PREAMBLE

Mr. Speaker and Hon. Members;

1. Pursuant to the Provisions of Sections 87 of the County Governments Act ,2012, read together with Section 6 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approvals) Act, 2017; His Excellency the Governor submitted to the County Assembly the Nomination of Dr. K’onyango Charles Otieno (CBS); Nominee for the Position of the CEC Member for Lands and Physical Planning for vetting and approval by the County Assembly.
2. The Nomination of Dr. K’Onyango Charles Otieno was conveyed to the Speaker of the County Assembly through letter dated Ref. CGK/CS/ADM/20/VOL.VII/52 dated 14th February, 2025. The Nominees curricula vitae and testimonials were enclosed in the letter. *(See Annexure i)*
3. On 25th February, 2025 and pursuant to Section 6 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approvals Act), the Leader of the Majority Party; Hon. Kennedy Ooko tabled the name of the Nominee to the House for approval. Pursuant to Section 6 (7) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approvals) Act, 2017 and Standing Order No. 187, the Hon. Speaker committed the Nominee to the Committee on Appointments for vetting and reporting to the House within twenty-one (21) days.
4. Consequently, and in accordance with Section 7 (4) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approvals) Act, 2017, the Clerk of the County Assembly placed an advertisement in the print media on 27th February, 2025 notifying the Nominee of the time and place of the approval hearing and invited the public to submit memoranda by way of written statements on oath (*affidavit*) on the suitability or otherwise of the Nominee in accordance with the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approvals) Act, 2017 (*Annexure ii*). The Advertisement indicated that the submissions were to be received on or before 6th March, 2025 at 9.00a.m. By close of the submission deadline, the Committee had not received any memoranda touching on the suitability of the Nominee for appointment.
5. Further in fulfillment of the provisions of Sections 87 of the County Governments Act, 2012 read together with section 7 (5) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approvals) Act, 2017 and Standing Order No. 187 the Clerk of the County Assembly on 27th February, 2025 notified the public through the print media that the Committee would conduct the approval hearing on Thursday 6th March, 2025 at 10.30am at the County Assembly Chambers. (*Annexure ii*)

6. The Nominee appeared before the Committee as scheduled on Thursday 6th March, 2025 for approval hearings in accordance with the provisions of the Constitution, the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approvals) Act, 2017 and the County Assembly Standing Orders on his suitability or otherwise for appointment to the position of CEC Member for Lands and Physical Planning.
7. Therefore, may I take this opportunity to thank all the Members of the Committee for their input and valuable contributions and time during the approval hearings and deliberations during the writing of the Report. The Committee also takes this opportunity to thank the Offices of the Speaker and of the Clerk of the County Assembly for the technical support accorded to it during the exercise.
8. On behalf of the Committee on Appointments and pursuant to Sections 87 of the County Governments Act, 2012, Section 9 (2) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approvals) Act, 2017 read together with Standing Order No. 187 of the Kisumu County Assembly Standing Orders, it is now my duty and privilege to present to this House, the Report of the Committee on the Suitability of Dr. K'onyango Charles Otieno Nominee for appointment to the position of CEC Member for Lands and Physical Planning for consideration.

Establishment and Mandate of the Committee

Mr. Speaker and Hon. Members;

9. The Committee on Appointments is established under Standing Order No. 187. Standing Order No. 187 (4) provides that the Committee on Appointments shall;

consider, for approval by the County Assembly, appointments under Articles 179(2) of the Constitution.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Notification to the House and Referral to the Committee.

Mr. Speaker and Hon. Members;

11. Pursuant to the provisions of the Standing Orders, the Hon. Kennedy Ooko; Leader of Majority on 25th February, 2025 tabled a Notice of Nomination of the Nominee and informed the House of the Governor's Nomination in regards to the position of Chairperson for the Kisumu County Revenue Board.
12. Section 9 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approvals) Act, 2017 provides that unless otherwise provided in any law, a committee shall consider a nomination and table its report in the County Assembly for debate and decision within twenty-one sitting days from the date on which the committee first sits to consider the nomination.
13. Pursuant to Section 8 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approvals) Act, 2017 and Standing Order No. 187 the name and curriculum vitae of the Nominee were referred to the Committee on Appointments for approval hearings and reporting to the House within twenty-one (21) days.

