Tuesday, 27th October, 2020

House met in the Main Chamber at 02:30 p.m.

(The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Caren Muga) in the Chair)

PRAYERS

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Good afternoon Honourable Members? Mr. Clerk take us through the Order Paper of the day.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Next order!

PAPERS LAID

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Yes Hon. Benny Oiko Pete.

Leader of Minority (Hon. Oiko): Thank you Madam Speaker. The Public Investments and Accounts Committee was to lay its report on the Renovation and construction of Moi Stadium. This was discussed at the House Business Committee that it be laid today and discussed on Thursday. The Clerk was instructed to bring the report and unfortunately, he failed to do so due to some technicalities which can be discussed later.

I therefore, want to ride on Standing Order No. 48 (3) which states that “where no Member moves a Motion at the time specified by or under these Standing Orders, such Motion shall not

again be published in the Order Paper during the same Session except with the leave of the Speaker”.

The report is not yet ready and I want to indulge the House to rely on the Standing Order I have read. Thank you.

Hon. Okumu: On a Point of Order. Thank you Madam Speaker. We were on laying of Papers and we had not reached motions. Before it was slotted that the Paper be laid, I believe the House Business Committee saw the report, read it and deemed it fit to be laid before this House. I believe that, the Leader of Minority is misleading this House that we use the said Standing Order to withdraw laying of Papers. I want you to guide the Honourable Member to either lay the report or tell us the inadequacies as to why the report cannot be laid.

Hon. Okiri: On a Point of Information. Thank you, Madam Speaker. I beg to differ with the Honourable Member who has just spoken. The Leader of Minority has given sufficient reasons as to why the report cannot be laid today. He is requesting for your permission to postpone the laying of this Paper. Let the House Business Committee reschedule it.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Yes Hon. Pamela Odhiambo.

Hon. Pamela Odhiambo: Thank you Madam Speaker. I am worried because some of our Members doesn't take this House seriously. A number of our Members are naked in the House. Look at how our Leader of Majority and Hon. Paul Okiri are dressed. Kindly give a ruling on this matter. Thank you.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Thank you Hon. Pamela. Honourable Members hereby mentioned, kindly be assisted by Serjeant-at-Arm out and dress properly.

Hon. Okumu: On a Point of Order. Thank you, Madam Speaker. You are at liberty to give the Members freedom too to debate in this House. Hon. Paul was only lacking a bow tie...

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Hon. Okumu don't mislead the House.

Hon. Okumu: I can refer you to the Standing Order Madam Speaker.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Can you please read it aloud so that we here.

(Hon. Okumu walking to the Speaker)

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Honourable Member, there is no need of consulting the Chair. Just read the Standing Order.

Hon. Okumu: Honourable Chair, I was going to get my iPad so that I refer you to the Standing Order because my phone is almost off.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Hon. Okumu, let us allow the Members to walk out and dress properly.

(Hon. Leader of Majority and Hon. Okiri walking out of the Chambers)

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Yes Hon. Pamela Odhiambo.

Hon. Pamela Odhiambo: Madam Speaker, even the Member who has just spoken is not dressed properly.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Who is that Member?

Hon. Pamela Odhiambo: That is Hon. Seth Okumu.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Hon. Okumu, kindly go out and dress properly.

(Hon. Okumu walking out of the Chambers)

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Hon. Leader of Minority, can you expound on the reasons as to why you want this Paper not to be laid today.

Leader of Minority (Hon. Oiko): Madam Speaker, I have said here that when we were in the House Business Committee, it was instructed that the report be brought to the committee before it is laid. It was never availed when we were sitting. Let whoever is saying that it was availed to bring the copy. None of us has a report. The Secretariat has a technical hitch and they cannot avail the report. The best I can do is not to lay the Paper.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Hon. Leader of Minority, it is you who requested for more time?

Leader of Minority (Hon. Oiko): Thank you Madam Speaker. This matter has been with the Committee and the House Business Committee has been discussing it. This is not an individual decision.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Did the Members appended their signature to the report?

Hon. Oiko: I cannot tell whether it was signed or not.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): What is Hon. Leader of Majority?

