The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Okumu): Good afternoon Hon. Members. Pursuant to the County Assembly of Kisumu Standing Orders No. 32 (2) I direct that the Serjeant-at-Arms rings the quorum bell for five minutes.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Okumu): Hon. Members, let the Chief Whip help us know if we have achieved the required quorum to enable us commence business of the day.

OKEW OJINO STEEET.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Okumu): Hon. Olwal, Chairperson, Standing Committee of Planning.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Okumu): What is it Hon. Ogutu?

Hon. Ogutu: Thank you Mr. Speaker. As usual, you are all aware that when the Chair of Planning is not in the House then, it is my solemn duty to represent the Standing Committee.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Okumu): Hon. Ogutu, are you the Vice-chairperson of that Standing Committee?

Hon. Ogutu: Mr. Speaker, I am not the Vice-chairperson of the Standing Committee of Planning but, a member of the Committee and I believe that the Standing Orders accords me the obligation to do so.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Okumu): Please proceed.

Hon. Ogutu: Thank you Mr. Speaker and Hon. Members. Pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order No. 41(2) (b) of the County Assembly Standing Orders, Hon. Philemon Ojuok raised a Statement (See Annex 1) in this House regarding the award of contract for installation of Container Kiosks at the backstreet and along Ojino Okew Street of the City of Kisumu.

In accordance with Article 185 of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010, Section 8 of the County Government's Act, 2012 read together with the County Assembly of Kisumu Standing Order No. 193, the Hon. Speaker instructed the Committee on Planning, Industrialization and ICT to make an inquiry, investigate and cause a report on the following in regard to this matter;

- i. When the contract for placing the containers within City was advertised
- ii. Who was awarded the contract
- iii. Terms and conditions of the contract
- iv. Submit valid documentation for the award of the Contract
- v. Was there a relocation action plan for the traders who were displaced on the mentioned areas

ESTABLISHMENT AND MANDATE OF THE COMMITTEE

Mr. Speaker and Hon. Members,. The Sectoral Committee on Planning, Industrialization and ICT is established under Standing Order No. 193 of the Kisumu County Assembly Standing Orders, whose mandate, pursuant to the Standing Orders No. 193 (5) is as follows;

- i. investigate, inquire into, and report on all matters relating to the mandate, management, activities, administration, operations and estimates of the assigned departments
- ii. study the programme and policy objectives of departments and the effectiveness of the implementation

- vii. Make reports and recommendations to the County Assembly as often as possible, including recommendation of proposed legislation.

Mr. Speaker Sir and Hon. Members, it is my privilege and pleasure on behalf of the Committee to convey my gratitude to all Members of the Committee for their valuable input throughout the period of investigation on this matter.

The Committee also appreciates invaluable support from the offices of the Speaker and Clerk of the County Assembly for providing conducive atmosphere to prepare this report. To our Clerks and the technical staff who tirelessly worked through to make this exercise a success, I applaud you.

It is now my humble desire and wish to hereby submit this progress report to the House for consideration on behalf of the Committee on Planning, Industrialization and ICT.

COMMITTEE INVESTIGATIONS

Mr. Speaker and Hon. Members, in a Committee meeting to deliberate on this matter, the Committee resolved to write a letter to the City Manager requesting his office to provide a written response on the above matter on a date not later than Wednesday 12th May 2021.

Consequently, a letter dated 5th May 2021 was delivered to the office of the City Manager. (See Annex 2)

Mr. Speaker and Hon members, the City Manager failed to respond on time. Consequently, the Committee resolved to invite the City Manager to respond verbally on this matter. A letter dated 12th August 2021 inviting the City Manager to attend a committee meeting on 19th August 2021 in the Assembly Chamber was delivered to his office. (See Annex 3)

Mr. Speaker and Hon. Members, the City Manager failed to honour the Committee's invitation.

COMMITTEE FINDINGS

Mr. Speaker and Hon. Members, on 7th September 2021, a response from the City Manager was received by the Office of the Clerk. The Committee Clerk subsequently presented the response before the Committee members for deliberation.

The City Manager outlined the following in his response;

- a) That the Kisumu City Board and Space Buster Limited entered into a contract for provision of Semi-Permanent Trading Spaces for SMEs in Kisumu City in 2020.
- b) That later, it came to the City Management realization that the Contractor was acting in contravention of the terms of the contract signed between the service provider /contractor and the County Government of Kisumu.
- c) That the Service provider had gone ahead and erected containers opposite Telkom building along Oginga Odinga Street whereas the area was not designated for the containers nor was it stated in the contract the service provider had signed.

- d) The containers had been placed on top of a drainage system and as such were interfering with regular flow of water causing flooding in the area. There was a time when the whole Oginga Odinga Street was flooded.
- e) Further, the beneficiaries of the containers were business people who have never traded within the Okew Ojino Street. This amounted to a breach of the terms of the contract.
- f) The traders become worried on how the service provider was handling the process without involving them on the entire process of implementation including reallocation.
- g) Similarly on the morning of 31st March 2021, the City woke up to the containers put up along the Bank Street. The area on which the containers were placed was initially occupied by the public traders who were removed during the rehabilitation of the port. The area is public land owned by the Kenya Railways Corporation (and now Kenya Ports Authority) thereby not designated for containers.
- h) The Service provider actions elicited a lot of public outcry and anger from the general public and the Kisumu business Community and specifically the SMEs traders who had been evicted on the said areas and told the evictions were done by Kenya Railways and the National Government.
- i) The matter was then presented to the Kisumu City Board to deliberate on the way forward. The Board recommended that;
- j) The contract be suspended for a period of time to allow for consultation on any possible breach that warrants termination of the contract
- k) The legal and enforcement committee of the Board to carry out an inquiry and get back to the Board with a full report
- l) The legal ad enforcement committee is done with its investigation and is currently preparing a report on the same which is to be presented to the full board for deliberation and to find a way of solving the stalemate at Ojino Okew (Annex 4)

COMMITTEE RESOLUTION

Mr. Speaker and Hon. Members,

After deliberating on the above response by the City Manager, the Committee resolved to dig deep into this matter by requesting the City Manager to furnish it with the contract letter after which it shall invite the Contractor (Space Buster Limited) for interrogation on the same. (Annex 5)

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

Mr. Speaker and Hon. Members. Following the above resolution, the Committee recommends that this House consider giving it more time to look into this matter and recommend appropriately...

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Okumu): Order Hon. Members!! Hon. Ogotu, can you please approach the Chair.

(Hon. Ogutu approaches the Chair to consult with the Speaker)

Hon. Atieno (On a Point of Order): I am inclined to believe that it is not fair...

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Okumu): Order!! Order!! Hon. Member. I believe there is a better way of showing appreciation. Thank you Mr. Speaker...

Hon. Atieno: Thank you Mr. Speaker for according me this opportunity to highlight on some issues. Mr. Speaker, I just want to bring the plight of our very own differently abled person. I want to say that the Hon. Member is partially impaired in the eyes and the whole Committee Members have deserted him and he is left to present this report and he cannot read as a result of eye problems. Mr. Speaker, is that not being unfair and I believe that this is something this House needs to delve deeper into so that we come to the aid of our colleague....

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Okumu): Hon. Members, please allow me to guide Hon. Atieno.

Hon. Atieno: Mr. Speaker, I am seated beside him and he is having very difficult time trying to see what is documented in this report.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Okumu): Thank you Hon. Members. Hon. Members, please allow me to guide Hon. Atieno. When we commenced business I called for the Chairperson of the Standing Committee and Hon. Ogutu rose and stated that in the absence of the Chair, he is usually the one who presents reports of the Standing Committee of Planning. I informed the Hon. Member that he is not the one but it is the onus of the Vice-chair. In the absentia of the Vice-chairperson, then any other Hon. Member who has knowledge of the report can present it. I gave the opportunity to the Vice-chairperson and she was not around. It is when Hon. Ogutu offered maybe after consultations with the other Committee Members to present the report and I believe that at the time he had offered to present the Committee report, he had knowledge of what was contained in the report which had been printed and he acquainted himself in consultation with the Committee he knew that he could present it. So, I believe that he is not doing what he cannot do. I must say that he is a very able Member of that Standing Committee. So, I want you to allow him conclude presenting the report because I believe that he is left with approximately four or five paragraphs to conclude his presentation it is when I will accord Hon. Members the opportunity to react on the report.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Okumu): Please continue Hon. Ogutu.

Hon. Ogutu: Thank you Mr. Speaker...

Hon. Agolla: On a Point of Order. Thank you Mr. Speaker. Is it really in order to just leave Hon. Atieno the MCA for Kobura to mislead this House because Hon. Ogutu is abled differently? Mr. Speaker, what must come out clearly is that, as Members of this House, we are struggling to read this report and that has been a challenge and it is not very clear whether we have the ICT

Officer/Technician in this Assembly. This is because this has been a challenge, just the other day I was reading a report and we were straining to read these reports. Mr. Speaker, this is a report that can even be presented in a Court of Law. So, we must take them seriously.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Okumu): Hon. Agolla, on your Point of Order, you are asking if it is in order for Hon. Atieno the MCA for Kobura to mislead the House. I don't believe that Hon. Atieno was misleading this House because he gave information as somebody seated next to Hon. Ogutu and he had to reassure him that Hon. Ogutu is an able Hon. Member and he is able to read and present the Committee Report. I tend to believe that the document is not voluminous and he is only left with four or five paragraphs and he will be done with it. So, I don't believe that Hon. Atieno is misleading the House.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Okumu): Hon. Arao, who do you want to inform?

Hon. Arao: Mr. Speaker, I want to inform the House.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Okumu): Then you will have to wait for Hon. Ogutu to conclude then you inform the House because the House is here perpetually.

Hon. Arao: Mr. Speaker, it is a matter that will have been overtaken by events...

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Okumu): I assure you that I will give you time to inform the House.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Okumu): Please proceed Hon. Ogutu.

Hon. Ogutu: Thank you Mr. Speaker...

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Okumu): Hon. Members, next time when the Speaker is talking you resume your seat.

Hon. Ogutu: Mr. Speaker, I am aware of that. There is one thing that we have to take into consideration, you can confirm from the Hon. Members that the type and quality of work being brought in this House is pathetic. Mr. Speaker, when I appeared before you, even you, you were struggling to read this report because the quality is poor and this has to be improved.

Mr. Speaker, I would like to inform Hon. Atieno that, I am a very able Member and I have been presenting on behalf of the Committee reports and I have been effectively debating in this August House. Mr. Speaker, as the Chair, you have to assist us because if you look at this report, the quality is wanting. This is because you can see in the report, that some areas are not readable and we are giving the Clerks preparing these reports a stern warning to prepare clean reports that is readable without us straining ourselves. I want you to take that into consideration.

Mr. Speaker, as I continue with my presentation.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Okumu): Order!! Order!! Hon. Member. Are you insinuating that you are not sure of the Report you are reading? I believe that before you came into the House you had agreed to read it, you could have done all before without doubting it in the Floor of the House.

Hon. Ogutu: I am not doubting the quality of the Report Mr. Speaker. I am doubting the quality of the printer. The writing is not visible as you too remember that you had difficulties reading it when I brought it to your attention. Reading this report is both a challenge to those with reading disability like as well as those without such disability. Thank you Mr. Speaker.

After the deliberation by the Committee on the response by the City Manager, the Committee resolved to dig deep into the matter by requesting the City Manager to furnish the Committee with the contract letter after which it shall invite the contractor, Space Buster Limited, to interrogate that company.

Mr. Speaker and Honourable Members, following the above resolutions, the committee recommends that this House consider giving it more time to look into the matter and make appropriate recommendations.

Mr. Speaker and Honourable Members, the committee strongly believes that the investigation on this matter should go further. This is the basis of requesting for more time. Thank you Mr. Speaker and Honourable Members. May I call upon Hon. Misachi to second?

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Okumu): Yes, Hon. Misachi.

Chief Whip (Hon. Misachi): Thank you Mr. Speaker. I rise to second the report from the Standing Committee on Planning, Industrialization and ICT.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Okumu): Thank you Honourable Members. A Report from the Committee on Planning, Industrialization and ICT on the Statement raised by Hon. Ojuok regarding Installation of Containers along Okew-Ojino Street has been brought before this House as a Motion presented by Hon. Ogutu on behalf of the Chair Hon. Olwal, seconded by the Majority Whip Hon. Misachi, I now want to propose to put a question that the Report is open for debate.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Okumu): Yes, Hon. Miruka.

Hon. Miruka: Thank you Mr. Speaker and Honourable Members. I rise to oppose this Progress Report. I have looked at when Hon. Ojuok sought this Statement. I have also looked at the objective of the Statement. Mr. Speaker, I have also looked at the findings and the recommendations from the Committee. What I have seen cannot convince the House.

Mr. Speaker, if you look the items that Hon. Ojuok sought against the response we have from the City Manager upon receiving the letter from our Clerk Mr. Owen Ojuok, there is a contradiction. The questions were very specific:

- i. When was this contract awarded and who was awarded this contract?
- ii. The Terms and Conditions, whether there was a relocation plan or not?

Mr. Speaker, I have not seen any response touching on the same. I have struggled to see the communication from the City Manager and the struggle in finding the person who was to do the job. I have not seen the response to this. Has the Standing Committee brought this Report so that we can adopt? Yes, we can do it but is it relevant? Does the Report address the issues sought by Hon Ojuok?

Mr. Speaker, without mincing words, let me applaud the Speaker and the Clerk. The Committee sat many times discussing this. Why couldn't they diagnose the report and detect irrelevancies in it? I oppose the Report. Thank you.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Okumu): Honourable Members, we are discussing progress Report on the Statement raised by Hon Ojuok regarding Installation of Containers along Okew-Ojino Street.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Okumu): Yes, Hon Arao.

Hon. Arao: On a point of information. Thank you Mr. Speaker. I wanted to inform the House that it is not in order for Hon. Miruka to speak on behalf of Hon. Ojuok who is present in the House.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Okumu): You are out of order Honourable Member. In this House, you are not the person who determines who talks and who does not. If Hon. Ojuok wants to talk then he knows what to do.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Okumu): Yes Hon. Otura.

Hon. Otura: Thank you Mr. Speaker. First, I want to applaud this House Committee for the progress Report. Mr. Speaker, I have gone through the Report and what the Standing Committee is requesting is contained in their resolutions and recommendations. Hon. Miruka is right in his capacity to ask if this Report is relevant. What Hon. Ojuok sought for in Roman one: When the contract for placing the containers was advertised. It is true that this response is missing in the Report. However, if you check on what the Committee has recommended, they have stated that the City did enter into a contract with one Company by the name Space Buster.

Mr. Speaker, the placing of the containers was never advertised. Secondly, it is clear in the Report that it was Space Buster that was awarded the contract. Roman three sought to know the Terms and Conditions of the contract. This is not answered Mr. Speaker. As such, Hon. Miruka is right. However, the Standing Committee has recommended that the House considers giving it more time to look into the matter and recommend appropriately.

Mr. Speaker, going by the narratives, I am convinced that the issues raised by Hon. Miruka shall be addressed in the final Report. Mr. Speaker, if you check on Roman four, Hon. Philemon wanted the department to submit valid documentation for the award of the contract. This is indeed a valid concern

which has never not been addressed. In Roman number five, on the same page asks that; was there a Relocation Action Plan (RAP) for the traders who were displaced from the mentioned areas? The annexes show that the City Manager, Mr. Aballa Wanga responded and the response highlighted that there was a breach of contract by the contractor as in in annex 4. In summary, this is just a Progress Report, and going by the recommendation of this Standing Committee, we need to give them more time so that they can unearth what remains and present the final report to the House. Otherwise, I support the report as a progress report. Thank you.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Okumu): Yes, Leader of Majority

Leader of Majority (Hon. Onyango): Thank you Mr. Speaker. The de-facto Chair of Planning, Industrialization and ICT Committee has said that this is a Progress Report. Progress simply means to develop towards an improved or more advanced condition or destination. So, I was wondering where this hullabaloo is coming from because this is just a progress report.

Hon. Atieno: A point of information Mr. Speaker

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Okumu): Whom do you want to inform?

