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CHAPTER ONE

1.0 CHAIRPERSONS FOREWORD

Mr. Speaker Sir and Hon. Members,

This report contains the proceedings of the Sectoral Committee on Agriculture, Fisheries, Livestock Development and Irrigation on its consideration of the Kisumu County Agricultural Sector Coordination Bill, 2023 (*Kisumu County Bill No. 7 of 2023*). The Bill was published on 11th September, 2023 and went through the first reading on 8th November, 2023 in line with the provisions of Standing Order No. 123 of the Kisumu County Assembly Standing Orders and was thereafter committed to the Committee on Agriculture, Livestock Development and Irrigation for consideration and reporting to the House.

Mr. Speaker Sir and Hon. Members, the Bill seeks to establish administrative framework for consultation, collaboration, cooperation and coordination within the Kisumu County Agricultural Sector with the primary focus and backbone to strengthen cooperation and consultation within the Agricultural Sector, and to support coordination at both the national and county levels. The Bill is anchored on the Legal notice (No. 2 of 2012) which establishment the Joint Agriculture Sector Consultation Mechanism (JASCCM) with a primary objective to guide the implementation of the sectors' priorities defined in the 2016 Agricultural Policy and on a broad scope the regional and international commitments entered in Kenya such as the CAADP Declarations (Maputo 2003, Malabo 2014). More specifically, KCASCOM Committee established in the Bill is expected to ensure that the Kisumu County Agriculture Sector contributes to equitable County Economic growth and increased food security through effective linkage amongst respective players in the Sector.

Hon. Speaker, following placement of advertisements in the print media on Monday, 7th December, 2023 notifying the general public for Public Participation exercise that was conducted on 15th December, 2023 across the Seven (7) Sub-Counties of Kisumu County seeking public and stakeholder views on the Bill pursuant to the provisions of Article 185 (2) and 196 of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010, Section 87 of the County Governments Act, 2012 and Standing Order No. 123 of the Kisumu County Assembly Standing Orders.

Mr. Speaker sir and Hon. Members, the Bill got a unanimous support across the Seven Counties, with members of the public noting that the bill if enacted should provide for the procedures, for management and administration of Kisumu County Agricultural sector and facilitate awareness raising and capacity building among National and County stakeholders across the sector including day to day technical linkage amongst actors and County agencies. Of critical importance, the members added as follows; That the Agriculture Fund

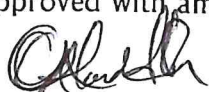
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being established should be appropriated more 10% percent of the Departmental Budget against the 2% proposed in the Bill in line with CAADP declaration and owing to the great contribution of the Agriculture Sector to the County Economy; That the bill should outline how Large Scale Agricultural Projects cutting across many wards will be handled for proper guidance to the investors; That small scale project proponents be exempted from attaching EIA & SIA as a requirement for application for the Fund due to high cost implications but instead can be assessed under *Rapid Rural Appraisals* by the ward committees.

I extend our heartfelt appreciation to the Office of the Speaker and the Office of the Clerk for the invaluable logistical support accorded to us during public participation. Special thanks are due to members of the public for graciously and generously giving their inputs on the Bill. My sincere appreciation also goes to CECM. Agriculture, Fisheries, Livestock Development and Irrigation Committee and his technical staff for giving deeper insights on Bill. I commend the members of the Committee for their active participation, meaningful contributions, and our secretariat for their meticulous coordination and planning during public participation and for preparing this comprehensive report.

Mr. Speaker Sir and Honorable Members, within this report, we have outlined our findings and observations that we believe should be considered by this Hon. House while approving this Bill.

Hon. Speaker, it is now my humble pleasure to report that the Committee has considered the Kisumu County Agricultural Sector Co-ordination Bill, 2023 and has the honor to report back to the Kisumu County Assembly with recommendations that the Bill be approved with amendments.

1.2 LEGAL FRAMEWORK UNDERPINNING THE COMMITTEE ACTIVITIES

1.3 MANDATE OF THE COMMITTEE

1. The Agriculture, Fisheries, Livestock Development and Irrigation Committee derives its mandate from Article 185 of the Constitution of Kenya 2010 and Standing Order No. 193 (Second Schedule) of the Kisumu County Assembly Standing Orders.

2. The provision of Standing Order No. 193 (Second Schedule) mandates the Committee to inquire into, investigate and report on;

All matters relating to agriculture, including crop and animal husbandry, livestock sale yards, County abattoirs, plant and animal disease control, veterinary services (excluding regulation of the profession) and fisheries; animal control and welfare, including licensing of dogs and facilities for their accommodation, care and burial of animals.

