**Speaker (Hon. Elijah Omondi):** Order Hon. Members. I want to call upon the Clerk to put us through the order paper of the day.

**Speaker (Hon. Elijah Omondi):** Hon. James Were

**Hon. James Were:** Thank you Mr. Speaker, I rise to give a notice of motion on the upgrading of sporting and recreational facilities in the County.

Speaker (Hon. Elijah Omondi): Any other notices of motion? Next order.

**STATEMENT**

**Hon. Caroline Owen:** Mr. Speaker this morning when I came, I found in the list of Members where I was listed a Minority Chief Whip I have been replaced by another Member. I am seeking for clarification on this because I have not received any letter on the changes and the speaker was supposed to give a ruling on this.

**Speaker (Hon. Elijah Omondi):** Chair of privileges. Yes Hon. Benta can you address the concern of Hon. Caroline Owen?

**Hon. Benta Ogola:** Thank you Mr. Speaker, I am not aware but given time I will be able to find out.

**Speaker (Hon. Elijah Omondi):** Hon. Joshua Auko, do you have any information concerning Minority Whip.

**Hon. Joshua Auko:** Thank you Mr. Speaker, as far as I am concerned at this particular moment, it is the first time I am hearing such information.

**Hon. Moses Ochele:** A point of information Mr. Speaker?

**Speaker (Hon. Elijah Omondi):** Granted

**Hon. Moses Ochele:** Thank you Mr. Speaker. I think you should not take such information in this house lightly. Mr. Speaker, it is you who presided over the swearing in of Hon. Joshua Auko as Minority Leader and Eddy Anayo as Minority Whip. I raised a concern which you promised to give a ruling on Thursday so by throwing it to the privilege Chair I do not think it is appropriate. If her position has been taken then it is upon the chair of the whole house to tell us.

**Hon. Samuel Ongow:** Mr. Speaker, I find it very interesting the way we are moving. It was just last week we talked about proper legal matters and today in the morning the matter came up and you said it was resolved. Based on what Hon. Caroline Owen has just said and you are now directing it to another committee, it is not logical unless there is something which should not be known in this house.

**Hon. Isaya Onyango:** Mr. Speaker, if I got Hon. Owen right, you said you were going to give a ruling on the matter today but when she came, she found her name where it is not supposed to be without explanations. She was not there in the morning so what she is asking is whether you made a ruling.

**Hon. Caroline Owen:** I want to say that the name is in the right place but I have no title. So if this house cannot protect the minority then I may be forced to look for protection outside this house and I cannot be treated as some second hand thing. I want to know my position right now so that I can know what next step to take.

**Speaker (Hon. Elijah Omondi):** Hon. Members, it is unfortunate where we are and that is the key position of the matter that as Hon. Ochele has put it, administration of oaths was witnessed in this house. It was administered that Hon. Joshua Auko was elected by their PDP party as Minority Leader and the same PDP Members elected Hon. Philip Edwin Anayo as their Minority Whip and they were sworn in effectively replacing you.

**Hon. Caroline Owen:** I want to seek for advice that any seat that has been given to a member must be vacated first before it is given to another member. It is only in this house someone was sworn in my seat when I was still the sitting whip. My question is coming together as a coalition, members come together and share seats that were given, a seat that was given cannot be taken away by the leader of another party. My letter of last week was very categorical when I said there was no way a leader of PDP can come and take my seat and I am not a member of that party. I got the seat on basis of small parties in the coalition unless this is changed, I need to be properly advised.

**Speaker (Hon. Elijah Omondi):** Hon. Ogosi

**Hon. Aggrey Ogosi:** This is a house of rules and procedures and whatever we are seeing in this house we must take them seriously. Our standing order is very clear, I have really restrained myself from talking about this matter but today allow me to say this, that what has been happening on the seat of a minority whip has been an illegality from the time we began this Assembly. This is why we must do things the right way. What does the law say, even if it is a matter that is not provided in our standing order and you are forced to make a ruling, you must make a ruling based on a number of things not because you are in the chair. I do not want to repeat what Hon. Ochele had said in this house, but it is clear, let us not pull back and say the Minority as stipulated in this standing order is PDP not any other. Let us call a spade a spade not a big spoon. I think that it is time we need to move as an Assembly.