Hon. Atieno: Mr. Speaker, I wanted clarification from the Leader of Majority because he just alluded that there is a de-facto Chair of planning. So, who then is the de-jure chair of Planning, Industrialization and ICT Committee?

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Okumu): Hon. Leader of Majority please help Hon. Atieno understand the meaning of de-jure.

The Leader of Majority (Hon. Onyango): De-jure means by Law and de-facto means...

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Okumu): Order!! Hon. Leader of Majority, you mentioned the de-facto chair. So, the Hon. Member just wants to know who the de-jure chair is.

The Leader of Majority (Hon. Onyango): I am actually headed there Mr. Speaker. As I was explaining earlier, de-jure means by law whereas de-facto means by authority. We all know who was sworn in as the de-facto Chair of Industrialization and ICT Committee and we know who is wielding the chair now. I believe my explanation answers you.

Hon. Atieno: Yes.

The Leader of Majority (Hon. Onyango): In my opinion, the most fundamental thing is that this statement was sought on the 21st of April, which raised some matters such as;

- i. Was there a Relocation Action Plan for the traders who were removed from certain areas of business?

These were the issues to be immediately canvassed so that we know that these traders can keep up earning to maintain their livelihoods in the designated areas as they had been before in places, they were in.

Mr. Speaker, I would want to indulge you that this Standing Committee shouldn't have infinite time in bringing response to this Assembly because they had time from April of this year to do so for substantive answers to be brought. So, you can give a time frame within which this work can be done satisfactorily and brought to the House. I want to urge the de-facto chair to expedite that. Thank you.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Okumu): Yes, Hon. Philemon Ojuok.

Hon. Ojuok: Thank you Mr. Speaker, I believe that the Hon. Leader of Majority has read my mind and I was just worried about the aspect of time. As he has stated that there are traders who were affected, and if you looked at some of the comments on the Kisumu County Budget Review and Outlook Paper (CBROP) Report, you will find that relocation of traders has affected the revenue of this county. This further affects our development, and thus quite important that we emphasize on the element of time. Thank you.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Okumu): Yes, Hon. Beatrice Odongo.

Hon. Odongo: Mr. Speaker, going by the mood of the House, allow me to call the mover to reply.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Okumu): Yes, Hon. George Ogutu

Hon. Ogutu: Thank you Mr. Speaker, allow me to thank honorable members, and especially Hon. Rashid Miruka. I believe he has a right to oppose this report if he feels that the contents of this report don't go well with what was sought. I want to thank Hon. Otura and Hon. Leader of Majority for making a great case in support of this report. I want to refer the House to the findings of this report, and on that you will find that there was a sluggish response from the City Manager to address issues raised in our communication to his office. As a result of the foregoing which is constraint in flow of information, we sat down as a House Committee and requested for the contract form, which unfortunately hasn't also been brought to this Assembly. I believe that this contract form will answer all the questions we are yearning to be answered. When you have a contract which contains the contract form or agreement, it will carry answers to questions being asked in this House. The duration to all the terms stated. In addition, the advertisement for the contract is also attached to the contract form.

Mr. Speaker, this particular contract form will also unveil whether this contractor had a clause to relocate these traders. Hon. Rashid's fear will therefore seize once this contract form is submitted to this House. We are now pleading with the City Manager to furnish this Committee with these information.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Okumu): Yes Hon. Beatrice Odongo.

Hon. Odongo: Thank you Mr. Speaker. With your permission, I would like to read the Committee Report on behalf of the Chair who is unwell and the Vice-chair is equally out on official duties and as a Member of this Select Committee, I would like to read the report from the Select Committee of County Budget and Appropriations Committee.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Okumu): Proceed.

Hon. Odongo: Thank you Mr. Speaker. The County Executive Committee Member for Finance and Economic Planning invoked the provisions of Article 224 of the Constitution of Kenya, section 130 and 131 of the Public Finance and Management Act 2012 and County Assembly Standing Orders No. 223 and accordingly submitted the Proposed Kisumu County Budget Estimates FY 2021/2022 to the County Assembly on 30th April, 2021 vide letter Ref: KC/FIN/CASSEMBLY/VOL.III/58 (see annex i).

Pursuant to the Provisions of Section 131 (1) of the PFM Act, 2012, the Assembly conducted public participation, discussed, reviewed and approved the proposed Budget Estimates FY 2021/2022 with some amendments which were appropriately recommended and communicated to the Department of Finance and Economic Planning for implementation.

Mr. Speaker Sir and Hon. Members, in the budget, a total revenue of Kshs. 12,146,176,297 (Twelve Billion, one Hundred and forty six Million, one Hundred and seventy Six Thousand, two Hundred and ninety Seven Shillings) was projected. This shows a decrease of the Estimates while compared with the previous FY 2020/2021 Budget of Kshs. 12,780,355,751.00 giving a variance of Kshs. 634,179,454 representing a percentage decline of (4.96%).

Mr. Speaker Sir and Hon. Members, my Committee deemed it necessary to conduct the Post Budget Diagnosis of the Approved Estimates FY 2021/2022 to evaluate if the House Recommendations forwarded to the CECM Finance and Economic Planning were implemented.

Finally, it is important to note that this is the fourth budget of the current County government and the last to be implemented by this regime. This House therefore should properly oversight its implementation to enable us to recover from the effects of the Covid-19 pandemic and to fulfill the dreams, priorities and aspirations of the Great Citizens of this County who trusted us with this mandate for the Five Years.

COMMITTEE MANDATE

The Budget and Appropriations Committee is bestowed with the mandate as enshrined in the County Assembly Standing Order No. 189 (3) as below;

- (a) Investigate, inquire into and report on all matters related to coordination, control and monitoring of the County budget;
- (b) discuss and review the estimates and make recommendations to the County Assembly;
- (c) examine the County Budget Policy Statement presented to the County Assembly;
- (d) examine Bills related to the County Government budget, including Appropriations Bills; and
- (e) evaluate tax estimates, economic and budgetary policies and programmes with direct budget outlays.

Mr. Speaker Sir and Hon. Members, It is therefore my pleasant opportunity, duty and honor to table before this House the Report from the Select Committee of Budget and Appropriation on the Post Budget Review and Analysis of the Approved Kisumu County Budget Estimates FY 2021/2022 for your consideration.

LEGAL FRAMEWORK UNDERPINNING THE PREPEARTION OF THE ESTIMATES

The Committee in scrutiny of the Approved Estimates FY 2021/2022 was guided by the following legislations;

- a) Constitution of Kenya, 2010
- b) Section 107, 130 and 131 of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012.
- c) Provisions of County Assembly Standing Orders No. 189 and 222

1. Section 107 of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012 further stipulates that;

i. County Treasury to Enforce Fiscal Responsibility Principles

(1) A County Treasury shall manage its public finances in accordance with the principles of fiscal responsibility set out in subsection (2), and shall not exceed the limits stated in the regulations.

(2) In managing the county government's public finances, the County Treasury shall enforce the following fiscal responsibility principles—

(a) the county government's recurrent expenditure shall not exceed the county government's total revenue;

(b) over the medium term a minimum of thirty percent of the county government's budget shall be allocated to the development expenditure;

(c) the county government's expenditure on wages and benefits for its public officers shall not exceed a percentage of the county government's total revenue as prescribed by the County Executive member for finance in regulations and approved by the County Assembly;

(d) over the medium term, the government's borrowings shall be used only for the purpose of financing development expenditure and not for recurrent expenditure;

(e) the county debt shall be maintained at a sustainable level as approved by county assembly;

(f) the fiscal risks shall be managed prudently; and

(g) a reasonable degree of predictability with respect to the level of tax rates and tax bases shall be maintained, taking into account any tax reforms that may be made in the future.

(3) For the purposes of subsection (2) (d), short term borrowing shall be restricted to management of cash flows and shall not exceed five percent of the most recent audited county government revenue.

(4) Every county government shall ensure that its level of debt at any particular time does not exceed a percentage of its annual revenue specified in respect of each financial year by a resolution of the county assembly.

(5) The regulations may add to the list of fiscal responsibility principles set out in subsection (2).

2. Consequently, section 130 of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012 states as follows;

County Executive Committee member for finance to submit budget documents to County Assembly

(1) The County Executive Committee member for finance shall submit to the county assembly the following documents in respect of the budget for every financial year—

(a) a budget summary that includes—

(i) a summary of budget policies including revenue, expenditure, debt and deficit financing; and;

(ii) an explanation of how the budget relates to the fiscal responsibility principles and the financial objectives;

(iii) a memorandum by the County Executive Committee member for finance explaining how the resolutions adopted by the county assembly on the budget estimates have been taken into account;

(b) budget estimates that include—

(i) a list of all county government entities that are to receive funds appropriated from the budget of the county government;

- (ii) estimates of revenue projected from the Equalization Fund over the medium term;
 - (iii) all revenue allocations from the national government over the medium term, including conditional and unconditional grants;
 - (iv) all other estimated revenue by broad economic classification;
 - (v) all estimated expenditure, by Vote, and by programme, clearly identifying both recurrent and development expenditures;
 - (vi) information regarding loans made to the county government, including an estimate of principal, interest and other charges to be paid by that county government in the financial year in respect of those loans;
- (c) information relating to any payments and liabilities to be made or incurred by the county government for which an appropriation is not included in an Appropriation Act, together with the constitutional or national legislative authority for any such payments or liabilities; and
- (d) a statement by the County Executive Committee member for finance specifying the measures taken by the county government to implement any recommendations made by the county assembly with respect to the budget for the previous financial year.
- (2) In preparing the annual Appropriation Bill to put before the County Assembly, the County Executive Committee member for finance shall ensure that the expenditure appropriations in the Bill are in a form that.
- (a) is accurate, precise, informative and pertinent to budget issues; and
 - (b) Clearly identifies the appropriations by Vote and Programme.
3. Provisions of Section 130 of the PFM Act, 2012 (County assembly to consider budget estimates)
- (1) The county assembly shall consider the county government budget estimates with a view to approving them, with or without amendments, in time for the relevant appropriation law and any other laws required to implement the budget to be passed by the 30th June in each year.
- (2) Before the county assembly considers the estimates of revenue and expenditure, the relevant committee of the county assembly shall discuss and review the estimates and make recommendations to the county assembly, and in finalizing the recommendations to county assembly, the committee shall take into account the views of the County Executive Committee member for finance and the public on the proposed recommendations.
- (3) An amendment to the budget estimates may be made by the county assembly only if it is in accordance with the resolutions adopted regarding the County Fiscal Strategy Paper and if—
- (a) any increase in expenditure in a proposed appropriation, is balanced by a reduction in expenditure in another proposed appropriation; and
 - (b) any proposed reduction in expenditure is used to reduce the deficit.
- (4) Where a Bill originating from a member of a county assembly proposes amendments after the passing of budget estimates and the Appropriations Bill by the county assembly, the county assembly may proceed in accordance with the resolutions adopted regarding the County Fiscal Strategy Paper and ensure—

- (a) an increase in expenditure in a proposed appropriation is balanced by a reduction in expenditure in another proposed appropriation; or
- (b) a proposed reduction in expenditure is used to reduce the deficit.
- (5) Not later than twenty-one days after the county assembly has approved the budget estimates, the County Treasury shall consolidate the estimates and publish and publicize them.
- (6) The County Executive Committee member for finance shall take all reasonably practicable steps to ensure that the approved budget estimates are prepared and published in a form that is clear and easily understood by, and readily accessible to, members of the public.

