- 1. The Request for Proposal (RFP) has been prepared by County Assembly of Kisumu for the Provision of Consultancy services for Development of County Assembly of Kisumu Strategic Plan 2020 2024.
- 2. The RFP includes Standard form of Contract for Large Assignments and small assignment which are for lump sum or time based payments.
- 3. The General Conditions of Contract should not be modified and instead the Special Conditions of Contract should be used to reflect the unique circumstances of the particular assignment. Similarly, the information to consultants should only be clarified or amended through the Appendix to information to Consultants.

2.1 Introduction

- 2.1.1 The County Assembly of Kisumu (CAK) (herewith referred to as the client)will select a firm among those invited to submit a proposal, in accordance with the method of selection detailed in Appendix to Information To Consultants (ITC). The method of selection shall be as indicated by the procuring entity in the Appendix.
- **2.1.2** The consultants are invited to submit a Technical Proposal and a Financial Proposal separately, as specified in the Appendix "ITC".
- 2.1.3 The consultants must familiarize themselves with local conditions and take theminto account in preparing their proposals. To obtain first-hand information on the assignment and on the local conditions, consultants are encouraged to liaise with the CAK regarding any information that they may require before submitting a proposal as provided in Appendix "ITC".
- 2.1.4 Please note that: (i) the costs of preparing the proposal and of negotiating the Contract, including any visit to the Client are not reimbursable as a direct cost of the assignment; and (ii) the Client is not bound to accept any of the proposals submitted.
- 2.1.5 The CAK employees, committee members, board members and their relatives(spouse and children) are not eligible to participate.

2.2 Clarification and Amendment of RFP Documents

- 2.2.1 Consultants may request a clarification of any of the RFP documents only up toseven [7] days before the proposal submission date. Any request for clarificationmust be sent in writing by paper mail or electronic mail to the Client's address indicated in the Appendix "ITC". The Client will respond by paper mail or electronic mail to such requests, including an explanation of the query but without identifying the source of inquiry to all invited consultants who intend to submit proposals.
- 2.2.2 At any time before the submission of proposals, the Client may for any reason, whether at his own initiative or in response to a clarification requested by an invited firm, amend the RFP. Any amendment shall be issued in writing through addenda. Addenda shall be sent by mail, to all invited consultants and will be binding on them. The Client may at his discretion extend the deadline for the submission of proposals.

2.3 Preparation of Technical Proposal

- 2.3.1 The Consultants proposal shall be written in English language.
- 2.3.2 In preparing the Technical Proposal, consultants are expected to examine the documents constituting this RFP in detail. Material deficiencies in providing the information requested may result in rejection of a proposal.

- 2.3.3 While preparing the Technical Proposal, consultants must give particular attention to the following:
 - (i) If a firm considers that it does not have all the expertise for the assignment, it may obtain a full range of expertise by associating with individual consultant(s) and/or other firms or entities in a joint venture or subconsultancy as appropriate. Consultants shall not associate with the other consultants invited for this assignment. Any firms associating in contravention of this requirement shall automatically be disqualified.
 - (ii) For assignments on a staff-time basis, the estimated number of professional staff-time is given in the Appendix. The proposal shall however, be based on the number of professional staff-time estimated by the firm.
 - (iii) The key professional staff proposed must be permanent employees of the firm/firms or have an extended and stable working relationship that is not less than 2 (two) years.
 - (iv) Proposed professional staff must as a minimum, have the experience indicated in evaluation of technical proposal, preferably working under conditions similar to those prevailing in Kenya.
 - (v) Alternative professional staff shall not be proposed and only one Curriculum Vitae (CV) may be submitted for each position. (proposed staff will not be substituted during the course of the assignment unless approved by the Entity)
- 2.3.4 The Technical Proposal shall provide the following information using the attached standard forms:-
 - (i) A brief description of the firm's organization and an outline of recent experience on assignments of a similar nature. For each assignment the outline should indicate inter alia, the profiles of the staff proposed, duration of the assignment, and firm's involvement.
 - (ii) Any comments or suggestions on the Terms of Reference, a list of services and facilities to be provided by the Client.
 - (iii) A description of the methodology using the factors proposed and work plan for performing the assignment.
 - (iv) The list of the proposed staff team by specialty, the tasks that would be assigned to each staff team member and their timing.
 - (v) CVs recently signed by the proposed professional staff and the authorized representative submitting the proposal. Key information should include number of years working for the firm/entity and degree of responsibility held in various assignments.