**Hon. Moses Ochele:** Further information?

**Speaker (Hon. Elijah Omondi):** Granted

**Hon. Moses Ochele:** Thank you Mr. Speaker. I think we are wasting a lot of time which had been resolved by clear provision of law. If you are talking of Cord Coalition then in Kisumu County we would not be talking of any minority Mr. Speaker. If it is true that PDP and LPK formed a coalition with ODM then all these could have been treated as one but since PDP detached themselves from Cord then we know that PDP has never entered into any coalition with majority party. The complainant is a single member in this house. She belongs to the smallest party. If Hon. Owen wants to defend her seat, let her bring a copy of correspondence which they entered with PDP otherwise the status in this house is that PDP is the second largest in the house not LPK. Thank you.

**Speaker (Hon. Elijah Omondi):** Hon. Okiri

**Hon. Paul Okiri:** Mr. Speaker, it seems you are enjoying this game but today you should put this matter, to rest. It is not the first time the Hon. Anayo who claims to be the party leader of PDP mentioned in this house that LPK and PDP are in coalition and it is in the hansard. These are some things we should understand clearly. We do not want you to dance in their tune, please put this matter to end.

**Hon. Samuel Ongow:** Mr. Speaker, as much as Hon. Ogosi and Ochele have talked referring to law which we do not even know where they got it from, the two who have just talked seemed to know more about parties and their coalitions but this matter is not ODMs. This house is not going to be taken for a ride, not by the speaker or anybody else. It is in records when Anayo said they had a coalition and the member was elected based on that coalition. It is not right for members of that party to joke around with the minds of Hon. Members in this house that they can talk about coalition any time they like. Thank you.

**Hon. Gabriel Ochieng:** Thank you Mr. Speaker. I want to agree with what Hon. Ongow has said, this house should be taken seriously. It is the PDP who tabled the election of Hon. Caroline Owen and she has enjoyed all those privileges and I want you to make a ruling so that the PDP should stop enjoying this house, we are serious in this house. Let the PDP leaders be charged because we cannot agree to be tossed around with their elections. Give us a ruling that is going to guide this house.

**Hon. Prisca Misachi:** Mr. Speaker, thank you for allowing me to talk because they are matters touching parties which should be dealt with outside this house. I once brought such matters in this house when the ODM party sat somewhere and removed Prisca Auma who is myself in all the committees in the house. I was referred to ODM as a party. Everybody here belongs to a party. Let us deal with parties at party level. Thank you

**Speaker (Hon. Elijah Omondi):** Hon. Olum

**Hon. Osumba Olum:** Thank you Mr. Speaker for choosing me. This matter was raised here by the same member and you said you were to rule over the matter even though there was a lot of illegality. I have been watching how members behave since some leadership was changed in this house. Some member enjoy changing leadership and we are not going to allow PDP to

intimidate us. You cannot vote equal and say you have succeed e.g when there is a tie in the vote. Thank you.

**Chief Whip (Hon. Isaya Onyango):** Thank you Mr. Speaker. I can see the way Hon. Members have a lot of passion to contribute on something unprocedural on a statement which has now been turned to a motion that we are debating on. I want to say it is true you can see the mood of this house and I want to ask you kindly to take the two parties PDP and LPK and listen to their problem and find a way of solving it. The way that election was a bit strange so I feel you should give this house away forward.

**Speaker (Hon. Elijah Omondi):** Thank you Hon. Members, what Hon. Isaya has said true we should not invite the contribution of this house because of party issues and I therefore direct that the parties concerned we will have a meeting at Speaker's office tomorrow at 9.00 am so that we have a common ground. Otherwise that confusion should not be brought here. Order, Order Caroline Owen, Order. Next, Hon. Oyugi Were!

**Hon. Oyugi Were:** Thank you Mr. Speaker. I want to move a motion on upgrading of sporting/recreational facilities in the county.

Mr. Speaker, Kisumu County has the best sporting facilities – Jomo Kenyatta sports ground and Moi stadium. Mr. Speaker, if these two facilities are put in good condition, then the County can fetch money in terms of revenue.

