Hon Bill (MCA, Kobura Ward): Madam Speaker, I wish to table the Motion on behalf of my Chairperson Hon Alandoh.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Okombo, MCA, Manyatta “B” Ward): Granted.

Hon Bill (MCA, Kobura Ward): Madam Speaker and Honourable Members, I rise pursuant to Order No. 123 (4) of the Kisumu County Assembly Standing Orders to Move a Motion that this House approves the Report of the Agriculture, Fisheries, Livestock Development and Irrigation Committee on the Kisumu County Agricultural Facility Improvement Financing Bill, 2023.

Madam Speaker and Honourable Members, I rise pursuant to Orders No. 123(4) of the Kisumu County Assembly Standing Orders to move a motion that, this House approves a report of the Agriculture, Fisheries, Livestock Development and Irrigation Committee on the Kisumu County Agricultural Facilities Improvement Financing Bill, 2023 (County Assembly Bill No. 9 of 2023)

2. COMMITTAL

Madam Speaker and Honourable Members, the Kisumu County Agricultural Facilities Improvement Financing Bill, 2023 (County Assembly Bill No. 9 of 2023) was read on the floor of this House for the First Time on Wednesday 8th November, 2023, during its afternoon sitting and thereafter referred to the Committee on Agriculture, Fisheries, Livestock Development and Irrigation for detailed scrutiny and consideration.

3. OVERVIEW OF THE BILL (*Ref. Pg. 11 of the Main Report*)

Mr. Speaker and Hon Members, the Bill is structured into four (4) parts, which are outlined as follows:

1. Part I - Preliminary
2. Part II – Administration of County Government Agricultural Entities
3. Part IV - Financial Provisions
4. Part VI – Miscellaneous Provisions

4. PRINCIPLE OBJECTIVE OF THE BILL *(Ref. Pg. 9 of the Main Report)*

The Bill seeks to give effect to Section 5 (1) & 109 (2) (a, b & c) of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012 to declare County Agricultural Facilities as County Entities and to mandate them to retain a percentage of money received by or on behalf of the County Government for purposes of defraying their expense.

It also seek to provide for the Financial Management procedures for accounting and use of money retained by the County Agricultural Entities.

PROCESING AND CONSIDERATION OF THE BILL

5. COMMITTEE MEETINGS *(Ref. Pg. 7 of the Main Report)*

Madam Speaker and Honourable Members, the Committee held five (5) meetings to adopt its program, examine the legislative framework underpinning its preparation and conformity to existing laws, consolidate and deliberate on the Public Submissions and make accurate recommendations for tabling before this Hon. House.

6. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION *(Ref. Pg. 13 of the Main Report)*

Madam Speaker and Honourable Members, in fulfillment of Article 185 (2) and 196 of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010, Section 87 of the County Governments Act, 2012 and Orders No. 123 of the Kisumu County Assembly Standing Orders, the Committee, through the Office of the Clerk placed an advertisement in the print media on Monday, 7th December, 2023 inviting members of the general public to the Public Participation exercise that was conducted on 15th December, 2023 across the Seven (7) Sub-Counties of Kisumu County.

Madam Speaker and Honourable Members, the Bill got a unanimous support across the regions, with members of the public noting that the impact of the County Agricultural Facilities were no longer being felt, exceedingly showing their great hopes that by approval of this Bill should transform the administration, management and operations of the facilities.

7. COMMITTEE OBSERVATIONS FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

(Ref. Pg. 14 to 17 of the Main Report)

Madam Speaker and Honourable Members, after taking into account views and proposals made by Members of the Public and in consideration of our clause by clause review and analysis of the Bill. We have made the following findings and recommendations for consideration by this esteemed House.

PROPOSED PARTS/CLAUSES FOR AMMENDMENT

1. ARRANGEMENT OF CLAUSES

PART 1- PRELIMINARY

THAT Arrangement of Clauses be amended in Clause (6) by deleting the word “Facilities” appearing in the second line and substituting therefore with the word “Entities”

2. CLAUSE 7

THAT Clause 7 be amended: -

- (a) In Sub Clause (1) by inserting the word “Entities” immediately after the word “Agricultural “, appearing in the second line of the paragraph.
- (b) In Sub Clause (2) by inserting the word “Entities” immediately after the word “Agricultural”.