- (vi) Estimates of the total staff input (professional and support staff staff-time) needed to carry out the assignment supported by bar chart diagrams showing the time proposed for each professional staff team member.
- (vii) A detailed description of the proposed training strategy for capacity building.

Any additional information requested will be in Appendix "Information to consultants".

2.3.5 The Technical Proposal shall not include any financial information.

2.4 Preparation of Financial Proposal

- 2.4.1 In preparing the Financial Proposal, consultants are expected to take into account the requirements and conditions outlined in the RFP documents. The Financial Proposal should follow Standard Forms (Section 4). It lists all costs associated with the assignment including; (a) remuneration for staff (in the field and at headquarters), and; (b) reimbursable expenses such as subsistence (per diem, housing), transportation (international and local, for mobilization and demobilization), services and equipment (vehicles, office equipment, furniture, and supplies), office rent, insurance, printing of documents, surveys, and training, if it is a major component of the assignment. If appropriate these costs should be broken down by activity.
- 2.4.2 The Financial Proposal should clearly identify as a separate amount, the localtaxes, duties, fees, levies and other charges imposed under the law on the consultants, the sub-consultants and their personnel, unless Appendix "ITC" specifies otherwise.
- 2.4.3 Consultants shall express the price of their**services in Kenya Shillings inclusive of all taxes.**
- 2.4.4 Authority's and gratuities, if any, paid or to be paid by consultants and related to the assignment will be listed in the Financial Proposal Submission Form.
- 2.4.5 The Proposal must remain valid for 90 days after the submission date. During thisperiod, the Consultant is expected to keep available, at his own cost, the professional staff proposed for the assignment. The Client will make his best effort to complete negotiations within this period. If the Client wishes to extend the validity period of the proposals, the consultants who do not agree shall have the right not to extend the validity of their proposal.

2.5 Submission, Receipt, and Opening of Proposals

- 2.5.1 The original proposal (Technical and Financial Proposals) shall be prepared inindelible ink. It shall contain no interlineations or overwriting, except as necessary to correct errors made by the firm itself. Any such corrections must be initialed by the persons or person authorized to sign the proposals.
- 2.5.2 For each proposal, the consultants shall prepare the number of copies indicated inAppendix "ITC". Each Technical Proposal and Financial Proposal shall be marked "ORIGINAL" or "COPY" as appropriate. If there are any discrepancies between the original and the copies of the proposal, the original shall govern.
- 2.5.3 The original and copy of the Technical Proposal shall be placed in a sealedenvelope clearly marked "TECHNICAL PROPOSAL," and the original and copy of the Financial Proposal shall be placed in a sealed envelope clearly marked "FINANCIAL PROPOSAL" and warning: "DO NOT OPEN WITH THE TECHNICAL PROPOSAL".

Both envelopes shall be placed in an outer envelope and sealed and marked.

2.5.4 The completed Technical and Financial Proposals must be delivered at the submission address on or before the time and date stated in the Appendix "ITC". Any proposal received after the closing time for submission of proposals shall be returned to the respective consultant unopened.

2.5.5 After the deadline for submission of proposals, the Technical Proposal shall beopened immediately by the opening committee. The Financial Proposal shall remain sealed and deposited with a responsible officer of the *client (CAK)* department up to the time for public opening.

2.6 Proposal Evaluation General

- 2.6.1 From the time the bids are opened to the time the Contract is awarded, if anyconsultant wishes to contact the Client on any matter related to his proposal, he should do so in writing at the address indicated in the Appendix "ITC". Any effort by the firm to influence the Client in the proposal evaluation, proposal comparison or Contract award decisions may result in the rejection of the consultant's proposal.
- 2.6.2 Evaluators of Technical Proposals shall have no access to the Financial Proposalsuntil the technical evaluation is concluded.
- **2.6.3** The tender evaluation committee shall evaluate the tender within 30 days from the date of opening the tender.
- 2.6.4 The method of selection is as indicated in Appendix "ITC".

2.7 Evaluation of Technical Proposal

When preparing the technical and the financial proposals the Consultant MUST make reference to Sections III and IV respectively and must comply with the guidelines provided. Consultants who do not submit a Tender Security in the format requested will be automatically disqualified. The tender security should be valid for period of ninety (90) days from the date of tender opening and from a reputable bank or insurance firm approved by the Public Procurement Regulatory Authority (PPRA) must be enclosed together with the Financial Proposal.

The Evaluation Committee appointed by the Director-General shall evaluate the proposals on the basis of their responsiveness to the Compliance of Mandatory Requirement, Terms of Reference, Technical and Financial Criteria as follows:-

2.7.1 Mandatory Requirements

Only bidders who comply with the mandatory requirements shall be subjected to technical evaluation. The evaluation of mandatory requirement shall be **YES** or **NO**. A bidder must score a YES in all items to qualify for technical evaluation.

Where the bidder is a joint venture (consortium), each member of the consortium shall be subjected to the mandatory requirements independently. The Consortium must provide a contract agreement as proof of the joint venture.

Only bidders who will attain a threshold score of 80% (64/80 Points) and above in the technical evaluation will be considered technically responsive and subjected to financial evaluation.

2.7.6 Financial Evaluation to Carry 20%

2.7.7 The formulae for determining the Financial Score (FS) shall be as follows;-

The Procuring entity will use Quality and cost Based Selection Method (QCBS) to select the most competitive bidder.

SF = 100 X FM/F where SF is the financial score; Fm is the lowest priced financial proposal which has passed the technical stage and F is the price of the proposal under consideration. Proposals will be ranked according to their combined technical (ST) and financial scores (SF) using the weights (T=the weight given to the Technical Proposal: P = the weight given to the Financial Proposal; T + p = 1). The combined technical and financial score, S, is calculated as follows: - S = ST x T % + SF x P %. The firm achieving the highest combined technical and financial score will be recommended for consideration of award.

2.8 Public Opening and Evaluation of Financial Proposal

- 2.8.1 After Technical Proposal evaluation, CAK shall notify those bidders whose proposals did not meet the minimum qualifying points or were considered non responsive to the request for proposal and terms of reference and return their unopened financial proposals. The Client shall simultaneously notify the consultants who have secured the minimum qualifying mark, indicating the date and time set for opening the Financial Proposals and stating that the opening ceremony is open to those consultants who choose to attend. The opening date shall not be sooner than seven (7) days after the notification date. The notification may be sent by registered letter, cable, telex, facsimile or electronic mail.
- 2.8.2 The Financial Proposals shall be opened publicly in the presence of the consultants' representatives who choose to attend. The name of the consultant, the technical scores and the proposed prices shall be read aloud and recorded when the Financial Proposals are opened. The Client shall prepare minutes of the public opening.
- 2.8.3 The evaluation committee will determine whether the financial proposals are complete (i.e. whether the consultant has costed all the items of the corresponding Technical Proposal and correct any computational errors. The cost of any unpriced items shall be assumed to be included in other costs in the proposal. In all cases, the total price of the Financial Proposal as submitted shall prevail.

- 2.8.4 While comparing proposal prices between local and foreign firms participating in a selection process in financial evaluation of proposals, firms incorporated in Kenya where indigenous Kenyans own 51% or more of the share capital shall be allowed a 10% preferential bias in proposal prices, and where the bidding firms are from Agpo category i.e. Youth, women or PWDs, they shall be given a preferential bias of 15% in proposal prices. However, there shall be no such preference in the technical evaluation of the tenders. Proof of local incorporation and citizenship shall be required before the provisions of this sub-clause are applied. Details of such proof shall be attached by the Consultant in the financial proposal.
- 2.8.5 Contract price variations shall not be allowed for contracts not exceeding one year (12 months).
- 2.8.6 Where contract price variation is allowed, the variation shall not exceed 25% of the original contract price
- 2.8.7 Price variation requests shall be processed by the procuring entity within 30 days of receiving the request.