Notification to the Public and the Nominee

14. Article 118 of the Constitution provides that the County Assembly shall facilitate public participation and involvement in the legislative business and other business of the County Assembly and its Committees.
15. Section 7(4) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approvals) Act, 2017 provides that the Clerk shall notify the public of the time and place for holding an approval hearing at least seven days prior to the hearings.
16. Further, Section 7(10) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approvals) Act, 2017 provides that *“any person may, prior to the approval hearings and by written statement on oath provide the clerk with evidence contesting the suitability of a candidate to hold office to which the Candidate has been nominated”*.
17. Pursuant to Article 118 of the Constitution as read with Section 7 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approvals) Act, 2017, the Clerk of the Assembly placed an advertisement in the print media on 27th February, 2025 (*Annexure ii*) inviting the public to submit

memoranda by way of written statement on oath (affidavit) on the suitability or otherwise of the Nominees in conformity with Section 7 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approvals) Act, 2017. The Advertisement indicated that the submissions were to be received on or before Thursday 6th March, 2025 at 6.00pm.

18. Further pursuant to Article 118 of the Constitution, Section 7 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approvals) Act, 2017 and Standing Order No. 187 the Clerk of the Assembly notified the general public that the approval hearing of the Nominees would be conducted on Thursday, 6th March, 2025 at 10.30am.

Clearance and Compliance Requirements

19. On Friday 7th March, 2025 vide letter Ref. CAK/EACC/VOL.III/3/25 (01) the Clerk of the Assembly wrote to the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC) requesting for reports with respect to the ethics and integrity compliance of the Nominee. (Annex iii)
20. The Committee is yet to receive a response from the EACC on the same.

Issues for Consideration during the Approval Hearings

21. The Public Appointments (County Assembly Approvals) Act, 2017 provides that:

An approval hearing shall focus on a candidate's academic credentials, professional training and experience, personal integrity and background.

The criteria specified in the schedule shall be used by a Committee during an approval hearing for the purposes of vetting a candidate.

22. Additionally, Section 8 of the Act provides that the issues for consideration by the relevant Committee in relation to any nomination shall be: -
 - a) *Procedure used to arrive at the Nominee*
 - b) *Any Constitutional or statutory requirements relating to the Office in question, and*
 - c) *The suitability of the Nominee for the appointment proposed having regard to whether the nominee's abilities, experience and qualities meet the needs of the body to which the Nomination is being made.*

23. While conducting the approval hearings, the Committee was therefore guided by the provisions of Section 8 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approvals) Act, 2017 and the provisions of the Standing Orders.

Procedure for Nomination

24. Article 179 of the Constitution confers upon the Governor the power to appoint County Executive Committee Members, with the approval of the County Assembly.

25. Section 4 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies) Approvals Act, 2017 further requires the appointing authority, upon nominating a person for appointment, to notify the County Assembly.

26. In this regard, pursuant to Article 179 of the Constitution and Section 35 of the County Governments Act, 2012, the Governor notified the County Assembly of the Nomination of the Nominee for appointment to the Office of the County Executive Committee Member for Lands and Physical Planning.

Leadership and Integrity

27. The Committee, in determining the suitability of the Nominee, was also guided by the provisions on Leadership and integrity as outlined under Chapter Six of the Constitution. In particular, Article 72 (2) of the Constitution which provides that the guiding principles of leadership and integrity include:

- a. Selection on the basis of personal integrity, competence and suitability,
- b. Objectivity and impartiality in decision making and in ensuring that decisions are not influenced by nepotism, favoritism, other improper motives or corrupt practices;
- c. Selfless service based solely on the public interest, demonstrated by –
 - i. Honesty in the execution of public duties; and
 - ii. The declaration of any personal interest that may conflict with public duties;
- d. Accountability to the public for decision and actions; and
- e. Discipline and commitment in service to the people

28. Article 75 of the Constitution requires a state officer, whether in public or private life to behave in a manner that avoids conflict between personal interest and public official duties. This Article further prohibits a state Officer who has been removed from office under it from holding any other state office.
29. Article 77(1) of the Constitution prohibits a full time State Officer from participating in any other gainful employment.
30. Article 77(2) of the Constitution prohibits an appointed State Officer from holding office in a political party. Article 78 of the Constitution disqualifies persons who are not Kenyan Citizens from appointment as State Officers. Further, a State Officer is barred from holding dual Citizenship.
31. In addition, the Committee considered section 10 of the Leadership and Integrity Act, 2012 in particular which provides that: -

A state Officer shall, to the best of their ability –

- a) Carry out the duties of the Office efficiently and honestly;*
- b) Carry out the duties in a transparent and accountable manner;*
- c) Keep accurate records and documents relating to the functions of the office; and*
- d) Report truthfully on all matters of the organization which they represent.*

Criteria used to arrive at the Nominee.

32. Pursuant to Section 8 (a) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approvals) Act, 2017, one of the subject areas that must be vetted by the County Assembly is the procedure that was used to arrive at the Nominee. The purpose of vetting the procedure used to arrive at the Nominee by the County Assembly is to ascertain whether the process used to arrive at the Nominee for the position was competitive enough to grant equal opportunity to eligible candidates.
33. Consequently, pursuant to the provisions of Section 8 (a) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approvals) Act, 2017, read together with Section 35 of the County Governments Act, 2025 provides that the nomination of the CEC Member is a constitutional prerogative of the Governor as there is no further prescribed procedure in the Constitution or statute law

Constitutional and Statutory Requirements.

