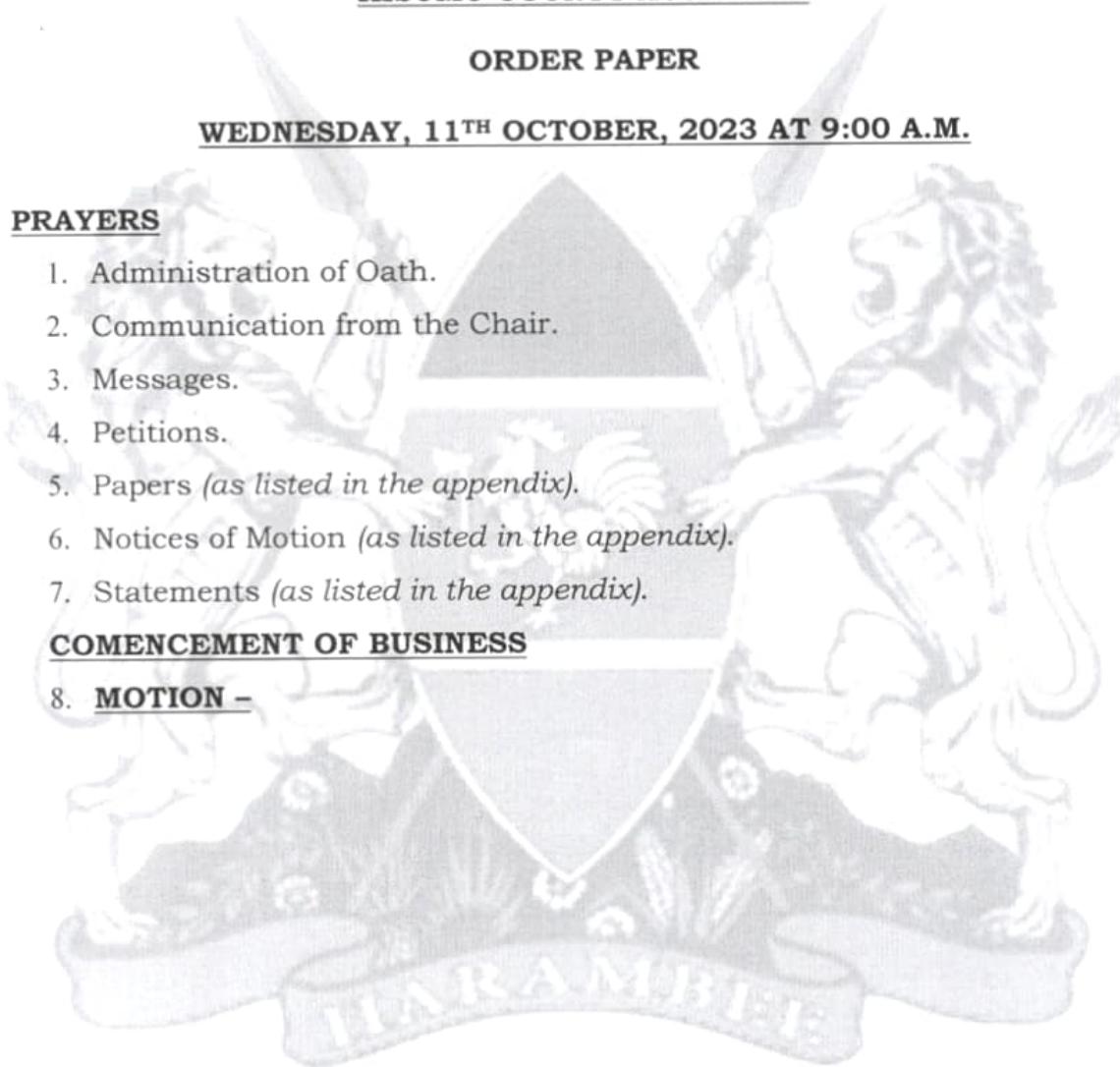

3. STATEMENTS:

i. **Statement on a comprehensive update on expected El nino phenomenon**
(Hon Oiko Pete).

Aware that the Ministry of Environment, Climate Change and Forestry through the Kenya Meteorological Department on 30th July, 2023 issued a comprehensive update on the expected occurrence of El Niño phenomenon and its impact on rainfall in the country's climate during the October to December, 2023 season.

Further cognizant that, the forecasted high amount of rainfall will have imminent effects on the areas prone to floods in the County. This heavy and long rainy season can have multifaceted effects on various sectors of the society, the economy and the environment.

In this regards therefore, I request this Hon. House to invite the following Departments to appear before the Committee or. General Oversight to give highlights/updates on the status of their preparedness/interventions to take advantage of the rains and minimize the Potential Risk that the rains may cause.

a) The Department of Public Service, County Administration & Participatory Development, Office of the Governor (Disaster Risk Management- plans for disiltation of local Rivers and renovation of existing evacuation centers).

b) Agriculture, Fisheries, Livestock Development and Irrigation (To give highlights on County preparedness in terms of food security and sustainability, marketing. production of early maturing crops and offering technical support and advise to farmers on best practices during the period).

It is also in the Public Notice that mercury waste are being discharged into the river from the Mining area thus endangering the public using the river and the fauna in the river.

I therefore wish to seek a statement from the Chairperson of the Committee on Water, Environment and Natural Resource to provide a response on the following matters:

- a) Whether the gold mining activity is legal pursuant to the Provisions of the Mining Act of Kenya;
- b) Whether there is an environmental impact assessment report of the mining activity; and
- c) Whether a remedy is in place to protect the public from the dangerous mercury waste now being discharged into the river.
