- ✓ **SUPPLEMENTARY BUDGET FOR THE FY 2014/2015 (2ND AND 3RD READING)**

Mr. Speaker (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): Yes Chair of Budget and appropriation committee.

Hon. Willies Mindeu (Chairman Of Budget And Appropriation committee): I rise to give a notice of motion which I have given Earlier that the Supplementary Budget for the FY 2014|2015 read for the 2nd and 3rd time, but before I do so Mr. Speaker sir, I have a report related to the Supplementary Budget which I want this House to hear it and adopt it, Mr. Speaker you are all aware that the Supplementary Budget in the first meeting was read for the first time in this

House and it was committed to the Budget and Appropriation committee and as a committee we discuss it and therefore I want to give the following report on the same and the report goes as follows.

Mr. Speaker, Chapter 11 of the constitution has placed significance responsibility of County Government and indeed the County Assembly over the management of public resources. County Assembly has in particular received enhanced responsibility with regard to the County budget making process and Approval. Article 224 of the constitution has mandated County Government to prepare and adopt its own annual Budget and Appropriation Bill in the form and According to the procedure prescribed in the Public fiancé management Act 2012. The Act contemplates a committee of the County Assembly to oversight the Budget process. In this regard, the Interim County Assembly Orders adopted by this House establishes the County Budget and Appropriation committee in its standing Order no. 187 with specific mandate among which is to:

1. Investigate, inquire into and report on all matters related to coordination, control and monitoring of the County Budget.
2. Discuss and review the estimates and the recommendation to the County Assembly.
3. Examine the county Budget, policy paper presented to the County Assembly.
4. Examine Bills related to the County Budget including Appropriation Bill, And
5. Evaluate tax estimate, economic and budgeting policies and programs with direct budget outlay.

Mr. Speaker, in line with the provision of the constitution the Budget estimates and related documents for the two arms of the County Government namely, County Assembly and County Executive were submitted to the Assembly on 30th April 2014 as required by the public Finance Act, 2012. The Budget and Appropriation committee was required to discuss and review the estimates and make recommendation to the County Assembly for recommendation.

Mr. Speaker,

The Budget and Appropriation committee as currently constituted comprises of the following members

Mr. Speaker,

The committee scrutinized the Supplementary estimates for the County Assembly and the executive and has made a number of recommendations to this House.

- 1) That the document be properly paged for easy reference.
- 2) Information has contained in page 33 (staff establishment details) does not make sense since the years in reference and also the total shown are out of place. The page should be reviewed.
- 3) Information on medical cover could not be ascertained to cover all staff within the County including staff seconded to the County Assembly. The information be availed for clarification.
- 4) Under the General Administration and planning, salary and wedges approved as Kshs 59,926,840 and reduced in the supplementary to Kshs 54,673,842 but not backed by supporting document, at the same time gratuity which as a factor of the wages and salary remains unchanged at Kshs 800,000. There is no certainty on the reduction of wedges and salaries.
- 5) Under the County Assembly Budget, the pending Bills be reduced from Kshs 8 million to Kshs 4million and the saving be reallocated to increase :
 - i. General Supplies paper etc by Kshs 2million
 - ii. Fuel and lubricant by Kshs 1million
 - iii. Contracted guards by Kshs 1million
6. That Kshs 300,000,000 budgeted for the construction of Ultra-modern Assembly be re-allocated to ward Development and shared equally among the wards.

Mr. Speaker

All adjustments that are done in the supplementary Budget estimates are not expected to change the ceiling but the difference will be financed by cost saving in the Budget. The committee therefore requests this House to resolve as follows;

1. Adopt this report
2. That the Proposed amendments to the Proposed supplementary Budget of F/Y 2014-2015 be adopted and,

3. The Schedules of the development projects for implementation between February 2015 to June 2015 be adopted

It is therefore my pleasant duty and privilege, on behalf of the committee of Budget and Appropriation committee to table this report and recommend it to the House for adoption, thank you. And I would request my vise to second the report.

Speaker, Hon. Gabriel Ochieng: Yes Hon. Petronilla.

Hon. Petronilla Omondi: I rise to second the report of the Budget and appropriation committee that has just been read before us thank you.