3 CLAUSE 8

The Clause be amended by deleting number (1) appearing immediately before the word “The KCASCOM”

4. CLAUSE 9

THAT Clause 9 be amended by: -

- (a) In the first line of the paragraph by deleting the phrase “Section 9 (1) of this act” and substituting with words “this Section”.
- (b) In the second line of the paragraph by inserting the word “Entities” immediately after the word “Agricultural”.

5. CLAUSE 10 (2)

THAT Clause 10 (2) be amended: -

- (a) In (f) by deleting the entire paragraph and substituting as follow;
“Relevant Sub-County Agricultural/Livestock/Veterinary/Fisheries or Irrigation Officer”
- (b) In (g) by deleting the entire paragraph and substituting therefore with;
“A representative of the area MCA”

6. CLAUSE 11

THAT Clause 11 be amended in Sub Clause (1) by deleting the number “11” appearing immediately before the number “(2)(a)(d) and (e)” and substituting therefore with a new number “10”

7. CLAUSE 12

THAT Clause 12 be amended in Sub Clause (2) by the deleting the words “his office” appearing immediately after the word “resign” and substituting therefore with the words “his/her position”

8. CLAUSE 23

THAT Clause 23 be amended: -

By deleting the number “16” appearing immediately after the word “Section” and substituting therefore with the number “21”

9. CLAUSE 23

The clause be amended by adding sub-clause 23(i) to the uses of the retained funds under uses;

“23 (i) - Payment of allowances for Facility Management Committee Members”

10. CLAUSE 25

THAT Clause 25 be amended: -

(a) In Sub Clause (3) paragraph (b) by inserting the words “of Budget” immediately after the word “controller”

(b) In Sub Clause (5) by inserting the words “of Budget” immediately after the word “controller”

11. FIRST SCHEDULE

THAT First Schedule be amended: -

(a) In Clause (1): -

- i. By inserting the word “Entities” immediately after the word “Agricultural”
- ii. Sub Clause (1) by deleting the entire paragraph and substituting therefore with a new paragraph as follows;

“The first meeting of the Committees shall be convened by the Chairperson and, subsequently, the Committees shall meet once every quarter for the transaction of business at such places and such times as may be decided upon by the Committees.”

- iii. Sub Clause (2) by deleting the word “Chairman” substituted therefore with word “Chairperson”
 - iv. Sub Clause (3) by: -
 - (i) In the first line of the paragraph by deleting the words (Chairman and his) as used respectively and replaced with the words (Chairperson and his/her).
 - (ii) In the last line of the paragraph by inserting the words “and approved by CEC Member for Agriculture” immediately after the word “members”

8. GENERAL RECOMMENDATION *(Ref. Pg. 18 of the Main Report)*

Madam Speaker and Honourable Members, the Assembly to ensure that the County Agricultural Entities are allocated adequate Financial Resources during the Annual Budget and Appropriations to promote development and commercialization of the Agricultural Entities for rapid expansion and dissemination of Technologies, Innovations and Information which can be cascaded to promote the growth and development of the Agriculture Sector in the County.

9. CONCLUSION *(Ref. Pg. 18 of the Main Report)*

Madam Speaker and Honourable Members, I would like to implore this House to deliberate and consider adopting this report with the proposals for amendments contained herein. I, therefore, request Hon Oyoo to second. Thank you.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon Okombo, MCA, Manyatta “B” Ward): Yes, Madam Commissioner.

Hon Oyoo (MCA, Migosi Ward): Thank you Madam Speaker. I stand to second the report because it is going to give direction on prudent management of resources at the County level. I stand to second.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon Okombo, MCA, Manyatta “B” Ward): Honourable Members, a report by the Standing Committee on Agriculture, Fisheries, Livestock Development and Irrigation, on the Adoption of a report on the Kisumu County’s Agricultural Facilities Improvement Financing Bill, 2023, County Assembly Bill. No. 9 of 2023 has been moved by the Deputy Chair, Hon. Bill Oliver on behalf of the Chair, Hon. Eunice Alando, seconded by Hon. Pamela Oyoo, who is a Member of this House Committee. I want to therefore propose a question of debate that the report be open for debate.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon Okombo, MCA, Manyatta “B” Ward): Yes, Hon. James Were.