ANALYSIS AND CONSIDERATION OF THE STAKEHOLDERS' SUBMISSIONS FOR DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS FROM THE 35 ELECTRAL UNITS OF KISUMU COUNTY

Mr. Speaker Sir and Hon. Members, well aware that the Constitution of Kenya, 2010, the relevant provisions of the PFM Act, 2012 and County Government Act, 2012 directs that the County Assembly conducts its Business in an open and transparent manner. My Committee in exercise of its delegated responsibility by this Hon. House subjected the Proposed Budget Estimates FY 2021/2022 to Public Scrutiny for three days starting from Wednesday 26th May, 2021 to Friday 28th May, 2021.

Mr. Speaker Sir and Hon. Members, I wish to report that members of the public rejected most of the Development Projects prioritized in the Proposed Budget Estimates FY 2021/2022. The Committee

therefore consolidated the Public Views in its Report and recommended to the CECM Finance and Economic Planning to consider and implemented them.

Mr. Speaker Sir and Hon Members, concerned about the consideration of the public views by the Department of Finance pursuant to the Committee Recommendations, we have undertaken a detailed analysis of what we recommended to the Department from the Public Submissions visa vie what the Department has printed in its Budget Book FY 2021/2022.

- a) That, the CECM for Finance and Economic Planning be invited to the Assembly to explain why some projects priorities from the Public Participation recommended by the County Assembly for implementation have not been captured in the Budget Book FY 2021/2022 for implementation
- b) That, this House to properly oversight the implementation of this Budget to enable us to recover from the effects of the Covid-19 pandemic and to fulfill the dreams, priorities and aspirations of the Great Citizens of this County who trusted us with this mandate for the Five Years noting that this is the fourth budget of this current County government and the last to be implemented by this regime.
- c) That, the Assembly to invite the Kisumu County Public Service Board to shed light on the criteria used while establishing this new Department and its importance to the County Public Service.

CONCLUSION

Mr. Speaker Sir and Hon. Members, It is my appeal to this House to deliberate on and approve this report and to ensure that the Recommendations Contained herein are communicated to the Department and consequently implemented for the promotion of efficient service delivery to the electorates.

Mr. Speaker, I would like to call upon the Leader of Majority who is equally a Member of this Committee to second this report. Thank you.

(Hon. Inviolata relieves Hon. Okumu as the Temporary Speaker)

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Inviolata): Yes, Leader of Majority.

Leader of Majority (Hon. Onyango): Thank you so much the Hon. Madam Speaker. Please allow me to second this report from the Select Committee of County Budget and Appropriations on the Post-budget Review and Analysis for the FY 2021/2022.

Madam Speaker, as has been rightfully been observed, this is the last Budget Estimates that the current government is going to implement and therefore it would only be fair that this House exercises its oversight authority very well so that we can atleast actualize the implementation of Development Projects that have been proposed in this Estimates.

Madam Speaker, I would like to reiterate the importance of taking cognizance of views that emanate from Public Participations in the Budget Making Process. So, that, once that public has given its opinion on the kind of projects that they would wish to be prioritized in the Budget Estimates, then the same should be respected by the different departments as they prepare their Work-plans and Annual Estimates.

Madam Speaker, we have had a situation so many times where the Proposed Estimates is usually so much at variance with views that have come from the public participation. So, that many a times, this House is compelled to intervene to ensure that these views are taken into consideration. Otherwise, this Budget Estimates conforms largely with the provisions of section 130 of the PFM Act, 2012 and I would wish that, the gaps that the Select Committee has found can be corrected by the Department of Finance and Economic Planning so that the conformity of our Budget Estimates to the provisions of various legal instruments can at all times be adhered to. Thank you Madam Speaker, I second.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Inviolata): Thank you. Hon. Members, a Report from the Select Committee of County Budget and Appropriation on its Consideration of the Post Budget Review and Analysis for Financial Year 2021/2022 has been moved by Hon. Beatrice Odongo on behalf of the Chairperson, Hon. Steve Owiti and seconded by the Leader of Majority. I now open it up for debate.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Inviolata): Yes, Deputy Whip, Hon. Obonyo.

Deputy Majority Whip (Hon. Obonyo): Thank you Madam Speaker, may I call upon the mover to reply.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Inviolata): Hon. Members, the mover has been called to reply.

Hon. Atieno: On a Point of Order. Madam Speaker, I believe that we want to debate.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Inviolata): Hon. Members, I will give Hon. Atieno then, Hon. Ojuok is when the mover will reply.

Hon. Atieno: Thank you Madam Speaker. The reasons for my interjection when Hon. Odongo was moving the report was to highlight some of the very pertinent issues that would have really assisted us to exhaustively debate on this matters. Madam Speaker, having said that, I wonder as to whether the Budget Book that the Hon. Odongo is referring to is already out. Madam Speaker, if it is already out, then, it would have informed a very significant document for us as a House to do comparison and analysis as to what has been uploaded in the IFMIS System equally what is in the Approved Estimates.

Madam Speaker, when I visited one of the Departments at the County Executive, I found that there were a lot of discrepancies. There are some of the Development Projects for example in my ward

Kobura, the Korowe ECDE that has been in the lintel stage for the last five years. Madam Speaker, there were some funds allocated for this project, but to my surprise, when I visited the respective department, I was being informed that the Korowe ECDE is not there. Madam Speaker, here in the report it is appearing. This applies to Kaloure ECDE. There was an additional Kshs 200,000.00 to enable the completion of that project which could sum up to Kshs 1.2 million. Madam Speaker, when I visited the department, that project was equally missing in their Estimates.

Madam Speaker, I would really like to applaud the Select Committee...

Leader of Majority (Hon. Onyango): On a Point of Order. Thank you Madam Speaker. Madam Speaker, I would like to inform the Hon. Atieno that, the Approved Budget Estimates FY 2021/2022 had been posted in our Members communication platform, if he does not have it, then I have just posted it to you so that you will not have to say that, when you paid the Department a visit, please check it and confirm whether those projects are there or not. Thank you.

Hon. Atieno: Leader of Majority, when was this document posted because I believe that time is imperative on these kind of issues?

Leader of Majority (Hon. Onyango): Madam Speaker, I stated that it had been posted. But, for clarity if you don't have it, I have just posted it on your WhatsApp page right now.

Hon. Atieno: It has been posted right now and the document requires time to go through it. This is a document that you cannot just go through now.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Inviolata): Hon. Atieno, this is a document that was posted decades ago in the Members WhatsApp page. The Leader of Majority is stating that if you did not see it on the Members WhatsApp page...

Hon. Atieno: Madam Speaker, I am not talking of the Committee Report, I am talking of the Budget Book. Which if you could have given me time when Hon. Odongo was presenting, then I believe that she would have come up with some clarifications, then I would have not gone in to all these. Madam Speaker, having said that, it is imperative that, we applaud what the Committee has done so that we can interrogate and have a discourse on what is now there. I believe that, this is going to make us be aware and engage the department further on these kind of discrepancies which are wide spread. I believe that this is not happening in isolation in Kobura Ward but even in other wards.

Madam Speaker, I don't want to stretch my contribution further because I need to do a comparison on what is there on what I have now with what the Leader of Majority has just posted to me. Otherwise, I support. Thank you.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Inviolata): Yes, Hon. Ojuok.

Hon. Ojuok: Thank you Mr. Speaker. Foremost, let me first support and applaud the Select Committee of Budget and Appropriations for a job well done. I wish that this is something that came much earlier because what has been going on and we have noted some discrepancies.

Madam Speaker, what the Budget and Appropriations Committee has not captured in their report is I know and when you deliberate or talk to the relevant departments, one of the things that is there was the Rehabilitation of Nyakach Water Project which had a Budgetary allocation of Kshs 10 million. Madam Speaker and Hon. Members, it has been a concern because this was actually a project that was being undertaken together with our Development Partners Living Waters and it was being funded each and every year. Actually, this was the final funding and it is the last budget that this government is implementing and funnily enough, in the Approved Budget Estimates, I have been informed that the Kshs 10 million is not appearing anywhere. I am worried whether the Governor will be able to deliver on the issue of Nyakach Water Project which I would say is very key to his Manifesto and re-election.

Madam Speaker, I would really like to implore the Budget and Appropriations Committee to try and find out where that particular amount is disappearing in the Estimates. Thank you.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Inviolata): Yes, Hon. Ogotu.

Hon. Ogotu: Thank you Madam Speaker for according me this opportunity to contribute on this motion.

Madam Speaker and Hon. Members, I believe that the Budget Estimates is a very key document to the Assembly and the County Government as a whole. Madam Speaker, you have just heard the Leader of Majority stating that he has just posted the Approved Budget Estimates in the Members Web page. I believe that sometimes back, there were murmurs that the overall Budget Estimates amount has increased by about Kshs 1 billion. I believe that it would be prudent so that the Estimates was posted much earlier so that Members can interrogate and scrutinize and identify where the gaps are.

Madam Speaker, another germane issue which I wanted to highlight has been mentioned by Hon. Ojuok on the Rehabilitation of Nyakach Water Project. This project is very important to the people of Nyakach and this project in future will cover the five wards in Nyakach Sub-county. I believe that if the money is missing in the Estimates, then that implies that it will delay the completion of the projects thereby affecting the people of west Nyakach which is at the far end of this ward from accessing this critical commodity, water. Madam Speaker, as it has been put or requested by Hon. Ojuok, I equally implore the Budget and Appropriations Committee to delve into this bit so that we have equitable distribution of County Resources. I support. Thank you.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Inviolata): The mover of the motion.

Hon. Odongo: Thank you Madam Speaker. I would like to appreciate the Hon. Members who have positively contributed towards the report.

Madam Speaker and Hon. Members, I want to report here that, the Approved Budget Estimates FY 2021/2022 was posted in the Members WhatsApp page three weeks ago, if I am not wrong. I really expected the Members who were elected to have had a look at it even before delving into the report. I want to inform Hon. Atieno that what has been indicated in this report with regards to the Development Projects that was approved and printed were actually borrowed from the printed document of the Budget Estimates FY 2021/2022.

Madam Speaker, please allow me to remind Hon. Members that, three years ago each and every Hon. Members was furnished with an iPad and it is their responsibility to utilize the iPad and be digital. Hon. Members cannot lament that they have not seen the document and it was posted in the Members WhatsApp page three weeks ago. In the Assembly, we have free unlimited internet (Wi-Fi) and no member can nit-pick that they are not able to access the Internet.

