of the House. I will give you a chance to give out your report.

**Hon. Ochieng'**: Mr. Speaker, I seek the Leave of the House with your permission.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Agolla): Granted.

**Hon. Ochieng'**: Thank you Mr. Speaker. I am requesting the House through your Chair because you did direct that we give a report in a fortnight. Mr. Speaker, you are aware that last week we were not able to meet because we were in the CASA Games.

Mr. Speaker, we did resolve as a Committee and mandated the Clerk to communicate to the CEC in-charge of Roads. Mr. Speaker, in the cause of two weeks the Committee will be able to bring that report after we have deliberated on it. So, I was requesting through your Chair to accord the Committee two more weeks to enable us bring a comprehensive report. Thank you.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Agolla): Fair enough. The Chair for Transport and Roads has given the House a Progress Report. So, it is clear and recorded that you have sought for extension of time for two weeks so that you give this House a Report on the same.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Agolla): The Hon. Chair for Sports, Hon. Miruka.

**Hon. Miruka**: Thank you Mr. Speaker. Foremost, allow me to congratulate all the Members and Staff for their maiden participation during the CASA Games in Nairobi County. Mr. Speaker, I

would wish to bring a Progress Report under Standing Order No. 41 (2) (d). Mr. Speaker, a Member requested to know the state of some items at our Stadium in Kisumu County.

I would wish to categorically state that given the fact that I was busy, the committee was also busy on organizing on how we could travel and play in Nairobi. We did not have time to do enough investigation and get a report. I beg to ask the Hon. Member to give us one more week so that we can get time to respond to that. If you grant us that time then we will be very pleased and we will oblige to your concerns.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Agola): Hon. Members, I want us to take matters of this House seriously and it does not have to be a matter of seeking leave of the House but for the Chair to extend time. I want to give the one week that you have asked for and report back to the House. Yes, Leader of Majority.

**The Leader of Majority** (Hon. Kenneth Onyango): I am just a little bit worried because most of the Members would wish that the activities of the House run according to the standing orders and these matters of progress reports should actually be captured in standing order no. 152 (1) (2) and if you recall Mr. Speaker, in the order of business of the House, papers usually come as order no. 5. That is in my opinion that is the time that we are supposed to be giving this progress report. I stand to be guided by my reading of the standing orders which tells me that we are not supposed to be giving progress report that are pending before the House under statements.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Agola): Very well, Majority Leader, you are just advising us as Members of this House and I believe that that is how I ruled that there is a provision for progress report in the motion and on order of motion in a manner that the committees should conduct themselves and that is under Standing Order no.152 (1) (2) and that is why I directed that Hon. Kanga... Yes Hon. Kanga.

**Hon. Kanga:** Thank you Mr. Speaker. However much I agree with the Leader of Majority, I would like to say that the law is not static but it is dynamic and by indulging the House to base our argument on standing order no. 152 which is right. Looking into standing order no. 42 (2) (e) also gives us a lee way as committee Members. Mr. Speaker, I am just bringing it to your attention and not overruling the Leader of Majority so that you may make the right decision.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Agola): What is your problem Hon. Kanga?

**Hon. Kanga:** My problem is that the Majority Leader is basing his argument on standing order no. 152 which is right leaving alone standing order no 41 (2) (d) which gives us a lee way as Chairperson of committees or our Vice chairpersons to give statements of responsibilities in the County Assembly or the activities of the committees. Thank you.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Agola): Thank you Hon. Kanga. What is it Hon. Guya?

**Hon. Guya:** Almost six months ago, I had sought for some statements from the Leader of Majority and now that he is here in the presence of the Assembly, would he kindly give us the feedback of the statement?

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Agola): Hon. Guya, this is a House of order, you must have fact on the date that you sought of the statement so that the Majority Leader can respond. You cannot say that I sought for some statements from the Majority Leader.

**Hon. Guya:** Mr. Speaker, I have just said it is about six months ago and I cannot recall the exact date but that statement was on public service board that was directed to the Leader of Majority, there was a statement from Hon. Okumu on the report of the just prosecuted...

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Agola): Just concentrate on your own statement because Hon. Okumu is in the House.

**Hon. Guya:** Once a statement comes here, it becomes a property of the House and any Member is allowed to request for that statement when it is not being brought to the House. I had also sought a statement from the Chairperson of implementation committee and I have seen my friend Hon. Nyasuna in the House concerning the implementation status of the 2017/2018 financial year projects of the County of Kisumu. Now that they are here and that you directed that when they are in the House they need to be reminded. Would you kindly remind them that they do give us the report?

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Agola): Hon. Nyasuna, you will be preparing as the Leader of Majority brings the report. Which point of order are you standing on, Hon. Kanga?

**Hon. Kanga:** I am standing on standing order no. 41 on statements. I sought a statement on 20<sup>th</sup> March in relation to the task forces. Aware that the Leader of Majority brought a report to this House which was not satisfactory and the Chair did give direction that he should give a comprehensive report on the status of the task forces which were formed by the governor during his inauguration. Up to now, he has still not availed the report to the House. This is a house of procedure and rules and section 185 of the constitution gives you the powers of the High court when you are presiding over the sittings of this House under the emblem of our great County. We are using the task payers' money to be in this House and we will be doing a great disservice to the people of Kisumu County if our constitutional mandate is not taken seriously. This is a new year and let us start it very well. We have been in a learning process. The Leader of Majority should also lead as an example to the Members of this House. Thank you.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Agola): The Leader of Majority, you have to respond to the concerns of Members and as you prepare your notes, I want to give Hon. Oraro a chance to contribute.

**Hon. Oraro:** I am standing on standing order no. 41. I did seek for statement from the Chairperson of roads concerning the status of all roads in Kisumu North and bridges. I sought for the statement with regard to the manner in which the roads were being executed and the conflict between different investigative agencies within Kisumu County.

**The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Agola):** As the Chair of roads is preparing to give response, may I allow Hon. Miruka to speak.

**Hon. Miruka:** Thank you Mr. Speaker Sir once again. I sought for a statement from the Minister for Agriculture through the Chair Hon. Atieno and it is now six months down the line and I have not received any feedback. As a member of North Nyakach Ward, there were mysterious deaths of our livestock and we wanted to know the position the County has taken. What support can we get since it was the only granary that could support my community? I have really waited for the response. Thank you.

**Hon. Beatrice Pamela:** I sought for the statement from the Chair of Finance concerning our quarterly financial report. It is now two months and I feel it is important to the Members of this house that we are not able to produce the report. It is also a contradiction to the PFM Act. If the Chair is here, can he come up and give us the report? Thank you.

**The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Agola):** Very well, I want to direct that the Majority Leader, Hon. Nyasuna, chair for Implementation Committee, Chair Agriculture Hon. Atieno, Hon. Seth Ochieng, Chair for Roads, you will respond accordingly.

**Majority Leader (Hon. Kenneth):** I want to say that on the issues of reports, we are really concerned. Today we dwelt on that issue exhaustively in our house business committee because a lot of businesses in the house cannot continue. Chairs are not able to give reports as directed by the Speaker. That notwithstanding, I did say that we should not choose what we want to take in and disregard what we do not want to take in. I remember vividly on the issue of County Assembly Service Board, a question indeed was raised on the number of people that has been employed by Assembly Service Board (Casual).....

**The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Agola):** Hon. Majority Leader, allow me to advice you, if you do not have a comprehensive report, you can give a progress report and inform the house that you will bring a report later because you are only reading from your own script, no member has a copy on what you are informing the house.

**Majority Leader (Hon. Kenneth):** Mr. Speaker, I wish you could give us a little time to say what I want to say because probably it would put light to this matter. I did come to the Assembly with a report that was questioning how many people have been deployed in various departments and I did say there was absolutely nobody who has been employed. There was this issue of speaker's aids. Those are prescribed under the terms of the speaker. The Assembly is

yet to employ, rationalization is on-going and soon the Service Board will embark on employing new staff. Thank you.

**Hon. Guya:** On appoint of order, on what Hon. Majority Leader is saying that he brought a report to this house on the Assembly Service Board yet it is in public domain in this house that no such report has been brought in this house. Is it in order for the Majority Leader to mislead the house?

**Majority Leader (Hon. Kenneth):** Of course we can go into the archives and get the specific dates but my memory is very sharp and I did bring a report. That notwithstanding, the Hon. Member who asked for the report may have not been in the house but I am ready to bring the report the second time so that he gets satisfied.

**Hon. Nyasuna:** Thank you, as the Chair of implementation, I want to report to this house that our report is almost ready, we just need a little bit more time because of the activities we have had.

**The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Agola):** Can you give us the specific time that we can record down?

**Hon. Nyasuna:** The report will be ready within 14 days.

**The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Agola):** Very well, you are allowed to go and work very hard and bring that report within fourteen days. Hon. Member for Kobura, the floor is yours.

**Hon. Atieno:** Thank you, as the Chair of Agriculture, I can vividly recall that I brought a report concerning the mysterious deaths of livestock in Hon. Rashid's Ward sometimes back. If he was not around the time I was presenting my report, then I am ready to present my report again. Thank you.

**The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Agola):** If that report was presented and the Hon. Rashid did not get it well, you can visit our library to see the report because we cannot compel the chair again to bring the report, it is in our hansard.

**Hon. Kanga:** Thank you, first of all, Hon. Oraro whom I respect so much should apologize for misleading the house. I always record the proceedings of the house. Hon. Oraro sought for a statement on 24<sup>th</sup> May 2018 but he did say that it was in March this year. We recommended that the Clerk writes to the CEC for roads and we are yet to get feedback. I asked my committee Clerk to remind the Clerk on the same and we will bring the report together with the motion which was tabled by Philemon Ojuok. Thank you.

**The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Agola):** Next Order

I skipped to direct the Chair for Finance to respond to the statement and we cannot go back because we have gone to the next order, I therefore say that you will give the house a report tomorrow morning.