Hon. Were (MCA, Nyalenda “B” Ward): Thank you, Madam Speaker, I also rise to give my voice into this important Bill, and will only react on the Committee’s observation from the Public Participation. Madam Speaker, we find that there was a unanimous support on the approval of this Bill across all the seven Sub-Counties. That shows that our people are in support of it and have faith that this Bill will address most of the issues that cut across Agriculture and Fisheries Department. Madam Speaker, I want to support this with all the recommendations from this House Committee and proposed amendments. If you look at recommendation number three, which says that the members of the public expressed their deepest belief that the Bill once enacted, will improve the structure and operations of the currently existing agricultural facilities in the County. Madam Speaker, if you travel across Kisumu County in different wards, you find that we have several facilities which are not being utilized, inactive. Madam Speaker, with the introduction of this Bill, it is my belief that we shall have addressed most concerns of our Members. So, Madam Speaker, I want to support, thank you.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon Okombo, MCA, Manyatta “B” Ward): Thank you, Hon. Were.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon Okombo, MCA, Manyatta “B” Ward): Yes, Hon. Reuben Rakwach.

Hon. Rakwach (MCA, East Kolwa Ward): Thank you, Madam Speaker; I equally arise to support the motion. Madam Speaker, we all know that agriculture is the backbone of our economy and that Agriculture has employed several members of this republic. So, matters of Agriculture must be given the focus that it deserves because we know that without agriculture, our economy cannot move Hon. Speaker. Therefore, I support this report plus the amendments that have been proposed, thank you.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Okombo MCA, Manyatta B Ward): Thank you Hon. Rakwach. Hon. Bennie Oiko Pete.

Hon. Oiko (MCA, Kabonyo/Kanyagwal Ward): Madam Speaker, I also want to give my little contribution on this report. The Kisumu County Agricultural Facilities Improvement Financing Bill. That is money that will be collected by agricultural entities in Kisumu County, remitted into the County Revenue Account and they also remain with some for their use. That is what this Bill entails.

Madam Speaker, it is very essential that we pass this Bill and this is because the Agricultural Entities in Kisumu have suffered a lot when money was being collected and taken to the central account and they were getting nothing in return. The Agricultural Mechanization Service Station at Rabuor; the tractors collapsed yet money was being collected. The money was coming to the central office that is the finance and no money was being ploughed back to those revenue entities. All the tractors which are there collapsed. Members of the public suffered because the services which were being offered by these tractors was very good, they were offering services at subsidized rates and this was convenient for the farmers. However, when it happened that the

money that had been collected could not be ploughed back to do services such as repairing the tractors, Madam Speaker, the tractors got grounded.

Madam Speaker, when this Bill come to force, it will improve the services of the mechanization office and I hope the common farmer in Kisumu County will benefit.

Madam Speaker, Maseno Agricultural Training Center is a very old entity where our fathers and grandfathers who never went to school were trained on matters of agriculture. In the years of 1970s 1980s and 1960s when Maseno was an Agricultural Training Center, farming was doing well in Kisumu County. I remember in the 1970s, my father was a man who never went to school and there was an Agricultural Extension Officer who brought for him some agricultural cassava seeds and they did so well, Madam Speaker these are people who never went to school properly. Of late, Maseno Agricultural Training Center has been dying. I am happy that some little amount has been put into the budget to revive Maseno ATC. I was hearing about some Kshs 17 Million that has been allocated for that course. Now, when the management at Maseno will be allowed to collect money, I hope the training center will come back to life and the common farmers in Kisumu County will be taken there for an Agricultural training. This will be a plus because it will improve the peasant farming in the villages.

Madam Speaker, Mamboleo Slaughterhouse where the cows are being slaughtered for our meat has also been condemned to be dirty because all the monies that is being collected is taken to the Central Account of the County Government and nothing goes back and there has been an outcry. Madam Speaker, when the management there is improved and they will now have their money to do one or two things, to improve the facility, that one will be a plus.

This Bill is a good one and we should pass it so that we improve these facilities in our County. I support.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Okombo MCA, Manyatta “B” Ward): Thank you Hon. Pete.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Okombo MCA, Manyatta “B” Ward): Yes, The Leader of Majority Hon. Kennedy Ooko.

Leader of Majority (Hon. Ooko, MCA, Ahero Ward): Thank you Hon. Speaker Madam Speaker I want to remind you of my name, my name is not Kennedy Ouko but Kennedy Ooko.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Okombo MCA, Manyatta “B” Ward): Order!! Leader of Majority. I said Hon. Kennedy Ooko.