Leader of Majority (Hon. Onyango): Thank you Madam Speaker. I want to imagine that the issues that is on discussion is the report of PIC and PAC. We did meet today as a Committee and we looked at scheduling in the House. It was a considered opinion of the Committee that the report is laid today as we give a committee time to fine tune the report. So that they can formally

bring it to the House on Thursday. I want to imagine that the committee had time to write the report and ordinarily even if the report is not ready, the committee should come and tell the House of the progress they have made on the same. This doesn't only apply to PIC&PAC but to all committees that the chair has instructed to deal with a specific report because the business of this House must be taken seriously. It is not at the discretion of the Chairperson or any individual to differ the tabling of this report. The same also happened with the Committee of ECD on issues of Bursaries and Scholarships because, these are issues that have been pending in the House for quite some time and it would be important that the House dispensed of certain matters so that we move on. Madam Speaker I don't see why there should be a hullabaloo about tabling the PIC &PAC report because this is a report like any other that is usually brought to the House.

Members should also understand that they are all doing it on behalf of the House because the House cannot do the work as a whole that's why the House delegates certain responsibilities to different House Committees. Whenever that happens it is incumbent upon those committees to present the findings that they have got. Madam Speaker, one thing that we must uphold is the integrity of this House in whatever it is we do. We must also know that our oversight role as the Assembly cannot be subdued because of certain interests. As the Leader of Majority, I want to insist that whenever a chair makes a decision that a certain report is committed to any committee, then that committee should rise to the occasion and bring back the report. We have had cases where the House decides to take certain committee work through Ad hoc Committees because of the reluctance of certain committees to complete work that they need to do within a given time frame. So, there is absolutely no malice and it is our responsibility to ensure that any work that is pending before the House is dispense and that is why we give priority to businesses.

Madam Speaker, in any case we close our eyes as the House Business Committee and just sit back then there will be no business to be transacted in the House. I want to assure you that there is no malice and we just need the business of this House to run smoothly, thank you.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Yes Hon. Pamela Odhiambo

Hon. Pamela: Thank you Madam Speaker, I also want to say that we all have secretariats in our House Committees, and when the chair requested for a slot in the House Business Committee, he believes that the report will be presented to the Members of this Assembly. If the report or even the progress report is not ready; I believe that, you should be lenient with the Committee so that they can bring the report next week because we all know how important these reports are to this House. The clerks should also know the House Business Calendar and what should come to this House so that we do not come to the House without reports that have been scheduled for transaction. In addition, they need to share with their respective Chairs so that they are equipped to give a presentation as slotted, otherwise thank you.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): What is it Hon. Seth Okumu, before I make a ruling on this?

Hon. Okumu: Madam Speaker, mine was to remind you of an item that you had told me to advise you on. On the Speaker's Orders in the County Assembly's Powers and Privileges Act, Section 8 Sub-section 2C reads; *The Speaker from time to time issues such orders as may necessary or expedient for the better carrying out of the purposes of this Act without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing, the order may provide for the appropriate...*

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Excuse me Hon. Seth Okumu, you are out of order and I believe that has been overtaken by events.

Hon. Okumu: Madam Speaker, you requested me to come forth and read it to you the exact part and therefore felt like I should let you know about the Assembly's Powers and Privileges Section 8 sub Section 2C of this Act.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): It is okay. When we read on the reports on select committees on Section 182 part 6;

"A report of a select committee including any minority report together with the minutes of the proceedings of the committee and with such note or record of any evidence by the committee as the committee may deem fit shall be laid on the table of the County Assembly by the Chairperson or the Vice Chairperson of the Select Committee or by a Member authorized by the committee on its behalf within 14 days of the conclusion of its proceedings".

I therefore want to say that the PIC/PAC report has not taken more than 14 days so I want to request the House to give them more time to make sure that they could present the paper back to the House before Thursday 29/10/2020. Are you comfortable Hon. Pete Oiko?

Hon. Okiri. On a Point of Order. Madam Speaker, I believe this is very important.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Caren Muga): Hon. Member, I hope this is not on PIC/PAC Committee.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Caren Muga): Please proceed Hon. Okiri, Senior Member.

Hon. Okiri. Thank you Madam Speaker. For a Paper to be laid before this House, it is procedural that it must be taken back to the House Business Committee. Being that the House Business Committee sits on a Tuesday, it will not be prudent for this Committee getting a slot without the approval of the House Business Committee. Madam Speaker, because tomorrow is a Wednesday, and the House sat on a Tuesday....

