  - c) Consider the programs of all Committees, including their need to travel and sit away from precincts of County Assembly;
  - d) Ensure that Committees submit reports as required by these Standing Orders;
  - e) Determine, whenever necessary, the Committee or Committees to deliberate on any matter; and
  - f) Give such advice relating to the work and mandate of select Committees as it may consider necessary.
- 3) The Liaison Committee shall consider reports compiled by other Committees which reports have not been deliberated by the County Assembly and shall report to the County Assembly on the consideration of such reports.

## CHAPTER TWO

### LEGAL FRAMEWORK

Mr. Speaker and Hon Members, the Committee while carrying out this exercise was guided by the following statutory instruments;

Section 14 of the of the County Governments Act No. 17 of 2012

Procedure and Committees of the county assembly

(1) A county assembly –

- (a) may make standing orders consistent with the Constitution and this Act regulating the procedure of the county assembly including, in particular, orders for the proper conduct of proceedings, and
- (b) subject to standing orders made under paragraph (a), may establish committees in such manner and for such general or special purposes as it considers fit, and regulate the procedure of any Committee so established

Kisumu County Assembly Standing Orders No. 183

Progress reports

- (1) Unless a more regular interval is prescribed under any written law or these Standing Orders, each select Committee shall submit half yearly progress reports to the Liaison Committee.

- (2) The Liaison Committee shall, within twenty-one days, compile the reports under paragraph (1) and submit a report to the County Assembly.

## CHAPTER SIX

## OBSERVATION AND FINDINGS

Mr. Speaker and Hon Members,

The Committee observed as follows;

1. On aligning priorities to the workplans
  - a) THAT most committees' activities listed in their progress reports for the period under review do not align with the priorities they provided in their previous progress reports (for the period ended 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2023) and the workplans.
  - b) THAT activities listed in the progress reports by some Committees as their priorities for the coming half of the FY (July, 2023 to December, 2023) do not align to the activities listed in their workplans for the same period.
2. On performance of Committees
  - a) THAT Committees performed better in the second half of the year than in the first half. This was evident by the number of reports presented (40 reports compared to 8 in the first half). It is also important to note that in the first half of the FY lasted for about 4 months (September to December).
3. On the legislative performance of the County Assembly during the PUR.
  - a) THAT there was processed a total 12 statements, 6 of which were statements sought in the previous period (ended 31<sup>st</sup> Dec, 2022).
  - b) THAT a total of 4 bills were before the County Assembly, all of which were completely processed.
  - c) THAT 5 motions were processed, all of which were statutory motions.
  - d) THAT a total of 3 petitions were before the county assembly.
  - e) THAT a total of 22 papers were laid before the floor of the House.
4. On comparison of the performance of the county assembly between the period ended 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2022 and the period ended 30<sup>th</sup> June, 2023.
  - a) THAT during the PUR, the county assembly presented 40 reports during the period ended 30<sup>th</sup> June, 2023 against 8 during the period ended 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2022, giving a positive variance of 43.
  - b) THAT during the PUR, the county assembly received 3 petitions during the period under review against 2 during the period ended 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2022, giving a positive variance of 1.

- c) THAT during the PUR a total of 10 statements were sought against 22 sought during the period ended 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2022 recording a negative variance of 12.
  - d) THAT during the PUR 5 motions processed against 6 during the period ended 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2022.
  - e) THAT of the 6 motions received during the period ended 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2023 4 were statutory and two were private motions while all the 5 during the PUR were all statutory motions.
5. Overall legislative performance of the county assembly
- a) THAT in the entire financial year, before the County Assembly were 11 motions (inclusive of statutory motions), 35 statements, 6 bills, 5 petitions and a total of 39 papers.
  - b) THAT in the entire financial year, out of the 35 statements sought, only 21 were responded to and completely processed.
  - c) THAT the bills before the County Assembly were all completely processed.
  - d) THAT out of the 5 petitions, 2 have been processed. However, it is important to note that as at the elapse of the financial year, the remaining three were still within timelines.