34. The County Governments Act, 2012 in addition gives guidelines on how to appoint persons to the County Executive Committee which include:

Two-thirds Gender Rule

35. Article 27(8) of the Constitution provides that the State shall take legislative and other measures to implement the principle that not more than two-thirds of the members of elective or appointive bodies shall be of the same gender.
36. Section 35 (1) (b) of the County Governments Act, 2012 provides that in constituting the County Executive Committee consideration shall be made to the two-thirds gender rule.

Representative of Regional and Ethnic Diversity

37. Section 35 (1) (a) of the County Governments Act, 2012 provides that the Composition of the County Executive Committee shall reflect the regional and ethnic diversity of the People of Kenya.

Leadership and Integrity

38. The Committee, in determining the suitability of the Nominee, was also guided by the provisions on Leadership and integrity as outlined under Chapter Six of the Constitution. In particular, Article 73 (2) of the Constitution which provides that the guiding principles of leadership and integrity include:
- f. Selection on the basis of personal integrity, competence and suitability,
 - g. Objectivity and impartiality in decision making and in ensuring that decisions are not influenced by nepotism, favoritism, other improper motives or corrupt practices;
 - h. Selfless service based solely on the public interest, demonstrated by –
 - iii. Honesty in the execution of public duties; and
 - iv. The declaration of any personal interest that may conflict with public duties;
 - i. Accountability to the public for decision and actions; and
 - j. Discipline and commitment in service to the people.
39. Article 75 of the Constitution requires a state officer, whether in public or private life to behave in a manner that avoids conflict between personal interest and public official duties. This

Article further prohibits a state Officer who has been removed from office under it from holding any other state office.

40. Article 77(1) of the Constitution prohibits a full time State Officer from participating in any other gainful employment.

Suitability of the Nominee for the proposed appointment having regard to whether the Nominees’ abilities, experience and qualities meet the needs of the body to which the nomination is being made.

45. The Suitability of the Nominee was assessed after scrutiny of the Nominee’s academic credentials, professional training and experience, personal integrity, background and qualities as well as his performance during the approval hearings conducted on Thursday 6th March, 2025.

Memoranda from the Members of the Public in respect of the Nominees.

47. The Committee did not receive any Memorandum from the Members of the Public in respect of the Nominees opposing their nomination.

APPROVAL HEARINGS OF THE NOMINEES.

48. The Committee held its approval hearing on Thursday 6th March, 2025 in accordance with the advertisement placed in the Star and the Star Newspaper.

Dr. K'Onyango Charles Otieno the Nominee to the Office of the CEC Members for Lands and Physical Planning appeared before the Committee on Thursday 6th March, 2025 at 10.30am and was vetted under oath pursuant to the Oath and Statutory Declarations Act, (Cap. 15), the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approvals) Act, 2017 and Standing Orders of the Kisumu County Assembly.

52. The Committee having considered the nominees filled questionnaire pursuant to Section 7(9) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approvals) Act, 2017, his curriculum vitae and having heard his oral submissions during the approval hearing, made the following observations on his suitability for appointment as the Chairperson for the Kisumu County Revenue Board.

53. **THAT**, pursuant to Section 37 of the County Governments Act, 2012 the Nominee is eligible for appointment to the position of the CEC Member for Lands and Physical Planning since he is a Kenyan Citizen and does not hold a dual citizenship and is a holder of at least a first degree of Bachelors of Science from the University of Nairobi.

54. **THAT**, the Nominee meets the requirements of Chapter Six of the Constitution on Leadership and integrity having received clearance from the following Statutory Bodies:

- i. Higher Education Loans Board(HELB)
- ii. Credit Reference Bureau (CRB)
- iii. Directorate of Criminal Investigation
- iv. Kenya Revenue Authority
- v. Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission

55. **THAT**, the Nominee has never been charged in a court of law in the past three years.

56. **THAT**, the Nominee has never been dismissed from Office under Article 75 of the Constitution for contravention of the provisions of Article 75 (1) *conflict of interest*), Article 76 (*financial probity*) Article 77 (*restriction on activities of a State Officer* and Article 78 (2) (*dual citizenship*) of the Constitution.

57. **THAT**, the Nominee demonstrated knowledge of topical, administrative and technical issues touching on government and has the requisite abilities, qualifications and experience required to serve as the CEC Member for Lands, Physical Planning and Housing.
58. **THAT**, the Nominee was awarded a score of **80.4%** by the Committee Panelists as indicated in the following scoresheet analysis below:
