The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Madam Clerk, please take us through the Order Paper of the day.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Next order!!

MOTION

PAYMENT OF ARREARS OWNED TO COMMUNITY HEALTH WORKERS AND
SUBSEQUENT REMUNERATION OF THEIR STIPEND FOR THE FIRST QUARTER FY
2021/2022

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Hon. Miruka.

Hon. Miruka: Thank you Madam Speaker. Aware that, among that Governor's Pledges as part of the County health Transformation Agenda, was to provide the Community health workers with a modest allowance and Medical Insurance with the national Health Insurance Fund (NHIF) as recognition of the significant role played by them.

Further aware that, the CHWs have the devotionally committed themselves to their duties across the County which they have delivered with utmost passion.

Nothing that, this Honourable House did allocate funds for the remuneration of these care-givers and further directed that the CHVs were to be paid in full their arrears owed to them by the County Government.

Cognizance to the fact that, the Governor did issue a directive that payment of CHVs be undertaken quarterly.

Concerned that, to date 14 CHWs in Nyakach Sub-county, 8 from Nyando amongst others have not been paid their outstanding allowances of up to 30th June, 2021 which is against the information from the department of Finance that such payment is up to date.

Now therefore, this Hon. House be moved or compelled to resolve that;

- a) The CEC for Finance and Economic Planning be compelled to adhere to the promises made and payment of the CHWs their dues in full and prompt, and;
- b) State clearly when arrears of FY 2020/2021, the First Quarter of 2021/2022 will be paid.

Mr. Speaker, I therefore call upon Hon. John Atieno to second.

Hon Atieno: Thank you Madam Speaker. I rise to second the motion as read by Hon. Rashid Miruka.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): The motion on Payment of Arrears owned to Community Health Workers and subsequent Remuneration of their Stipend for the First Quarter FY 2021/2022 has been moved by Hon. Rashid Miruka and seconded by Hon. John Atieno. I therefore, want to open it for debate.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Hon. Paul Okiri.

Hon. Okiri: Thank you madam Speaker. This is an important motion in this House. The issue of CHVs is long overdue. We have been budgeting for this item in every financial year. I remember attending a meeting where the Governor addressed this matter and he did promise these group will be paid promptly. You are all aware of the process of budget making. Madam Speaker, health consumes a bigger percentage of our revenue. Who is behind the delay of the payments of the gratuity and we are all aware that the Governor had approved the payments?

Madam Speaker, we are all serving this government and our opponents may think that we are part and parcel of the problems bedeviling the CHVs. We are going to have hard times to convince our people to re-elect us.

Leader of Majority (Hon. Onyango): On a Point of Order. I really find it difficult when the Honourable Member just spew words without putting evidence on the table. The Honourable Member is saying that the CHVs have not been paid for the last eight months. Where is the evidence?

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Can you please assist this House by stating the truth?

Leader of Majority (Hon. Onyango): The burden of proof is on that person who is putting on these allegations. The burden of proof lies with him.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): What is it Hon. Leader of Minority.

Leader of Minority (Hon. Oiko): I want to ask Hon. Okiri to substantiate what he has just said. Statement of facts. He is misleading the House.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Thank you very much.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Hon. Rashid Miruka.

Hon. Miruka: Thank you Madam Speaker. I want to categorically say that between the months April to June was not paid. I want to say that there are about Fourteen CHVs in Nyakach that have not been paid. These are records that were received from the right offices. Thank you.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Do you have proof.

Hon. Miruka: I can prove it. It is in my phone.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Hon. Members, can you please share the same information with the Leader of Majority.

Hon. Miruka: Madam Speaker, this was a motion for discussion, so, let the members discuss first.

The Leader of Majority (Hon. Onyango): Madam Speaker, when a motion is brought to the House, eventually, resolutions have to be made. How can these resolutions be made without facts? If I listen keenly to my friend Hon. Miruka, he said that the Department of Finance and Economic Planning had asserted that they have made payments, contrary to the information that they have. This means that there are conflicting perspectives to this matter, and I want to agree with the Hon. Leader of Minority, when he suggested that this issue is committed to a House Committee in order for them to get informative facts from both sides.

However, if the Hon. Miruka says that there is evidence to his claim. Why can't he attach the evidence to the motion for ease of scrutiny by members during discussion? We cannot rely on conjecture and pigments of imagination in a serious House of debate like this, thank you.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Yes, Hon. Paul Okiri

Hon. Okiri: Thank you Madam Speaker, I am inclined to disagree with the Leader of Majority. This is a motion which must be first deliberated on before you commit it to a House Committee, but you cannot do the latter before the former has been tackled, thank you.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): That's quite in order, I actually wanted to advise the Hon. Leader of Majority on the same.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Yes, Hon. Vitalis Otura.

Hon. Otura: Thank you Madam Speaker, I stand to support the presentation by Hon. Rashid Miruka.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Are you contributing or do you have an issue to put across?

Hon. Otura: Kindly just give me time to submit.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Please proceed.

Hon. Otura: The motion at hand is weighty and a lot needs to be discussed on the same. However, as much as we are in agreement with the Leader of Majority that this House does not condone innuendos and conjecture, there are tangible issues that need to be discussed. For instance, Hon. Rashid has cited that quite a number of CHVs in his ward haven't been paid, and the same case applies to my ward where half the number of CHVs haven't been paid. I also represent these CHVs...

Hon. Okiri: A point of information Madam Speaker

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Hon. Vitalis Otura, can you give time for Hon. Okiri's point of information.

Hon. Okiri: *(On a point of information)* Thank you Madam Speaker, this is a House of rules, so we should know whether Hon. Otura is contributing or is on a Point of Order or not because the Law will bar him from contributing twice.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): I believe I had asked the same from you Hon. Otura but I can see you are prolonging the submission. Can you clarify to the House whether it is a Point of Order or of information?

Hon. Otura: Madam Speaker, when I rose up you gave me the permission to debate on the motion at hand. I never stood on either point or order or that of information.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): I am sorry I didn't give you that chance for debate. Nevertheless, before you continue let's give the Leader of Majority time first because it needs not be overtaken by events.

The Leader of Majority (Hon. Onyango): Madam Speaker, we need to follow the rules of debate.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Precisely.

The Leader of Majority (Hon. Onyango): When somebody raises a Point of Order, as the chair you need to adjudge on that point of order before we proceed.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Mmh!

The Leader of Majority (Hon. Onyango): Madam Speaker, I raised fundamental issues; that this motion has prayers and one of the prayers were that the CEC Finance and Economic Planning to be compelled to pay the outstanding arrears. When a motion is brought before the House, it is eventually adopted or rejected. So, if we adopt the motion with say the above prayers compelling the CEC Finance and Economic Planning to pay the outstanding arrears and then we find that there weren't any arrears left?

Secondly, when I raised a Point of Order, I asked the mover of the motion to attach the evidence of the outstanding arrears to the motion to ease scrutiny and debate in the House. As a matter of facts and procedure, you need to guide the House.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Kindly do not mislead the House, because the author had already said that there is evidence to his claim. Can you accord the House Committee time, which was tasked with this scrutiny to bring it to the House?

The Leader of Majority (Hon. Onyango): Madam Speaker, you didn't understand what we were saying. Procedurally, a motion must be adopted or rejected eventually after debate.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Would that be a problem to you? Continue Hon. Okiri

Hon. Okiri: Thank you Madam Speaker. I don't know why the Leader of Majority is misleading the House. The Leader of Majority was asking for evidence and the mover of this motion has accepted that he has the evidence that the Leader of Majority is seeking for. Madam Speaker, the only thing that he should have said is that we accord the mover of the motion probably two weeks to produce the evidence before this House. I believe that is all. Then we continue with the debate. In actual fact the Leader of Majority is eating into my time....

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Hon. Otura, please continue with your contribution.

Hon. Otura: Thank you Madam Speaker. Hon. Miruka has a valid point that should be deliberated upon. I want to state clearly here that, in my ward I have 54 Community Health Volunteers (CHVs) and that should go on record.

Madam Speaker, I am equally stating here that for the past two quarters, these CHVs have not been paid...

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Leader of Majority, are you getting what Hon. Otura is saying?

Hon. Otura: Madam Speaker, I believe that these are the facts and evidences the Leader of Majority wants us to adduce and they are on Hansard. I repeat that I have 54 CHVs whom for the past two quarters have not been paid their dues. This is something that is in the public domain that, Ombeyi Ward has 54 CHVs...

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Order!! Hon. Otura, I can see the Leader of Majority shaking his head in a manner to suggest that these are not factual...It is as if he has paid them. Can the Leader of Majority give proof to this House that these CHVs have been paid their dues.