3. Further, the functions of all sectoral Committee are outlined in Kisumu County Assembly Standing Orders No. 193 (5) which states as follows;

That, the functions of Sectoral committees shall be;

- a) Investigate, inquire into, and report on all matters relating to the mandate, management, activities, administration, operation and estimates of the assigned departments;
- b) Study the Programme and policy objectives of departments and policy objectives of departments and the effectiveness of the implementation;
- c) Study and review all the County legislation referred to it;
- d) Study, access and analyze the relative success of the departments as measures by the results obtained as compared with their stated objectives;
- e) Investigate and inquire into all matters relating to the assigned departments as they may deem necessary, and as may be referred to them by the County Assembly;
- f) To vet and report all appointments where the Constitution or any law requires the County Assembly to approve, except those under Standing Order No. 187 (Committee on Appointments).
- g) Make reports and recommendations to the County Assembly as often as possible, including recommendation of proposed legislation.

1.5 TERMS OF REFERENCE (TOR)

5. The Committee in discharging its mandate was guided by the following TORs.

1. Article 186 and Article 187 of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010
2. Section 34 of the County Governments Act, 2012
3. Section 116 of the PFM Act, 2012
3. The ability of the Act to Strengthen Cooperation and Consultation within the Agriculture Sector, and to support Coordination at both the National and County Levels.

1.6 COMMITTEE MEETINGS

6. The Committee held five meetings to prepare and consolidate the findings and observations contained herein and to adopt this report for tabling before this Hon. House.

CHAPTER TWO

2.0 LEGISLATIVE FRAMEWORK UNDERPINNING THE PREPARATION OF THE BILL

7. Mr. Speaker Sir and Hon. Members,

The Kisumu County Agricultural Sector Co-ordination Bill, 2023, seeks to establish an administrative framework for consultation, collaboration, cooperation and co-ordination within the County Agricultural Sector and to create the Kisumu County Agricultural Sector Complimentary Fund to act as a Complimentary Financial and/or technical assistance to an individual, group or organization already engaged in small and medium enterprise or business related to the Agriculture Sector;

8. The Bill is anchored on following legal provisions;

1. Provisions of Article 185 of the Constitution, 2010;

(1) The legislative authority of a county is vested in, and exercised by, its county assembly.

(2) A county assembly may make any laws that are necessary for, or incidental to, the effective performance of the functions and exercise of the powers of the county government under the Fourth Schedule.

(3) A county assembly, while respecting the principle of the separation of powers, may exercise oversight over the county executive committee and any other county executive organs.

for—

(4) A county assembly may receive and approve plans and policies

(a) the management and exploitation of the county's resources; and

(b) the development and management of its infrastructure and institutions.

2. Provisions of Article 186 of the Constitution, 2010;

Functions and Powers of County Governments

(1) Except as otherwise provided by this Constitution, the functions and powers of the national government and the county governments, respectively, are as set out in the Fourth Schedule.

(2) A function or power that is conferred on more than one level of government is a function or power within the concurrent jurisdiction of each of those levels of government.

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(3) A function or power not assigned by this Constitution or national legislation to a county is a function or power of the national government.

(4) For greater certainty, Parliament may legislate for the Republic on any matter.

3. Provisions of Article 187 of the Constitution, 2010;

(1) A function or power of government at one level may be transferred to a government at the other level by agreement between the governments if—

(a) The function or power would be more effectively performed or exercised by the receiving government; and

(b) The transfer of the function or power is not prohibited by the legislation under which it is to be performed or exercised.

(2) If a function or power is transferred from a government at one level to a government at the other level—

(a) Arrangements shall be put in place to ensure that then resources necessary for the performance of the function or exercise of the power are transferred; and

(b) Constitutional responsibility for the performance of the function or exercise of the power shall remain with the government to which it is assigned by the Fourth Schedule.

4. Provisions of Section 116 of the PFM Act, 2012

Power to establish other county public funds

(1) A County Executive Committee member for finance may establish other public funds with the approval of the County Executive Committee and the county assembly.

(2) For every county public fund established, the County Executive Committee member for finance shall designate a person responsible for administering that fund.