Mr. Speaker, Moi stadium was recently upgraded by the world football federation FIFA to the tune of 50 million fitted with artificial turf but it is not fully utilized for lack of flood lights to facilitate night games, lack of strong perimeter fence to protect the players from fans and training grounds to prevent the turf from wearing out so fast. Mr. Speaker, Jomo Kenyatta grounds is also facing almost similar problem. There is total darkness, the football pitch is in pathetic situation and no enough water to maintain the grass and lowers.

Mr. Speaker, it is this background that I really request this honorable house to consider deliberating on this matter to save these two facilities and promote sports in this county of Kisumu hence more revenue generation. Mr. Speaker, let us improve our facilities to attract users, a case in point is, the County managed to raise a total of Kshs. 300,000 in a single Gor Mahia and Ushuru game. If we can secure more games in Kisumu then we are sure of netting more revenue.

Mr. Speaker, Moi Stadium requires a reinforced perimeter fence to keep the spectators at bay, and Mr. Speaker, as the fans enjoy their game the county enjoys the revenue and their security must be maximum. I therefore plead with this house to consider debating on this to help fix the state of sporting dream in Kisumu County and the county to think about fixing a new field for our athletes for field and truck events.

Mr. Speaker, this should be extended to all our sub counties. The Lake Victoria Management Board that is managing Jomo Kenyatta sports ground has failed the county in terms of maintaining the facility. Mr. Speaker, this facility should be reverted back to the County or the management board should be changed. I therefore request Hon. Willis Ogunyoye to second.

Hon. Willis Ogunyio: Thank you Mr. Speaker. I stand to second the motion as read by Hon. Oyugi Were on sports facilities. Many a times we have been complain of revenue for this particular account and in several revenue estimates, I have seen some sports financial in puts in some areas and it should be to us as a County to improve these sports activities so that we are able to get more funds as explained by my able mover Hon. James Oyugi Were. If this thing is done, several sports facilities will also be done elsewhere but within the County where sports are needed. I remember there are a lot of sporting facilities even in Muhoroni Town where you find they require a lot of improvement. If they are improved, several of our youths will be able to access facilities. I therefore wish to support this motion that is before the house. Thank you.

(Hon. Elijah (Speaker) leaves the flow and requests Hon. Ochele to hold brief)

Speaker (Hon. Moses Ochele): Hon. Members, the motion on upgrading of sporting and recreational facilities in the County has been moved by Hon. Oyugi Were and has been seconded by Hon. Willis Ogunyio Mindeu. I now propose a question that this motion be debated upon.

Hon. Samuel Ongow: Mr. Speaker, before we deliberate on this, the mover talked of the two areas which require upgrading within the city but the seconder went ahead and mentioned places like Muhoroni Town so which is which?

Speaker (Hon. Moses Ochele): Hon. Member of Nyangoma, read up to the last motion of the mover, he said the matter should be spread to other sporting facilities within the County.

Hon. Willis Ogunyio Mindeu: Mr. Speaker maybe I ought to have said including Masogo Nyangoma so that he is happy. (Laughter)

Hon. Caroline Owen: I want to support this motion because it is true our sporting facilities are in a state of repair and some of them are neglected and even abandoned Mr. Speaker. I want to say that Kisumu as a County in the City we are quite lucky and so many people are looking on to us in terms of facilities, in terms of class and Mr. Speaker, it is true that if you look at Moi stadium, there was money put to uplift it but a lot still needs to be done. We need to have an ultramodern stadium. Even in the Sub- Counties, a case in point is Ogada Stadium. It remain Ogada Stadium by name. It has never been utilized even though year in year out money has been put a side for construction/upgrading. Mr. Speaker, implementation has been a problem. I want to say stadium or sporting facilities must be taken as a priority of the County so that even the ones I have mentioned here become a priority of the County that money is set aside not by the wards but by the County itself. The Ministry of sports must take this seriously because we want to develop talent. Where do our children practice, where do they play? Do we have training facilities for them? Do we have anything that can attract high level leagues or competition? If this happens we will be able to attract international category of Sports. Recently we had devolution conference in Kisumu even though we thought we would not be able to contain, you saw what it did to our County. If we have similar facilities that can attract high level sports, our County will be able to gain revenue and our children will be able to have decent places to develop their talents. I want to say that this County should make it a reality in order to develop

and this can be done through budgeting wisely and adequately so I want to support this motion and urge members to do the same. Thank you.