Hon. Otura: Madam Speaker, my colleague Hon. Miruka from North Nyakach has just stated that he has 14 CHVs that have not been paid their dues in the last quarter of the last fiscal year and the current quarter has also not been paid. So, in such a scenario, we need to come out very clear and state that there might be foul play in the criteria used in which the County Government is paying their CHVs. Madam Speaker, how can some of the CHVs be paid and other not. Madam Speaker, the agreement was that, the CHVs were to be paid their dues on a quarterly basis. Fine, let us narrow it to that aspect that they are to be paid quarterly.

Madam Speaker, we are in the second week of October, 2021. The first quarter of this financial year is already gone, why have they not been paid. Madam Speaker, I wanted this to come out clearly because I know that at the end of the debate, you will have to give a ruling.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Conclude.

Hon. Otura: Thank you Madam Speaker. I just wanted your attention because at the tail end of this debate you will have to give your ruling...

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Hon. Miruka, please approach the Chair.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Please continue Hon. Otura.

Leader of Minority (Hon. Oiko): Madam Speaker, Point of Order!!

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Which orders Leader of Minority?

Leader of Minority (Hon. Oiko): Madam Speaker, the matter on the floor of this House is a real issue and it affects our people. Madam Speaker, what we are only asking for is the procedure. An individual cannot go outside and collect data, he brings to this Hon. House and he wants us to rely on that data as the truth. Madam Speaker, we want to rely on the data from The County Executive. So, that we have an individual officer to take to task on the report that is being discussed here.

Madam Speaker that is where the problem is. The issues are real and we know the issue at hand, but we want it to be procedural. We want to take the Departments involved which is the Health and Finance so that the report brought here, if challenged, we will claim and defend that this is a report that emanated from the Health Department and this one was from the Finance Department. Now, what the Hon. Member has raised here, is what you want us to treat as the Gospel Truth, what if it is a contrary one, who will be taken to task? That is where the anomalies are.

Madam Speaker, for a matter to be discussed here, adopted or not, the Committee must stand for that in this case which House Committee is being tasked to do this. Thank you.

Hon. Miruka: On a Point of Order. Thank you Madam Speaker. I want to categorically state here that, this motion passed the stipulated and required processes and that is the reason as to why it matured to be discussed. Madam Speaker, similarly, I stated here that let us diagnose if the prayers of the petitioners are workable, if they are not, then, it will depend with the resolution of the Members in this House who will put forward their suggestion on what best should be done.

Otherwise, as I had mentioned earlier, I still reiterate that, I have facts. Thank you.

Hon. Okiri: Madam Speaker, further information.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Please proceed.

Hon. Okiri: Madam Speaker, let the Hon. Member not take you in circles. You as the Chair has the powers and the most important power is the provisions of Standing Order No. 1. You put a question and let the Hon. Members decide whether to move it to another level or use the powers as stipulated in the Standing Orders, but we are not supposed to give you directions. Thank you.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Thank you. Order!! Order!! Leader of Majority, can't you see that I am on my feet. Hon. Members, by appending my signature to this motion means that it is well diagnosed and mature to be brought before this House.

Hon. Members, I want to implore the Leader of Majority to not mislead this House by wanting his needs to be discussed...

(Applause)

Hon. Otura, please conclude.

Hon. Otura: Thank you Madam Speaker. Order!! Leader of Majority. I can see you are now giving direction and as a matter of procedure; unless we are also not in this House. You know the procedures and this thing was authenticated, that is why it is here.

On to the real business, I do not know why the innuendos by the Leader of Majority about this debate.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): He seems to be satisfied because his Community Health Workers (CHWs) have already been paid. Let those people who are having crisis...

Hon. Otura: So, sometimes Madam Speaker...

The Leader of Majority (Hon. Onyango): On a point of order, Madam Speaker!

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Not allowed, please.

Hon. Otura: Very good and thank you Madam Speaker. By so saying that I have 54 CHWs in my ward and they have not been paid for the past two quarters. It implies to any other Honourable Member representing another ward can also stand and support the motion by saying the same for his/her ward.

Madam Speaker, Hon. Rashid has the evidence and he has tabled the very bits that we can see in the motion. Madam Speaker, at the end of this debate, it is incumbent upon you to give direction. You can put it to a question, after which it either flops or succeed. I believe that there is a serious flaw that the Leader of Majority is covering up in this our good government. That one would taint the name of this Government only if he blindly defend a motion with evidences which needs to be tabled. Thank you Madam Speaker.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Hon. Judith Ogaga please.

Hon. Ogaga: Thank you Madam Speaker and I stand to support the motion. However, I want to inform our Hon. Members that in as much as we are in power, we also need to feel what our people feel. When we are here transacting our businesses, we should do that knowing that the outside world is watching and we will be judged according to how we perform our duties.

We have three important roles/mandates and as people's representative, we are the ones that they approach with their issues to come and represent them and do oversight in ensuring that whatever belongs to them, get to them. They should also get the treatment that they deserve.

For my colleague Hon. Rashid Miruka to come up with a motion, for it to be approved for discussion, then, that is adequate proof of what our CHWs are going through. There are cries by all of them from all over the County. I am just wondering that some of us do not know what our people are going through. Madam Speaker, this is very serious motion because these CHWs are the ones who interact with the local people.

Madam Speaker, they are the people who are supposed to be given priority when it comes to their welfare and payment. It is sad because we have money that flows in and payments are done. But, when these payments are being done, priorities are not given to people like CHWs. Even the ECD teachers have been crying foul. You will find out that payments are getting done on other things but the most important sections are left out.

Madam Speaker, just like what my colleagues have said, I want to say that we are approaching electioneering period, we need to support our Governor Prof. Anyang' Nyong'o whom we love so much and we would like him to have a second term. However, at this rate the people surrounding him are not supporting him by doing the right thing. We should come and do our oversight role so that our people get assisted and in the same manner, our Governor also get helped.

Madam Speaker, in addition, when we come to campaign period, he will not find it difficult but now, it is going to be a big challenge if this is carried forward to that time.

Madam Speaker, I support this and it is after this discussion that you should give direction that investigations to be done, then we will be able to see a decision made towards helping our people. Thank you Madam Speaker.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Thank you.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Hon. Leader of Majority please.

Leader of Majority (Hon. Onyango): Thank you Madam Speaker. About two weeks ago, a member of a staff from my ward called me by saying that they have not been paid their Gratuity and LAPFUND for the last six months. I called back our Finance Officer and inquired why they are not remitting those statutory deductions to our ward staff members.

However, the Finance Officer told me “Can you tell that particular person to go to the LAPFUND Office and establish if indeed there are arrears”. I told that person to go to LAPFUND and was given a statement indicating that the payments are up to date.

So, the information that the ward staff had and the information that the Finance Department had were varying. It took that phone call so that we could be on the same page so that the truth could be established. When that person went there, he told me, “I think we had wrong information”

Madam Speaker, I do not have a problem with this motion. If indeed our CHWs have not been paid, then, that should be a matter that concerns all of us. But, Madam Speaker, we need to establish the truth. That is all I was saying because if you want to take the relevance departments to task, then we must have tangible evidence with us. If that tangible evidence is here with us and if that tangible evidence is there Madam Speaker, then why is it so difficult for them to table it before the House so that these fears can be allayed? That is not rocket science Madam Speaker.

Madam Speaker, what we are saying is that, before the prayer number one can be enforced, can we give the concerned CEC the benefit of doubt to clarify this matter; To let us know whether indeed this arrears are in excess of eight months as it has been alleged here or not, that is what I was asking for and I do not see any unfairness here because whatever resolutions that we pass in this House should be based on evidence. We cannot afford to be a rumour mongering House, we can never be that...

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Order!! Leader of Majority...

Hon. Otura: Point of order!!

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Proceed Hon. Otura.

Hon. Otura: Thank you Madam Speaker. Please allow me to inform Hon. Onyango who is our Leader of Majority that, in relation to what is being discussed, we have just given an example relating to LAPFUND. In this case we are discussing payments due to CHVs.

Madam Speaker, I want to inform the Leader of Majority that, yesterday, I had a discussion with a CHV and the lady was really crying for having worked that long and gone without pay for the last six months. As an example, that emanates from the grassroot that is the individual touched the CHV whom I had an audience with is a lady. On the same breadth, I want to inform the Leader of Majority that, I have had an audience with the representatives of these CHVs and they are known as CHAs and this matter was confirmed.

So, as a matter of fact, misinformation may be there, but in this particular case, there is no misinformation. These are bare facts which are on the ground. I hope the Leader of Majority is informed. Thank you.

Hon. Ogaga: Point of Information.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): What is your information Hon. Ogaga?

Hon. Ogaga: Thank you Madam, Speaker. I would like to inform this House that as much as we are debating on this issue, we need to give room for investigations to be done. This is because even the CEC for Finance makes payments of the processed requisitions made by the Department. So, we need to have these investigations done for us to know where the problem is emanating from. Thank you.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Yes, Leader of Majority.