2.1 OBJECTS AND PURPOSE OF THE BILL

9. Mr. Speaker Sir and Hon. Members,

The purpose of this Act is to provide for the procedures for the management and administration of the Kisumu County Agricultural Sector through collaboration, consultation, cooperation and coordination in the County by —

- (a) Establishing the Kisumu County Agricultural Sector Co-ordination Mechanism Committee to facilitate and enhance Collaboration, Co-operation, Coordination and Consultation among agricultural sector stakeholders in the County;
- (b) Coordinating collection and dissemination of agricultural information to the public to create awareness and best practice;
- (c) Seeking and receiving grants from the National government and relevant implementing partners for the Agriculture sector
- (d) Implementing any relevant obligations of the State under international agreements related to agricultural products;
- (e) Strengthening the Department of Agriculture and provide it with adequate mandate and authority to enable it to coordinate, supervise, regulate and manage all activities related to the agricultural sector within the County;
- (f) Requiring lead agencies including government, departments, partners and the private sector, and individual citizens to undertake their own respective roles in the Agricultural sector; and
- (g) Providing for procedural and administrative matters related to Agricultural development in the County.

2.2 OPERATIONAL CONTEXT OF THE BILL

10. Mr. Speaker Sir and Hon. Members

In the current County Agricultural Coordination Framework, the County relies on the Joint Agricultural Sector Consultation and Coordination Mechanism (JASCCM) as a framework for consultation and cooperation in line with the Intergovernmental Relations

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Act 2012. This structure was established to provide regular direction for agricultural sector transformation initiatives agreed between the two levels of government (National and county), and follows-up upon Intergovernmental Forum meetings. A specific role of the JASCOM is to oversee the functioning of the Joint Agriculture Intergovernmental Secretariat (JAS-IGS) and the Sector Technical Working Groups – (SWAGs) to ensure that decisions and resolutions are circulated to and implemented by relevant entities within the two levels of government.

II. The Bill therefore proposes the establishment of the Kisumu County Agricultural Sector Coordination Mechanism (KASCOM) anchored on Legal Notice (No. 2 of 2012) on Establishment of Joint Committees in Agriculture Sector under (Intergovernmental Relations Act) 2012 and is mandated is to:

1. Establish multidisciplinary structures for coordination of agricultural sector in the County.
2. Develop instruments for operation and accountability of the coordination structures.
3. Foster collaborations and linkages with public and private institutions in the management and delivery of agricultural programs and services.
4. Support implementation or development of Policies/ strategies/ regulations/ plans/ legislations of relevance to sector.

OVERVIEW OF THE BILL

12. Mr. Speaker Sir and Hon. Members,

The Kisumu County Agricultural Sector Co-ordination Bill, 2023 comprises of Seven Parts and total of 35 clauses.

Below are the highlights of the provisions of various parts and clauses of Bill;

13. PART I - GIVES FOR PRELIMINARY PROVISIONS WHICH INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING:

Clause 1:- Citation.

Clause 2: - Provides for the Interpretation

Clause 3: - Provides for the Objects and Purpose of the Act which is to provide for the procedures for the management and administration of the Kisumu County Agricultural Sector through collaboration, consultation, cooperation and coordination in the County.

Clause 4: - Provides for the values and principles which must guide the implementation and interpretation of the Act and consequently the operations of the KASCOM Committee and the Ward Agricultural Sector Consultation and Coordination Committee.

14. PART II - PROVIDES FOR THE INSTITUTIONAL ARRANGEMENT OF THE BILL.

This part includes: Clauses (5 – 20) as follows:

Clause 5: - Provides for the establishment of the Kisumu County Agricultural Sector Consultation and Cooperation Mechanism Committee for purposes of facilitating consultation and coordination at the County Level.

Clause 6: - Provides for the Constitution and composition of the KASCOM Committee and compels a composition of not more than 9 members and in accordance to the two-thirds gender rule.

Clause 7: - Provides for the tenure of Membership of the KASCOM Committee which states that the tenure of membership shall not exceed three years and eligibility of reappointment for a further term of three years.

Clause 8: - Provides for the Functions and Powers of the KASCOM Committee

Clause 9: - Provides for the established of the KASCOM Secretariat which shall provide technical assistance to the KASCOM Committee.

Clause 10: - Provides for the functions of the KASCOM Secretariat.

Clause 11: - Provides for the Composition of the KASCOM Secretariat. This clause compels

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a membership composed majorly of technical persons sourced from the Department. This Clause however does not provide for maximum limit of composition of the Secretariat.

Clause 12: - Provides for the conduct and disclosure of interest.

Clause 13: Provides for the procedures for cessation of Membership of both the KASCOM Committee and its secretariat.

Clause 14: - Provides for the establishment of the Ward Agricultural Sector Consultation and Cooperation Committee in every Ward.

Clause 15: - Provides for the Functions of the Ward Agricultural Consultation and Cooperation Committee.

Clause 16: - Provides for the Composition of the Committee and compels a maximum number of not more than nine (9) members.

Clause 17: - Provides for qualification for appointment as a member of the Ward Agricultural Sector Consultation and Cooperation Committee.

Clause 18: - Provides for the remuneration of the KASCOM and Ward Agricultural Sector Consultation and Cooperation Committee.

Clause 19: - Provides for the frequency of meeting of the Committees providing that the committees shall meet at least four times per year excluding special meetings.

Clause 20: - Provides for the Quorum of meetings and binds the Committees to strict observance of the quorum rule and further limiting the freedom of adjusting the rule depending on the number of Members present for meetings.

14. PART III - PROVIDES FOR COUNTY AGRICULTURAL SECTOR COORDINATION PLANNING - This Part includes Clauses (21 and 22) as follows:

Clause 21: - Provides for the mandate of the CEC Member for Agriculture to formulate the Kisumu County Agricultural Sector Strategic Plan within six months of the Act coming into force.

Clause 22: - Provides for the mandate of the KASCOM Committee to conduct consultations and coordination in the formulation of the County Agricultural Action Plan.

15. PART IV - PROVIDES FOR THE PARTICIPATION AND COLLABORATION IN AGRICULTURAL PROJECTS AND ACCESS TO INFORMATION.

This Part includes:

Clause 23 : - Provides for procedures for small scale agricultural project proposal.

Clause 24 : - Provides for the requirements for agricultural project applicants.

Clause 25 : - Provides for the procedures for approval of projects.

Clause 26 : - Provides for obligation of the Project applicant.

Clause 27 : - Provides for mandatory public sensitization and creation of awareness on County Strategy for Agricultural Sector education and public awareness.

Clause 28 : - Provides for the requirements for facilitation and promotion of access to information.

16. PART V - PROVIDES FOR THE FINANCIAL PROVISIONS OF THE BILL.

This Part includes Clauses (29 – 32) as follows:

Clause 29: - Provides for the establishment of the Kisumu County Agriculture Fund whose purposes has been provided for in Clause 30 which include the distribution of complimentary capitation to approved small scale agricultural projects within the County.

Clause 31: - Provides for the Sources of Funds for the Kisumu County Agriculture Fund.

Clause 32: - Provides for the Regulations of the Fund which shall be formulated by the CEC Member for Finance.

17. PART VI - PROVIDES FOR THE MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS OF THE BILL

This Part includes clauses (33 – 35) as follows:

Clause 33: Provides for provisions for indemnity from personal liability.

Clause 34: - Provides for Offences and Penalties. This Clause contains provisions in respect of offences relating to the conduct of Employees or persons engaged in the implementation of the Act.

18. PART VII - PROVIDES FOR THE DELEGATED LEGISLATION

Clause 35 – Gives the CEC Agriculture authority to make regulations within 90 days of the Act coming into force for effective implementation of the Act.

CHAPTER THREE

3.0 PUBLIC PARTICIPATION ON THE KISUMU COUNTY AGRICULTURAL SECTOR CO-ORDINATION BILL, 2023 PURSUANT TO:

19. The Provisions of Article 185 (2) and 196 of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010, Section 87 of the County Governments Act, 2012 Read Together with Standing Order No. 123 of the Kisumu County Assembly Standing Orders.

20. Mr. Speaker Sir and Hon. Members,

Following placement of advertisements in the print media on Monday, 7th December, 2023 (SEE ANNEX I) inviting members of the general public for Public Participation exercise that was conducted on 15th December, 2023 across the Seven (7) Sub-Counties of Kisumu County. The Committee received both oral and written submissions from the exercise. The Committee also received Memoranda from KIBOS SUGAR AND ALLIED INDUSTRIES LTD and CALLEB ODHIAMBO OCHIENG' OF KENYA NATIONAL FEDERATION OF SUGARCANE FARMERS (K.F.S.F) (SEE ANNEX II).

4.0 GENERAL COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

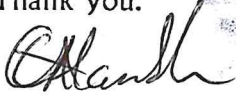

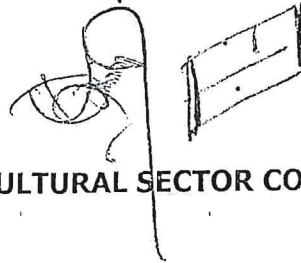

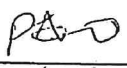