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Caren Muga): Hon. Member, I am sorry, the PIC/PAC Committee Vice-chairperson has stated that he is comfortable. Hon. Members, you are all aware that this House is proceeding for its Short Recess on 30th October, 2020, I fail to understand...

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Caren Muga): What is it Leader of Majority?

Leader of Majority (Hon. Onyango) On Point of Order. Thank you Madam Speaker. May you just make your ruling to be explicit because the paper has not been laid? So, what exactly do you expect the House Committee to do on Thursday?

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Caren Muga): Thank you Leader of Majority for that. We stand to be corrected and guided from time to time as appropriately.

(Hon. Speaker in consultation with Table Clerks)

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Caren Muga): Hon. Members, I apologize, my ruling needs to be expunged from the records of the Assembly because we are still consulting on key issues. Thank you Hon. Okiri for that insight as a senior member.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Caren Muga): What is it Leader of Majority?

Leader of Majority (Hon. Onyango) Thank you Madam Speaker. We are supposed to move a Motion for the Adjournment of the House for the Short Recess as from Thursday, 29th October, 2020. My thinking is that, we are resuming on the 10th November, 2020. Madam Speaker, I would wish that you rule that, this matter of PIC/PAC be tabled on the first day of business after we shall have resumed. This means that, if necessary we can convene a Special House Business Committee or on the first Tuesday we shall schedule the laying of this report. So, that we accord the Committee all the time that they need to finalize with the report, but, I want to promise that if at all there will be any jerry-meandering after the expiry of that time, then, we shall advice the House to take a route that will ensure that this matter is brought to book.

Madam Speaker, I want to say that, we should not shroud House Committee Reports with a lot of mystery and in a lot of things that bring into disrepute the integrity of this House and that is something that we must not allow to happen. Thank you.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Thank you very much Leader of Majority. Hon. Members, please allow me now to make my ruling. We now request the Committee of PIC/PAC that you are all aware that this House is proceeding for their Short Recess, and on the first day that this House resumes it's sitting after the Short Recess which is on Tuesday, 10th November, 2020 at 02:30 pm, I believe that will give you the ample time to conclude your report and bring it to this House. Thank you.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Hon. Members, we are still on the papers segment.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Hon. Okumu.

Hon. Okumu: Thank you Madam Speaker. Pursuant to the provisions of section 133 of the PFM Act, 2012 read together with County Assembly Standing Orders No. 182 (6) I wish to lay before this House today Tuesday, 27th October, 2020 the Report from the Select Committee of Budget

and Appropriations on its consideration on the Proposed Kisumu County Finance Bill, 2020. This is on behalf of the Chairperson Budget and Appropriations Committee, Hon. Steve Owiti.

(Hon. Okumu lays before the House the paper on the Kisumu County Finance Bill, 2020)

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Thank you Hon. Okumu. The Report from the Select Committee of Budget and Appropriations on its consideration on the Proposed Kisumu County Finance Bill, 2020 is laid before the House. Thank you.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Next!

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Yes Hon. Okumu.

Hon. Okumu: Thank you again Madam Speaker. Pursuant to the provisions of section 113 of the County Government Act, 2012 read together with County Assembly Standing Orders No. 182 (6) I wish to lay before this House today Tuesday, 27th October, 2020 the Report on the Select Committee of Budget and Appropriations on its consideration on the Proposed Kisumu County Annual Development Plan FY 2021/2022. This is on behalf of the Chairperson Budget and Appropriations Committee, Hon. Steve Owiti.

(Hon. Okumu lays before the House the paper on the KCADP FY 2021/2022)

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Next order!

STATEMENTS

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Yes, Hon. Okumu.

Hon. Seth: Thank you Hon. Madam Speaker. Under Standing Order No.41(2) (d) as the Chairperson of Administration of Law, Justice Constitutional Affairs and Good Governance and Security Committee, I want to inform the Hon. Members that we are going to have a security meeting with National Security Organs of Kisumu County hopefully by Thursday 29th October, 2020. This is in line with what is happening in the County. We have heard issues to do with people disappearing and being found dead. I believe that, we buried one over the weekend and we do not want that to proceed. So;

1. Members to submit if they have such cases in their wards to the Committee so that by the time we are meeting the County Security Organs, then, we will be having enough data to support the reason as to why we have invited them.
2. We are informing Hon. Members of the Administration of Law, Justice Constitutional Affairs and Good Governance and Security Committee of the possible meeting of that particular day so that they get prepared with much information as possible with regards to security in Kisumu County. Thank you Madam Chairperson, those were my statements.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Caren Muga): Thank you.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Caren Muga): Next order!