2.9 Negotiations

- 2.9.1 Negotiations will be held at the same address as "address to send information to the Client" indicated in the Appendix "ITC". The aim is to reach agreement on all points and sign a contract.
- 2.9.2 Negotiations will include a discussion of the Technical Proposal, the proposed methodology (work plan), staffing and any suggestions made by the firm to improve the Terms of Reference. The Client and firm will then work out final Terms of Reference, staffing and bar charts indicating activities, staff periods in the field and in the head office, staff-months, logistics and reporting. The agreed work plan and final Terms of Reference will then be incorporated in the "Description of Services" and form part of the Contract. Special attention will be paid to getting the most the firm can offer within the available budget and to clearly defining the inputs required from the Client to ensure satisfactory implementation of the assignment.
- 2.9.3 Unless there are exceptional reasons, the financial negotiations will not involve the remuneration rates for staff (no breakdown of fees).
- 2.9.4 Having selected the firm on the basis of, among other things, an evaluation of proposed key professional staff, the Client expects to negotiate a contract on the basis of the experts named in the proposal. Before contract negotiations, the Client will require assurances that the experts will be actually available. The Client will not consider substitutions during contract negotiations unless both parties agree that undue delay in the selection process makes such substitution unavoidable or that such changes are critical to meet the objectives of the assignment. If this is not the case and if it is established that key staff were offered in the proposal without confirming their availability, the firm may be disqualified.
- 2.9.5 The negotiations will conclude with a review of the draft form of the Contract. To complete negotiations the Client and the selected firm will initial the agreed Contract. If negotiations fail, the Client will invite the firm whose proposal received the second highest score to negotiate a contract.
- 2.9.6 The procuring entity shall appoint a team for the purpose of the negotiations.

2.10 Award of Contract

- 2.10.1 The Contract will be awarded following negotiations. After negotiations are completed, the Client will promptly notify other consultants on the shortlist that they were unsuccessful.
- 2.10.2 The selected firm is expected to commence the assignment on the date and at the location specified in Appendix "A".
- 2.10.3 The parties to the contract shall have it signed within 15 days from the date of notification of contract award unless there is an administrative review request. The assignment is estimated to take a period of ninety **(90)** days.
- 2.10.4 The procuring entity may at any time terminate procurement proceedings before contract award and shall not be liable to any person for the termination.
- 2.10.5 The procuring entity shall give prompt notice of the termination to the tenderers and on request give its reasons for termination within 14 days of receiving the request from any tenderer.
- 2.10.6 To qualify for contract awards, the tenderer shall have the following:
 - (a) Necessary qualifications, capability experience, services, equipment and facilities to provide what is being procured.
 - (b) Legal capacity to enter into a contract for procurement
 - (c) Shall not be insolvent, in receivership, bankrupt or in the process of being wound up and is not the subject of legal proceedings relating to the foregoing.
 - (d) Shall not be debarred from participating in public procurement.

- (e) Performance bond at the rate indicated in the Appendix "ITC". Successful bidders will be required to submit a performance bond of 10% of the total bid price from a reputable bank or financial institution approved by Public Procurement and Regulatory Authority (PPRA). The bond shall be valid for a period of three (3) months from the date of signing contract.
- (f) The bank or financial institution providing the performance bond shall be obliged to pay an additional interest of one (1%) for every day of payment delay after ten (10) working days from the receipt of the claim in the event the contract is terminated.

2.11 Confidentiality

2.11.1 Information relating to evaluation of proposals and recommendations concerning awards shall not be disclosed to the consultants who submitted the proposals or to other persons not officially concerned with the process, until the winning firm has been notified that it has been awarded the Contract.

2.12 Corrupt or fraudulent practices

- 2.12.1The procuring entity requires that the consultants observe the highest standards ofethics during the selection and award of the consultancy contract and also during the performance of the assignment. The consultant shall sign a declaration that he has not and will not be involved in corrupt or fraudulent practices.

Development of Assembly Strategic Plan 2020-2024

Terms of Reference

1.0 INTRODUCTION

1.1 Background

The Constitution of Kenya 2010 under Article 176 established, for each county in Kenya, a county assembly as an organ of the County Governments for the purpose of delivery of devolved services at the county level. The legislative functions of the county assembly are expressly provided for under Article 185 of the Constitution. Further, the County Governments Act, Section 8 provides that the county assembly shall:

- a) vet and approve nominees for appointment to county public offices as may be provided for in this Act or any other law;
- b) perform the roles set out under Article 185 of the Constitution;
- c) approve the budget and expenditure of the county government in accordance with Article 207 of the Constitution, and the legislation contemplated in Article 220(2) of the Constitution, guided by Articles 201 and 203 of the Constitution;
- d) approve the borrowing by the county government in accordance with Article 212 of the Constitution:
- e) approve county development planning; and
- f) perform any other role as may be set out under the Constitution or legislation.

Article 177 (1) of the Constitution provides that the membership of a county assembly shall consist of:

- i. members elected by the registered voters of the wards, each ward constituting a single member constituency, on the same day as a general election of Members of Parliament, being the second Tuesday in August, in every fifth year;
- ii. the number of special seat members necessary to ensure that no more than two-thirds of the membership of the assembly are of the same gender;
- iii. the number of members of marginalised groups, including persons with disabilities and the youth, prescribed by an Act of Parliament; and
- iv. the Speaker, who is an ex officio member.

1.2 Kisumu County Assembly Strategic Plan 2013-2017

The 1st Kisumu County Assembly was established immediately after the general elections of 4 March 2013 and served for a term of five years. During the period, the Assembly, among other

things, put in place a Strategic Plan 2013-2017 to guide its operations and development. The key highlights of the strategic plan were:

- Investment in the strengthening of the capacity of members and staff to perform their functions effectively
- Provision of a conducive work environment for members
- Strengthening of public engagement with the assembly

Notable achievements during the implementation of the Kisumu County Assembly Strategic Plan 2014-2019 were:

- The assembly conducted several training exercises for its members over the planning period that helped build their capacity to legislate, oversight the executive and represent the electorate
- Establishment of strong reprographic services in the assembly and the strengthening of the Hansard
- Improved collaborative services between the assembly and other institutions
- Strengthened collaboration with members of the public particularly on the development of legislations

1.3 The 2nd County Assembly of Kisumu

Kisumu County Assembly currently has 48 members consisting of 35 elected members and 13 members appointed through proportional representation in accordance with Article 177 Sec 1(b) of the Constitution. The Assembly is organized as follows:

Office of the Speaker created under Article 178 of the Constitution

Office of the Clerk of the County Assembly heads the administrative arm of the Assembly in accordance with Section 13 of the County Governments Act. The Clerk performs the following functions:

- Chief procedural advisor to the Speaker, other presiding officers and Members of the County Assembly on all legislative procedures, practices, conventions and traditions;
- The Chief Advisor to the Speaker in the exercise of all powers and functions that belong to the Speaker and through the Speaker, to the Assembly;
- Responsible for marshaling legislative measures passed by the County Assembly;
- The Accounting Officer of the County Assembly;
- Authorized Officer for the County Assembly;
- Secretary to the County Assembly Service Board;
- Responsible for implementation of all policy decisions of the County Assembly Service Board:
- Responsible for enhancing public understanding and knowledge of the work of the County Assembly and increasing public accessibility;
- Custodian of the institutional memory of the County Assembly.