Leader of Majority (Hon. Onyango): Madam Speaker, I want to appreciate Hon. Ogaga. I thought that the information that was given by the Hon. Otura was a little pedestal. So, I don't want to spend...

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Order!! Leader of Majority. In simple terms, I want to request you that, you leave the House...

Leader of Majority (Hon. Onyango): Madam Speaker, to do what?

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): This is because, CHVs are in every Ward. Please let the Hon. Member know that CHVs from your Ward have been paid and are satisfied.

Leader of Majority (Hon. Onyango): Madam Speaker, what I am saying is what Hon. Ogaga has said. That, yes there could be a problem, we don't deny, but as a House, let us establish that facts so that when we....

Hon. Miruka: Point of information Madam Speaker!!

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): What is it Hon. Miruka?

Hon. Miruka: Thank you Madam Speaker. I have stated here more than three times that, I have evidence pertaining to this matter...

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): This is added to that of Hon. Otura's.

Hon. Miruka: Yes. That is one. Two, I would like to implore my colleague, Hon. Kenneth Onyango that, can you tell us if you really do your oversight role on what is happening with CHVs from your ward. This is because we cannot defend what is wrong...

Hon. Ogaga: Hon. Miruka, do you work at the County Executive?

Leader of Majority (Hon. Onyango): Madam Speaker, how do you adduce evidences in this House, how?

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Leader of Majority, what I am saying is that, can you assist the House by informing them what is happening in your Ward?

Leader of Majority (Hon. Onyango): Madam Speaker, that is neither here nor there. We are discussing something that is pertinent.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Please continue.

Leader of Majority (Hon. Onyango): Madam Speaker, when somebody says, I don't know, probably, my understanding is getting a little compromised. When you say that you have evidence, how do you produce evidence in this House?

So, I would wish that the prayers is amended so that this motion be committed to a House Committee for further investigations so as to table a comprehensive report that is backed by facts so that this House can implement the resolutions of that report. Thank you.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Hon. Leader of majority, your proposal for amendment of the motion is not seconded. Therefore, it is null and void.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Hon. Olang'o, the floor is yours.

Hon. Olang'o: Thank you Madam Speaker. It seems that there is a lot of problems concerning CHVs. When all the MCAs are in this House, they represent their electoral wards and the community. These Community Health Volunteers emanate from our communities and if there is a problem, we must give it the unwavering attention to what Hon. Miruka has raised. These CHVs are doing a lot of work. My proposal is to consider taking this motion back to the Standing Committee, whether it is Health and Sanitation and they invite the CEC for Finance to get these facts. Madam Speaker, thank you, I support this motion.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Madam Clerk, please approach the chair.

(Madam Speaker consulting with the Clerk)

(Loud consultations)

Hon. Beatrice Pamela: Thank you Madam Speaker, going by the mood of the House I would like to call the mover to reply.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Yes mover of the motion.

Hon. Miruka: Thank you Hon. Members for the robust debate that you have shown in this House. I want to thank everyone for the positive contribution that they have made. Above all, I believe today that it is good to be a representative that stays with his people back at home. You have seen for yourselves that our representatives who stay in town do not really mind about what happens in the CHVs back in their wards and that has been manifested here.

Madam Speaker and Hon. Members, it is very true that our CHVs are in serious problem despite the devotional service that they do to our people. I want to request you and as I said earlier when I moved this motion that we compel the Department of Finance and Economic Planning to inform this House why they are not releasing these funds.

Madam Speaker and Hon. Members, I also want to inform you that, we have done our investigations with the person in charge of CHVs and she has admitted that she has done all the documentations and the papers are lying with the Department of Finance and Economic Planning. Why are they not executing this? Because these people are meagerly paid. The CHVs are paid 2500 per month and this is paid quarterly. If these people are not getting their money when they are due? What are we going to tell our people when we go to ask for votes? Because this is something that our Governor who is seeking his second term promised the CHVs. Let us work for our people. Let us not be defensive for the sake of it. All of us want to come back to this Assembly but we should also say the truth.

Finally I want to request that, since you have heard for yourself, we have people who are lamenting that we take this matter to a House Committee or we call the relevant department to come and shed more light here. Guide the House and let our CHVs be paid. Another time when we went for the launching of a Health Facility in Hon. Jagongo's ward, the same thing happened. This is because one person is lazing around on the job. We must keep them on their toes. Thank you.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Thank you. I therefore direct that the motion be directed to the Joint Committee of Labour and Health to conduct further investigations for us to make a ruling on the same.

The Temporary Speaker (Hon. Muga): Next Order!