COMMENCEMENT OF BUSINESS

(NO MOTION)

The Leader of Majority (Hon. Onyango): Sorry Madam Speaker. I was engrossed on some issue which really took me a bit off track but, you will pardon me. There is a very important issue which I want to relay to Hon. Members Madam Speaker. As you are aware of the Launching of the Building Bridges Initiative (BBI) in Nairobi, already there is a BBI report which was distributed to the Hon. Members who went there. To those who did not go there, the report is available in soft copy. I want to indulge Hon. Members to read that report since I believe it touches on issues that are very pertinent to this Honourable House.

Madam Speaker, you are aware that the report does purpose to increase the Counties' Revenue Allocation that will be disbursed to the Counties from fifteen per cent (15%) to thirty five per

cent (35%) of the National Budget. I want to believe that it is going to be a very huge amount of money considering that the fifteen per cent has seen turning around the economic status of our County. Madam Speaker, we only imagine that if it is the thirty five per cent then that one will certainly lead to great transformational development within our respective wards. Other than that, there is a struggle that we have had as the MCAs to have the Ward Development Funds being factored directly from the National...

Hon. Okiri: On a Point of Order, Madam Speaker.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Caren Muga): What is it Hon. Paul Okiri?

Hon. Okiri: Thank you very much Madam Speaker. However, is it in order for the Leader of Majority to educate or lecture Hon. Members on this issue of BBI? Because each and every Hon. Member knows exactly what it is going to tell people on the ground? As we speak, it is like he is lecturing Hon. Members yet we all know very well what BBI stand for Madam Speaker. Kindly, rule on the same.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Caren Muga): What is it Hon. Ngeta?

Hon. Ngeta: Thank you very much Madam Speaker for giving me this opportunity. I want to inform my good friend Hon. Paul Okiri that role of the Leader of Majority is to represent to Government of the day. When he is questioning the work of the Leader of Majority, it is like he is antagonizing his role. So, let him be patient to allow our Leader of Majority to complete his statement. Thank you.

(Hon. Pamela Odhiambo ascends on her feet)

The Leader of Majority (Hon. Onyango): Thank you so much my brother ...

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Caren Muga): To the Leader of Majority, I can see Hon. Pamela Odhiambo on her feet.

Hon Pamela Odhiambo: Thank you Madam Speaker. Our Leader of Majority is doing the right thing. In fact the BBI was revealed to us the other day and yesterday they were in Nairobi. He has a right to speak about the BBI in the Honourable House Madam Speaker, because, we are all waiting to talk about it and as women, the opportunities that we are going to get when the BBI is implemented. So...

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Caren Muga): Not really. I thought you were just giving your views on what the Leader of Majority is doing but you are not...

Hon. Pamela Odhiambo: The Leader of Majority is doing the right thing and let Hon. Paul Okiri allow him to speak on our behalf. Thank you.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Caren Muga): Thank you.

The Leader of Majority (Hon. Onyango): Thank you Madam Speaker. You know that when H.E. the President of Kenya was around, indeed he met us group of leaders together with the former Prime Minister and this is one of the issues that came up. That going forward, we must be able to roll up our sleeves and preach the gospel of BBI.

Madam Speaker, yesterday we were in Nairobi and we could see the exuberance of those who went there, were engaged in this launch. Unfortunately I did not see the Senior Member, neither did I see him when The President was here talking about the BBI.

Applause

The Leader of Majority (Hon. Onyango): I believe that is the reason as to why probably he is oblivious of the importance of this document.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Caren Muga): Excuse me Leader of Majority. Does it mean that everybody who went there reported to you? Is it so?

(Laughter)

The Leader of Majority (Hon. Onyango): Madam Speaker, I have not said something like that. What I have said is that the excitement that was there will tell you. Madam Speaker, the Hon. Members of Kisumu County Assembly will actually tell you and they sat on the same tent.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Caren Muga): Did you see me there?

The Leader of Majority (Hon. Onyango): Madam Speaker, I remember we had a phone conversation. You had some little problems which I was unable to solve because it was a little too late.