The County Assembly Service Board is in charge of human resource management for the assembly and is in charge of:

- Providing services and facilities to ensure the efficient and effective functioning of the County. Assembly;
- Constituting offices in the County Assembly service and appointing and supervising office holders;
- Preparing annual estimates of expenditure of the County Assembly services and submitting them to the County Assembly for approval and exercising budgetary control over the service;
- Undertaking, singly or jointly with other relevant organizations, programmes to promote the ideals of parliamentary democracy;
- Performing other functions necessary for the well-being of the members and staff of the County Assembly or prescribed by the national legislation.

The County Assembly conducts its day-to-day business through various committees and/or plenary sessions as the circumstances demand. Currently, the assembly has 14 sectoral committees as follows:

- Agriculture, Livestock and Fisheries Committee
- County Budget and Appropriations Committee
- Co-operatives, Finance, Trade and Enterprises Committee
- Culture, Children, Youth and Community Services Committee
- ECD, and Vocational Training Committee
- Health Services, Housing and Sanitation Committee
- Labour, Welfare and Social Services Committee
- Planning, Industrialisation and ICT Committee
- Public Work, Roads and Transport Committee
- Tourism, Wildlife and Heritage Committee
- Committee on Ward Development Fund
- Water, Environment and Natural Resources Committee
- House Business Committee
- General Oversight Committee

1.4 The Need for County Assembly Strategic Plan 2020-2024

Despite the achievements outlined above, Kisumu County Assembly still has some challenges that require structured interventions in the short-, medium- and long-term. Some of these challenges include, but are not limited to; the need for human resource capacity enhancement; inadequate ICT capacity; need for a more structured and enhanced public participation; the continuous requirement to enhance accountability and the need to enhance operational tools of the assembly including its standing orders.

Moreover, the strategic plan 2013-2017 is long out of date and requires an urgent review and updating. The Assembly therefore intends to build onto the achievements of the 2013-2017 strategic plan and develop a new plan for the period 2020-2024.

2.0 OBJECTIVES AND SCOPE OF THE ASSIGNMENT

2.1 Objectives

The overall objective of this assignment is to develop a five-year strategic plan for the County Assembly of Kisumu that enhances the capacity of the assembly in the performance of its functions as stipulated in the Constitution, County Governments Act, Assembly Standing Orders and other laws. The specific objectives shall include:

- 1. Conduct a review of the implementation of the First Kisumu County Assembly Strategic Plan 2013-2017
- 2. Conduct a SWOT and PESTLE analysis of the current Kisumu County Assembly
- 3. Develop a Vision and Mission statement for discussion with and adoption by the Assembly and stakeholders
- 4. Develop the strategic objectives for the Kisumu County Assembly Strategic Plan 2020-2024
- 5. Prepare a detailed implementation plan and budgets for the strategic plan
- 6. Prepare a monitoring framework for the Kisumu County Strategic Plan 2020-2024
- 7. Organise a validation workshop with stakeholders for the County Assembly Strategic Plan 2020-2024

2.2 Scope of Work

In order to achieve the stated objective, the Consultant will have the following responsibilities:

- Undertake a comprehensive desk review of the relevant documents, plans,
- regulations and standing orders and administrative procedures governing and regulating the operations of the assembly.
- Analyze similar experiences in other County Assemblies
- Prepare a detailed work plan to be applied for respective assignment;
- Undertake interviews with the key stakeholders: the leadership of the Kisumu County Assembly, the Clerk and Staff of the Assembly;
- Conduct consultations and interviews with relevant stakeholders including focus group discussions with the Members of various Committees
- Identify existing gaps in the administrative procedures and instruments currently in use by the assembly;
- Propose a vision and mission for the assembly
- Draft a County Assembly Strategic Plan 2020-2024 in accordance with these Terms of Reference
- Facilitate a stakeholders' validation workshop to discuss and adopt the Strategic Plan

- (e) "GC" means these General Conditions of Contract;
- (f) "Government" means the Government of the Republic of Kenya;
- (g) "Local Currency" means the Kenya Shilling;

- (h) "Member", in case the Consultant consists of a joint venture of more than one entity, means any of these entities; "Members" means all these entities, and