Leader of Majority (Hon. Ooko, MCA, Ahero Ward): Madam Speaker, you are still wrong it is Ooko. I stand to join Hon. Oiko in supporting this Bill, our agricultural facilities have been faced with management problems. If you look at Maseno ATC and tractors in Rabuor, they have been

poorly managed. By putting these amendments in place, they will help us have these provisions in line with the PFM Act which is very important in management of this entities.

Madam Speaker, there is an aspect that is very important that I have read in the Bill that is now authorizing entities to retain a certain percentage for their immediate use. You will realize that even the entity we have at Rabuor, when there is a tire burst, they have to make a requisition to the Department of Finance and ICT and that will take a lot of time. With this Bill, by retaining a certain percentage of funds collected will help them to meet their immediate expenses and that will improve their efficiency.

Hon. Speaker, the bureaucracy that we have in this County, even getting a refund from the Department of Finance and ICT has not been very easy but, I believe that this Bill will help us address the bureaucracy and improve management.

Lastly, with the improved management of these entities, I believe that it will promote agricultural growth in this county which is a very important aspect in the development of this County. Otherwise, thank you.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Okombo MCA, Manyatta “B” Ward): Thank you Hon. Leader of Majority.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Okombo MCA, Manyatta “B” Ward): Yes Hon. Deputy Leader of Majority.

Deputy Leader of Majority (Hon. Lumumba, MCA, South East Nyakach Ward): Thank you Madam Speaker. Much as I arise to support the Bill, allow me to also give my sentiments with regards to the Bill.

Madam Speaker, this Bill is okay but there are a lot to be done so as to actualize whatever has been recommended in the Bill. Personally, I come from an area where we grow small scale coffee and we want to expand and do avocado which will also require some value addition. I am aware that the County Government of Kisumu is trying to support the initiative. One of the good things they have done is, they have repaired the tractors for plowing. But, that is not enough if we do not give attractive cost of plowing. At the moment, the market price for plowing is four thousand per acre yet the County Government of Kisumu is offering the farmers at three thousand per acre which is not enough. We really need to give or show that we want our farmers to produce more. And, that requires motivation and incentives by availing the plowing machines to make it attractive to the farmers. Otherwise, I support the Bill, thank you.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Okombo MCA, Manyatta “B” Ward): Thank you Deputy Leader of Majority Hon. Owade, I am sure that your concerns will be sufficiently addressed by the Regulation that shall be put in place once the Bill has been adopted and assented to into an Act.

So, I believe that the operationalization measures are left for the Regulations to specify. So your concerns are well taken care of. Thank you.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Okombo MCA, Manyatta “B” Ward): Yes Hon. Matara.

Hon. Nancy Vivienne Matara (Nominated MCA): Thank you Madam Speaker, I wish to call the mover to reply.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Okombo MCA, Manyatta “B” Ward): Honourable Members, I am actually not seeing anyone on his/her feet to give his/her submission, I therefore want to call the mover to reply.

Hon. Bill Oliver (MCA, Kobura): Thank you Madam Speaker, I wish to thank the Hon. Members for contributing towards this motion and I believe that the motion is going to be passed.

Madam Speaker, the Bill provides a framework of how all the entities are going to be run and all the committees and their membership. We have had challenges for long as a County in managing these facilities and I am happy if this motion passes, then it is going to help these facilities to become entities and the moment they become entities, they can now have their own finances to run the facilities. Some of these facilities like the one in Rabuor have good idea but without this Bill then it is not going to work.

Madam Speaker and Honourable Members, I also want to support Hon. Owade who has talked about the machines and the charges that the department has currently put in place from Kshs. 4,500 to Kshs. 3,600. I believe that after the adoption of this Bill it is going to help this County because from that point we can discuss the prices and how we are going to make the prices lower for our people. Thank you.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Okombo MCA, Manyatta “B” Ward): Honourable Members, a report of Agriculture, Livestock Development, Fisheries and Irrigation Committee on its consideration of the Kisumu County Agricultural Facility Improvement Financing Bill, 2023 (County Assembly Bill, No. 9 of 2023) has been moved, seconded and debated upon, I therefore want to put a question on the adoption of the same.

(Question put and agreed to)

The Deputy Speaker (Hon. Okombo MCA, Manyatta “B” Ward): Honourable Members, the report of the Standing committee of Agriculture, Livestock Development, Fisheries and Irrigation on its consideration of the Kisumu County Agricultural Facility Improvement Financing Bill, 2023 (County Assembly Bill, No. 9 of 2023) is hereby adopted today