## RECOMMENDATIONS

Mr. Speaker and Honourable Members, the Committee in accordance with its mandates and from the above findings/observations recommends;

1. THAT Members need to propose motions and private Member bills to reduce the House's reliance on motions originating from papers submitted by the executive. Arm of the government. By actively generating their own motions and bills, Members can contribute to a more diverse and independent legislative agenda, fostering a balanced representation of priorities and concerns within the House.
2. THAT Committees strive to implement a systematic and periodic review process to assess and align their activities as indicated in the annual workplans to their progress reports. This will help foster a better coordination in ensuring that their activities consistently contribute to achieving their objectives and those of the County Assembly as a whole.

## CONCLUSION

**Leader of Majority** (Hon. Ooko, MCA, Ahero Ward): Thank you Mr. Speaker. I arise to move a Motion of the Adjournment of the House for Urgent Matters of County Importance that is on the Public Participation of the Proposed Kisumu County Finance Bill, 2023.

FURTHER AWARE THAT, Order No. 123 (3) of the Kisumu County Assembly Standing Orders provides that the Sectoral Committees to which a Bill is committed shall facilitate Public Participation sessions and shall take into account views and recommendations of the public when the committee retreats to make its report to the County Assembly.

RECOGNIZING THAT, the County assembly has scheduled Public Participation Exercise on the Bill on Wednesday, 26<sup>th</sup> September, 2023

FURTHER RECOGNIZING THAT, Members and staff of the County Assembly will have a responsibility to actively participate in this process to ensure that the government of the day serves the best interest of its constituents and upholds the democratic principles

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Okumu, MCA, East Seme Ward): Order!! Order Leader of majority!! Hon. Ochele and Hon. Oginga, please approach the chair.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Okumu, MCA, East Seme Ward): Please proceed Hon. Leader of Majority.

**Leader of Majority** (Hon. Ooko, MCA, Ahero Ward): ACKNOWLEDGING THAT, Orders No. 31(1) the Kisumu County Assembly Standing Orders states that;

*Any Member may at any time rise in his or her and seek leave to move the adjournment of the County Assembly for the purpose of discussing a definite matter of urgent County importance.*

FURTHER ACKNOWLEDGING THAT, Orders No. of the Kisumu County Assembly Standing Orders states;

*On a day when the County Assembly is scheduled to adjourn to a day other than the next normal sitting day in accordance with the County Assembly calendar, the Leader of the Majority Party or the Leader of the Minority Party or another Member of the County Assembly Business Committee shall move a Motion of Adjournment which shall be debated for not more than three hours after which the County Assembly shall adjourn without question put.*

NOW THEREFORE, this Assembly now urges Members to adjourn the County Assembly plenary sittings until Thursday, 28<sup>th</sup> September, 2023 at 02:30 p.m. to allow for public participation exercise on the Kisumu County Finance Bill, 2023. Mr. Speaker, I would like to call upon Hon. Carren Ajwang' to second.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Okumu, MCA, East Seme Ward): Yes Hon. Carren Ajwang' of Kaloeleni-shaurimoyo Ward.

**Hon. Ajwang'** (MCA, Kaloleni-Shaurimoyo Ward): Thank you Mr. Speaker. As you are all aware that the Public Participation on the Proposed Kisumu County Finance Bill, 2023 is very

crucial so, I therefore second that this House adjourns to enable Members participate in the Public Participation in their respective Sub-counties. Thank you.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Okumu, MCA, East Seme Ward): Honourable Members, a motion has been moved by the Leader of Majority on the Adjournment of this House and seconded by Hon. Carren Ajwang' and I now propose to put a question that we open this motion for debate.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Okumu, MCA, East Seme Ward): Yes Hon. Ouko.