Hon. Willies Mindeu (Chairman of Budget and Appropriation committee): Mr. Speaker sir having requested for the seconder, I therefore request that the FY 014|2015 supplementary budget be read for the (2nd and 3rd), thank you Mr. Speaker.

Speaker, Hon. Gabriel Ochieng: I want to say this Hon. Members, the report that The Char Of Budget and Appropriation Committee has just read is going to affect the Supplementary Budget while we will be doing the Amendments that why he has read it and I want to pose a question because it has been seconded by the Vise Chair of Budget and Appropriation committee and I propose the Question that it can be disused, and then when we come to the committee of the whole House or the committee of Supply the Changes that you will have propose will take effect on the Supplementary Budget, so I want to propose the Question that the report that have been read be conjoined with the Supplementary Budget for the FY 2014|2014 be discussed, thank you.

Hon. Members: (Silence).

Speaker, Hon. Gabriel Ochieng: It seems that you are contented with the report and we can continue, so Hon. Mindeu you have the duty to reply because it seems that the Members are contented with the report, yes Hon. Khan I can see you are up.

Hon. Aslam Khan: Thank you Mr. Speaker, I just wanted a clarification from the Budget and Appropriation Chairman. In the report that he has just read item no.4 page 4 it talks of Kshs 54,673,842 but cannot be backed by supporting documents. Mr. Speaker I fail to understand that if we want to discuss the Monies in this Hon. House that we are going to appropriate and spend, will it be in order to discuss something that we are not sure of and cannot be backed with any supporting document, thank you.

Speaker, Hon. Gabriel Ochieng: Yes Hon. Chair Budget and Appropriation committee.

Hon. Willies Mindeu (Chairman of Budget and Appropriation committee): Thank you Very Much Mr. Speaker, I want to be very clear here, the committee sat and discussed this matter and we realized that there was a deviation of figure and that's why we adjusted the figure appropriately to conform to what is there, thank you Mr. Speaker.

Speaker, Hon. Gabriel Ochieng: Yes Hon. Majority Leader.

Majority Leader (Hon. Samuel Ong'ow): Mr. Speaker sir, we are aware that there was staff Audit which was taking place in the resent past and this is what have resulted to this, before the staff Audit what was being paid was Kshs 59,926,840 whoever after that Audit they realized that the County Government of Kisumu were paying some ghost workers and therefore it reduced and what is now left is the names of those ghost workers who were being paid before the exercise was carried out, so this is what is bringing those reduction of salaries, so it is a saving for this County Thank you.

Speaker, Hon. Gabriel Ochieng: Thank you Leader of Majority for that clarification and I hop Hon. Khan you are satisfied.

Hon. Aslam Khan: Thank you very Much Mr. Speaker, the leader of Majority have clarified the Matter so well but I needed further clarification, we are saving the money for the County but from where are we saving this Money, are this money from heaven or from where just need to know?

Speaker, Hon. Gabriel Ochieng: Yes Hon. Chair Budget and Appropriation committee.

Hon. Paul Okiri: Mr. Speaker (interrupted).

Speaker, Hon. Gabriel Ochieng: Order Hon. Member why are you on your feet and you are not the Chairman of Budget and Appropriation committee.

Hon. Paul Okiri: I have a question in relation of what the Leader of Majority has just stated here.

Speaker, Hon. Gabriel Ochieng: remember when I proposed for the question for discussion of the Motion, no one stood up to discuss the same and now all of you want to ask questions, I even went ahead and call for the Chairman to reply.

Chief Whip (Hon. Isaya Omwango): A point of Clarification Mr. Speaker.

Speaker, Hon. Gabriel Ochieng: Yes Hon. Chief Whip.

Chief Whip (Hon. Isaya Omwango): Mr. Speaker I believe that after posing a question members should contribute, there is no question that you asked and answered, we do not expect a question and an answer, it has never happened anywhere in any Assembly.

Speaker, Hon. Gabriel Ochieng: That is ok, Yes Hon. Mindeu.

Hon. Willies Mindeu (Chairman of Budget and Appropriation committee): Thank you, silence means consent in a court of Law hence when the Members were silence they meant that they were certified with the Report (interrupted)

Speaker, Hon. Gabriel Ochieng: Order Hon. Members, You know the procedure of the House Hon. Members, Hon. Ochele what is wrong.