Madam Speaker as a Committee, I want to reiterate here that, we did our level best and done our recommendations. I implore you that you allow the Committee to invite the CEC for Finance and Economic Planning to shed light of which one of the issues has been highlighted by Hon. Ojuok on the issues of Living Waters a Project in Nyakach. This is because contributions from the County Executive is not reflected in the Estimates and as a Committee we shall summon the CEC for Finance and Economic Planning and we must get an explanation as to why the monies were removed from the Estimates that was approved and printed. I believe that as a Committee we must do something because that is a loss to the County and a loss to the public and especially the people of Nyakach.

Madam Speaker, please allow me to appreciate all the Hon. Members and without forgetting Members of the Select Committee of Budget and Appropriations and the technical staff for the good work they are doing. Madam Speaker, in fact as we speak, the best Committee that is visible and is seen to be performing is the Budget and Appropriations Committee. Thank you.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Inviolata): Thank you Hon. Odongo. Hon. Members, now that the Report from the Select Committee of County Budget and Appropriation on its Consideration of the Post Budget Review and Analysis for Financial Year 2021/2022 has been moved by Hon. Odongo on behalf of the Chairperson, Hon. Steve Owiti and seconded by the Leader of Majority debated. I want to now put a question?

(Question put and agreed to)

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Inviolata): Yes, Leader of Majority.

Leader of Majority (Hon. Onyango): Thank you Madam Speaker. Pursuant to the provisions of County Assembly of Kisumu Standing Orders No. 25 (3) subject to paragraph 1. The County Assembly of Kisumu shall continue to be in session and may adjourn for such number of days as may be determined by its Business Calendar.

Madam Speaker, acknowledging the Gazette Notice No. 2342 of 12th March, 2021 in which the County Assembly gazetted its Annual Calendar, which was a resolution of the House that the Short Recess was to commence on Friday, 29th October, 2021 and terminate on Monday, 09th November, 2021.

Further acknowledging that, the County Assembly Standing Orders No. 26 (3) which states and I quote;

“On a day when the County Assembly is scheduled to adjourn, to a day other than the next normal sitting day in accordance with the County Assembly Calendar, the Leader of the Majority party or the Leader of the Minority party or another Member of the County Assembly Business Committee shall move a motion of adjournment which shall be debated for not more than three hour. After which the County Assembly shall adjourn without a question being put”.

Aware that the County Assembly Sports Association scheduled the CASA Games and Cultural Festivals to commence on Thursday 28th October 2021. Now, therefore, this Assembly urges Members to adjourn the House for purposes of CASA Games and a short recess until Tuesday 9th November 2021.

Hon. Pamela Odhiambo: Thank you Madam Speaker. I wish to call the mover to reply.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Inviolata): Before the Whip replies I wish to give Hon. Ogutu a chance to date on the motion.

Hon. Ogutu: Thank you. Madam Speaker. I believe that the Leader of Majority has moved a Motion on the Adjournment for the Short Recess which encompasses with the CASA Games. When we go to short recess of the Assembly which is something that is stated clearly in the Standing Orders. It is very sad that even the reasons which have been stated by the Member who is calling the mover to reply and she has stated that those who are registering as voters and registration for National Identification Cards. These are very important events in our lives because if you don't prepare well sometimes you might not see the floor of this House again. Now that we have a major hope in our life that Hon. Raila Odinga could be the next President of this Republic of Kenya. Madam Speaker we have to ask questions; yes we are going home but what is there for our welfare as Members?

Madam Speaker, today if you ask Hon. Members in this House, some don't even have a single cent to even fuel their cars yet, we are going back to our voters. What are the Hon. Members going to use to travel to the CASA Games? When it comes to welfare of Members, we take it very casually. Even though I am forced to support this particular motion still, we have to say it the way it is. It is very sad that Hon. Members are walking out of this Hon. we have the roles of the Leader of Majority. I want the Hon. Member to read the roles of the Leader of Majority so that I can be ably informed whether what he is talking about is one of those roles. There are certain things that you do not have to say and be captured on Hansard. I believe that, is demeaning the dignity of this House. Honestly, we are on YouTube and we are being watched all over the Country.

Having said that, I want to say that we are breaking for the short recess and I want to agree with him that even though the short recess is coinciding with the CASA Games, nonetheless it is important for us to put measures in place that can ensure that we register voters.

Madam Speaker, I did see the results of registration up to date and I want to say that Kisumu County is not doing very well. As we break for the Short Recess, let us take a day or two so that we can correct the gaps that is inhibiting this process of voter registration which is a very important exercise going on out there. Those Members that shall participate in various activities during the CASA games, kindly do your best so that the name of this Assembly and the name of Kisumu County can be written amongst the names of those that shall have done well. I was informed today by the organizers of this event that, we shall not have participants who are not bonafide Members of the Assembly. We just want to go out there and have fun, interact and come to know one another. So it is not a matter of life and death. That is the purpose for the CASA games this year. Thank you.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Inviolata): Pursuant to the provisions of Standing Orders no. 26 (3) which states that;

‘On a day when the County Assembly is scheduled to adjourn to a day other than the next normal sitting day in accordance with the County Assembly calendar, the Leader of the Majority Party or the Leader of the Minority Party or another Member of the County Assembly Business Committee shall move a Motion of adjournment which shall be debated for not more than three hours after which the County Assembly shall adjourn without question put.’