Speaker (Hon. Moses Ochele): Hon. Khan

Hon Aslam Khan: Thank you very much Mr. Speaker. I rise to support this motion. It is pathetic that we do not even have water to make sure our grass grow. The main idea behind sports ground like Jomo Kenyatta was to make health facility attainable for hospitality but interestingly, after taking few years it is deteriorating. Mr. Speaker, you will find that most of these places at night they become very dark and this is the free time for most people even to go for exercise. If they engage themselves in these sports activities, they will even reduce the issue of night theft in this County. It is interested to know that the City Park stadium which is situated in industrial area works 24hrs daily. Anytime you go there you find different types of activities taking place. I would request the mover who had very noble idea in bringing this motion that they could have included a gym facility. We only have one in Social Centre but it is not up to date. If this gym can be introduced at Moi Stadium, it will go a long way for us to introduce talents. I remember when I was a young man in this city, Majority of us would represent others teams to Africa Cups, World Cup in table tennis, netball and others. Mr. Speaker, the Kisumu County has talent of football and we want to nature them so that we ensure that we have them in Kisumu.

Finally before I sit, it is my humble request through this house and through this motion to consider in further that if we are going to have another facility, let us name it Jaramogi Oginga Odinga because already we have Moi and Jomo Kenyatta. He is the only legend in this region and I wonder why he was left out when he was one person who was keen on sports. With those few remarks, I support. Thank you.

Hon. Lydia Odhiambo: Thank you Mr. Speaker. I also rise to support the motion before us and indeed I want to thank the mover who is a diehard of football for having brought this particular motion. I want to say this, our Moi Stadium has been improved and now is not in a very bad position and in the recent past we have had chains of games where we have our Kogalo which is our role model team, during the game, the town was green, there was a lot of booming businesses and I believe if we really take care of this stadium and even the rest which have been mentioned within the sub- county, then we shall go to high levels in terms of businesses and source of income even for the youths. I believe there are very many people who are going to get job opportunities and Kisumu is going to go to very high levels. It has been noted here that when it approaches evening, it is dark in town and if we light the town, I am sure we are going to have a lot of security. Most of the time we have had challenges in the security because of darkness. I also want to support this motion because when all these are done and it is in a good standard, it will boost our revenue. I want to as the mover that even if we are looking at the lighting, perimeter wall, water, we should also leave to the fact that the dumpsite which is next to the stadium is an ISO and in the event that we want to look at the standard of the field, we should also consider the health of those who will be coming there. We should consider how the dumpsite can be removed so that we are complete otherwise I support the motion and I also

request that whatever committee this particular motion will be directed to, let us speedy it up and ensure that all that have been deliberated here is implemented. Thank you.

Speaker (Moses Ochele): Hon. Caroline Agwanda!

Hon. Caroline Agwanda: Thank you Mr. Speaker. I also support this motion. If you look at the current stadiums or sporting facilities in the County, you will find that they are not accessible to PWDs and I therefore recommend that when the upgrading of these facilities are going to be done we need to ensure that they are accessible to PWDs in the County and this will also attract international or Paralympics for PWDs to come to Kisumu County. If that is done we are going to have increased revenue. If we do this, we will have to have signs for people with different impairment to get information. I therefore say it is a good motion and supports it. Thank you.

Hon. Prisca Auma: Thank you Mr. Speaker. I want to say that once upon a time I was representing the stadium and we are lucky that it was not among the stadiums that were for the study by the former president Moi and former Mayor Joe Aketch because if it went that direction, it was not going to be under our management as a county, it was going to be managed by parastatal body then. The stadium as was seen earlier was to put an account where debt collections are done then there is a percentage of floodlights, the money was to go to the account direct but it was overlooked but I believe, looking at the motion, and if we want to improve our stadium, then we better operationalize this account so that whatever percentage that will be agreed by the KUP management goes direct to that floodlight account. I also want to say that we must improve other sporting facilities which can accommodate people and develop it to the nature of the Moi Stadium. Kenyatta Sports Ground is never a stadium and as a County we must think of how we can manage a proper stadium so that we also accommodate international matches which can bring revenue to us. I support the motion.

Speaker (Hon. Moses Ochele): May I now be gender sensitive. Hon. Samuel.