(Laughter)

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Caren Muga): So, are you expecting the same from Hon. Okiri?

The Leader of Majority (Hon. Onyango): But you know, I would have wished that him being the senior most Hon. Member, he should have been at the forefront whenever we are talking about the party issues.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Caren Muga): Continue.

(Loud consultations)

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Caren Muga): Not really, rejected. Allow him to continue

The Leader of Majority (Hon. Onyango): Madam Speaker, I would wish ...

(Loud consultations)

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Caren Muga): You are a Senior Member. I have ruled that your Point of Order is rejected. So, please allow him to continue?

The Leader of Majority (Hon. Onyango): Thank you Madam Speaker. So, what I would wish is that even as we plan to go for the short recess, let us go and engage our people by telling them the benefits of the BBI. Tell them that the report is going to bring with it thirty-five per cent of the gross domestic product of the County Budget directly into the wards. That would translate into quite some substantial amount of money so that the development of the wards would not be at the vehemence of the Governor's mercy. That if the Governor does not like you, and then you do not see the development. This time round the BBI brings with it the Ward Revenue Allocation which was recently floored by the Members of the National Assembly. So, we are so excited and that is why we preach the BBI, we drink BBI and we sleep BBI. Thank you.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Thank you. The time of statement is over and I just allowed the Leader of Majority for having a sensitive issue to put across. Hon. Okiri, that is overtaken by events and we need to proceed.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Yes Hon. Pamela Odhiambo.

Hon. Pamela Odhiambo: Thank you Madam Speaker. I know the statement time is yet to be over but the Leader of Majority has just spoken on the issues that we are supposed to be telling our people on the ground. We seek your indulgence to have a statement of such magnitude to be discussed in this House. We are very happy we are going to have back the Ward Development Fund as MCAs and I want to say in this House that, today I believe in 2022, I will come back because the 15% that we were getting has really done much in our wards Madam Speaker and I want to request the Members in this House to go back when we go for recess let us go to public places, churches and local radio stations so that our people will know the benefits that have come with the BBI.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): What is it Hon. Okiri?

Hon. Okiri: Madam Speaker, the Leader of Majority is the Leader of Government Business in the House and it is not in order for the Leader of Majority to say what he said. I am against Members who did not understand what I was saying but the thing that I meant was that instead of the Leader of Majority telling me the 35% that is going to be devolved in our wards then, that should not be the case. I am the one to go and tell my people and not him telling me what to go and tell my people.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): No, he was just reminding me.

(Loud consultation)

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Order Hon. Members. Yes Hon. Otura.

Hon. Otura: Thank you very much Madam Speaker. It is important to inform Hon. Okiri that, we are all informed and we are updated with everything regarding or Party ODM and the running of our county. In this regard it is not prudent that it comes from his mouth that he knew and we are only supposed to be informed by the Leader of Majority in the House. I would like to inform him that we are equipped with every bit of information that is necessary for our survival.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Yes Leader of Majority.

The Leader of Majority (Hon. Kenneth Onyango): Madam Speaker we don't have Ngeta in this House or Pamela in this House. These are Hon. Members and they must be addressed with a lot of decorum. Secondly, the proceedings of this House are being streamed live so whenever we speak in this House then, we are talking to the public out there. The public must know what this Assembly stands for. Whatever we say in this House, is not just confined to us who are present. So, it is very wrong for the senior Member and I want to retaliate that these proceedings are all over.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): So what do you expect him to do, Leader of Majority?

The Leader of Majority (Hon. Kenneth Onyango): Madam Speaker, I expect him to withdraw because he does not seem to understand what he is talking about.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Hon. Okiri can you withdraw!

Hon. Okiri: Madam Speaker, you could see me walking to the Leader of Majority and I wished that he was wise enough then, he could have listened to whatever I told him. My point is very clear that, I will take what is in the BBI report to my people.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Hon. Okiri, can you withdraw what the Leader of Majority is saying that we don't have Pamela in the House!

Hon. Okiri: Thank you Madam Speaker. I am very sorry and I should have referred to them as Hon. Members.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Thank you. What is it Hon. Okumu.

Hon. Okumu: Thank you Madam Speaker, the Leader of Majority rose on Standing Orders No. 42 (2) (d) to issue a statement in this House and I didn't hear you giving this House opportunity for us to discuss the statement.