**Hon. Ouko** (MCA, West Kisumu Ward): Thank you Mr. Speaker. I arise in support of this motion because public participation is critical and enshrined in our statutes and laws of the land which in my belief is superior to other laws we make reference to in this House. I want to reiterate that it is important that we engage our constituents and seek their mandate on matters concerning development. I support. Thank you.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Okumu, MCA, East Seme Ward): Yes, Hon. Tom Nyaoke from North Nyakach.

**Hon. Nyaoke** (MCA, North Nyakach Ward): Thank you, Mr. Speaker, for giving me this opportunity. Mr. Speaker, being aware that public participation is equally an important role, just as what we are doing in this House. It is indeed a very important thing to support the adjournment motion, so that, we not only participate physically towards this noble exercise, but also to help in mobilizing the citizens to attend this important thing.

Mr. Speaker, this is a fundamental function that with the absence of our presence in that particular function, may not really yield what is required, but our presence there, I believe and trust that just as been mentioned before, that we should put a lot of effort as in there as we put when attending the Assembly. K'Omudho** (MCA, Muhoroni-Koru Ward): Thank you so much Mr. Speaker and Honorable Member, I also stand to support the adjournment motion which is very important for the intended public participation. A number of them that happens and you will agree that sometimes we get to defuse the tensions in quite a number of areas when the locals come with their own restrictions. We being the politicians who are who are used to these locals, we may help to reducing the tensions as opposed to our staff members who may not have the capacity. **Hon. Were** (MCA, Nyalenda “B” Ward): Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I also rise to support the adjournment of this House. Mr. Speaker, it is important for us to go back to the people and engage with them. Mr. Speaker, public participation is enshrined in our Constitution and it is very important for us to join our people in enlightening them on the Bill that is before us and to explain more so that our people can know what is before them and to what extent their involvement is required. Mr. Speaker I beg to support Thank you.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Okumu, MCA, East Seme Ward): Yes the Hon. Member from Central Kolwa.

**Hon. Kevin Oraro** (MCA, Kolwa Central Ward): Thank you Mr. Speaker. Foremost, the motion before us is about Proposed Kisumu County Finance Bill, 2023. The bill in itself might not be popular among the residents, because they only knew about the Finance at the National level. Since we are leaders and the people who represent should be in a position to understand what is going on, and sometimes the poor performance in public participation, then I believe that this is the right time to mobilize members of the public especially the traders who will be affected by the Bill to attend the public participation to give their input. So that, anytime they see the Enforcement or Revenue Officers, they should understand that it is money that we collect that will enable development projects to be undertaken. Historically, we are aware that this public participation event tends to evoke strong emotions, as it involves adjustments that impact our constituents significantly. **Hon. Oginga** (Nominated Member): Thank you Mr. Speaker. I would like to support this motion on adjournment for public participation on the Kisumu County Finance Bill, 2023. I would like to encourage mobilization on the encouragement of this public participation. Previously, there has been laxity in the mobilization and one of our key roles being representation might not be achieved because we are not able to get the general views on some of these documents. I would also like to request if we can digitize these processes because I know at times we hold these forums when most people are busy at their various places of work. If we can work around this initiative then, we will be able to get better views and contributions in order for us to have a better document. Thank you.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Okumu, MCA, East Seme Ward): Yes Hon. James Omollo.

**Hon. Omollo James Ochieng** (MCA, West Nyakach Ward): Thank you Mr. Speaker. I wish to call the mover to reply.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Okumu, MCA, East Seme Ward): Yes Leader of Majority.

**The Leader of Majority** (Hon. Ooko, MCA, Ahero Ward): Thank you Mr. Speaker. I want to thank the Hon. Members for supporting this motion and I want to urge Members that it is very important for them to attend the public participation which gives them a chance to engage with the people and fully understand what they think about this Bill. I know it is also their democratic right for the Members of the public to attend public participation because it is a very important matter. Thank you.