Hon. Samuel Ongow: Thank you Mr. Speaker. As I rise to support this motion I also have the following comments. This is a good motion however my colleagues and the mover should also take some of my comments positively. Some of these motions we are bringing should be brought after a thorough research so that anybody who would be looking at it can also see that we are discussing serious issues. The other day if I remember, we had a motion discussing street lights in the city today it is about sporting facilities. This should be a very important motion but all we talk about is during Moi's times at whose false so that we can now start discussing about the talents that we can do better and nurture our talents like boxing, and we cover it to the entire County to other areas. A part from maintaining the facilities which are there we need to incorporate more sporting activities by encouraging those who are in up countries to join sports. We are aware there are so many people who are interested in games but they lack facilities in the rural areas it therefore means that if this is introduced in our Sub Counties then people will be encouraged. If you go to our neighbouring County like Nandi, the sporting activities is a major talent and we believe that if this is done well in our County it can yield employment of our people and a lot of talents can be achieved. Thank you.

Hon. Simba Opepo: Thank you Mr. Speaker. I rise to support this motion. This is a region where talented youths are upcoming on sports especially football and you find old members of football once they retire they do not come back to encourage the youths. When you look at the facilities of the Moi stadium, it has been there for time memorial without improvement, not even good perimeter wall and no lights and water. I know if we have improved facilities, our youth will be able to achieve the talent they want Mr. Speaker. The teams of football, netball and volley ball should be encouraged to join other tournaments to keep the pace moving. I support.

Hon. Petronila Omondi: Thank you Mr. Speaker. I want to support this motion having looked at the background of sports. In sports, we do not only look at the benefits of improving the facilities. When we look at our facilities and the current condition, it explains a lot about our health situation and it also explains a lot about our relationship and as you know in Kenya we are about forty tribes and without sporting activities where we come together and get to appreciate one another, it becomes very difficult so I would say that I support this motion because we will have a lot of benefit if we have these facilities. This will help people to come out and play, and when people play there is a lot of activities going on and that for sure if we take things seriously within no time we shall have our health budget come down. I really support this and I hope when this is done well we shall have enough sporting facilities which will support us and we shall come out to play. Thank you.

Speaker (Hon. Moses Ochele): Allow me to give chance to Minority Leader.

Hon. Joshua Auko (Minority Leader): Thank you Mr. Speaker for this opportunity. I also want to support this motion to the fact that sports is an economic improvement to this County and I would say that when we have good sporting facilities this will even go as far as attracting churches in this County that can attract International agents that can come and preach the gospel and I stand to support the motion.

Speaker (Hon. Moses Ochele): My good Deputy Majority Leader, kindly take the floor.

Hon. James Omolo: Thank you Mr. Speaker. I want to support this motion and indeed I think it is upon this Assembly to decide what is should be done to Jomo Kenyatta Grounds and Moi Stadium. We should also be consistence in terms of training both Netball and Football and as we improve our facilities let us also be seen having interest towards the games. This motion could have been very broad in terms of capturing in the County. We have several sports that are going to waste because of identification and it is upon this Assembly to start thinking in that line. It could come even as a different motion so that the talents of young boys and girls who are willing can join. Thank you.

Speaker (Hon. Moses Ochele): Hon. Kadede

Hon. John Kadede: Thank you Mr. Speaker. I also stand to support this motion. Mr. Speaker, if you look at the football of today, there is no “Bob Ogola” in terms of experience and if there is no form of training, everything goes down. We should have been talking of more facilities not only one but that is where we are today. I also heard what one of the Hon. Member said, it is important also to enlarge the facilities instead of just improving them. If we want to capture the

talent in this region we must do something about our facilities. We should improve what we have here as sports wing in indoor games which are important as well. I hope who ever will be assigned to do this job will do it well including budget for indoor games. Thank you.

Hon. Faridah Ahmed: Thank you Mr. Speaker. I also rise to support this motion and thank the mover for remembering these facilities which are very important sources of revenue generation in the County. Mr. Speaker, this motion is coming at a very good time now that we are analyzing the budget. And if you look at the budget, I read at what was allocated for the stadium in particular. It was 4.5 million and it stated repair. According to this motion, we want to be specific, what are we targeting in terms of facilities? Like if you look at Moi Stadium, it still needs a lot of upgrading and 4.5 million is a drop in the ocean. I want to challenge the committee that is in charge to make sure that the amount is revised upwards because we want seriousness in these facilities. If you go to the stadium, the sanitation block is a challenge, security and terraces is a very good challenge. In need terraces which are properly put up not chairs which can be havoc when there is misunderstanding in the field and even for the lives of fans who go there is taken care of. All understand that our fans can always go out of order whenever there is a riot. We do not want to give them ready weapon. Even Jomo Kenyatta Grounds is strategically located and any facility without maintenance we will be investing a lot of money but gradually we will realize that the money we had investment do not actually meet our requirement. In the second last paragraph, I support the extension to all our County because we want to promote all the sporting activities in the whole County and we want to decongest the stadium and reserve it for big matches which also generates big money. I support this motion and therefore rest my case.

Chief Whip (Hon. Isaya Onyango): I want to support this motion. The mover of the motion had very good intention although he failed to make connections and the bill was not actually brought at the right time because when we are talking about sporting facilities, we are talking about how to encourage our young people to be sportsmen. Today sports activities is bring a lot of income to our individuals. If you go to Rift Valley, they are doing very well. In Western, they are also doing well in football activities but if you come to Kisumu County, we have unique activities like those who are running at night (laughter). As we improve the facilities, we also need to have other stadiums in other places. If you go back to early 60s, Kisumu Boys used to give us a lot of players and most of them were Gor Mahia players. If we can have a college where we nurture the talent of our youths, I think as a County we will be a mile forward because we will also be creating jobs. Let us talk about how we can enhance sports in Kisumu County and Nyanza as a whole. I will suggest that we must put enough money for sports in our budget to start doing these things we are talking about. We should also do something that will encourage them to work harder. I will ask the mover of this motion that it was late that we could not amend it but we will require them to include other activities in order to nurture the talent of our youths. It is high time we put money on sports that would also enhance our revenue. We cannot just wake up one day and say we want to have a good stadium when you do not plan for it. Let us move together and allow for improvement of these facilities. Thank you.

Hon. Jane Omolo: May I take this opportunity to thank the mover of this motion. It is timely because even right now we are really busy doing a lot of practice but the challenge is the ground where we are doing practice. The field require renovation and it should be urgent that it is put in a good condition.

Speaker (Hon. Moses Ochele): We are in a stalemate, somebody to break the stalemate.

Hon. Susan Omolo: Thank you Mr. Speaker for giving me this opportunity to say a word. I want to call the mover to reply.

Speaker (Hon. Moses Ochele): Yes the mover, Hon. James Oyugi Were, Hon. Member for Nyalenda B. And before you go on, you should give room to any committee who will be taking it up thereafter to go beyond the boundaries you have mentioned.

Hon. James Oyugi Were: Thank you Mr. Speaker for the information. I want to take this opportunity to thank Hon. Members for having contributed wisely towards this motion and I also want to thank Members who challenged me and I say that I welcome all the responses. There was a talent search which therefore informed my motion but we do not have good facilities which can help them nurture their talents. Mr. Speaker, I know we have several facilities in this County but they require upgrade and as such, some of members did suggest about fitting even the laying ground in all parts of the County, putting up a gym and Mr. Speaker, this is a noble I dea that we are open to and if it can be done, it is going to generate a lot of money. For example, if you want to take 50 Hon. Members in a gym that will cost a lot of money and hence revenue. Am open to the suggestions and it will be upon your discretion Mr. Speaker to choose which Committee will take up the matter and I want to thank you all for the wealthy contributions. Last year December, I managed to take 2 young boys to Chemelil football club because we have a small talent search in Nyanyalenda and if we can encourage more activities like that I think Kisumu will move forward, we will have many of Denis Oliech, Lupita Nyongo and Mariga. Thank you.

Speaker (Hon. Moses Ochele): Thank you Hon. James Were. Hon. Members, the motion has been properly debated by all of you and I say thank you. The motion has been moved, seconded, discussed and replied upon your concerns. May I now put a question that the motion on upgrading of sporting/recreational facilities in the county be adopted by this house.

(Question put and agreed upon).

May I now take this opportunity to commit this serious motion to the Committee of Children, Culture, Sports and Community Services and we expect a comprehensive report in two weeks time so chair of that committee, take time and let the house get report as requested.