Hon. Moses Ochele: I got the report when I was entering in the house, I have to read it and countercheck it well with the Budget, so Mr. Speaker many Members wanted to contribute but if they were given the report earlier, so that they digest and countercheck with the relevant documents and then debate on it Mr. Speaker, that is why I had to take my time to do all that so that I discuss the report with facts.

Mr. Speaker (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): but you opted to have risen up and say that you needed time to go through the report.

Hon. Moses Ochele: I was still going through the report Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): No, Hon. Member you would have asked for time to go through the report.

Hon. Moses Ochele: Mr. Speaker Hon. Khan raised and you allowed him to talk; now the floor is open for debate, so with your indulgence I want you to allow us to discuss the report.

Mr. Speaker (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): So you want me to break the rules to allow you to discuss the report.

Hon. Moses Ochele: Mr. Speaker you were not lenient to Hon. Khan, the Speaker was a bit in a rush to tell his point and I was almost shouting here for you to see me, so I think you should allow the House to discuss the report of the Budget and Appropriation committee.

Mr. Speaker (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): What is your input Hon. Ochele?

Hon. Moses Ochele: I just wanted to say something about the deduction, I have seen some sense in what Hon. Khan was rising and what we are saving from the Ghost workers as stated by

the Leader of Majority. I can remember that the County Assembly service Board from whoever who was concerned with the medical Scheme signed a contract with the contractor, it was signed on 10/November/2014, the sum assured is totaling to Kshs 19,928,242, this is the money which whoever signed on behalf of the service Board appended his or her signature on it.

Mr. Speaker I am just wondering that at some stage in this contract I realized that the Sum of Money was to be Kshs 10,500,000 and then it rose to this Kshs 19,928,242, that I am quoting from the signed document, then later after the contract have been signed I was later informed that this figure was further reduced to the original figure of Kshs 10,500,000, Mr. Speaker one I was done if the deduction from Kshs 19 million was done formally, and if it was done would it have been reflected in the budget, I expected that this Budget would have shown that there was some changes of the Figures in the Medical Scheme either from Kshs 19,928,242 to Kshs 10,500,000 or the other way round. I am then left wondering if what is here is what is in the budget and if any member can clarify that then I can be at peace or if the Chairman for the Budget and Appropriation can clarify that then I can be at peace thank you.

Mr. Speaker (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): Yes hon. Majority Leader.

Majority Leader (Hon. Samuel Ong'ow): On what Hon. Ochele has said, first I want to clarify that he has talked to the Board, there is no Board decision where Kshs 19,928,242 was signed and if we can use all the minutes in the Board as we speak today because I even know that there is some a member of the Board as we speak today, that is the Leader of Minority can also prove that, there was no minutes where the Kshs 19,928,242. Mr. Speaker there was Kshs 10.5million which was reported to the Board and that was the Cover for the Hon. Members of this House, Mr. Speaker the that particular time we were still looking into how we would address the issue of the staff because there was no circular to that effect on that particular moment, who have just heard Hon. Ochele talking of signed contract on November and the circular that we received come in December around 10th and that is after the contract had been signed. Mr. Speaker the circular from SRC come in December around 10th to be precise and this was the particular cover that was talking on the cover for the Staff. Mr. Speaker this circular now was communicated to the Governors, the Clerks of County Assemblies, the Boards of the County Governments and the rest. Mr. Speaker the Staffs that we have in the Assembly are the Employes of the County Government of Kisumu, their salaries are being paid by the County Government of Kisumu and not the Assembly and therefore we believe that the Medical Cover should be paid by the Medical Cover for Kisumu County, Mr. Speaker this is one of the things that we discuss yesterday while we were in the Budget and Appropriation committee and there were clarification from the Chief Officer communication and planning when a Member of the committee stood on a point of Clarification has Hon. Ochele has asked and he responded by saying that this are their staff and

therefore they will be covered the same way the staff of the other side are covered and there is a huge amount that have been allocated apart from the Kshs 9 million Hon. Ochele is talking About which totals to about Kshs 40 million for the medical cover for the Staffs . if you look at the Budget that we have on our table you will see a some of about Kshs 40 million which is going to be used for the medical cover for the all Staffs of the County Government and that include our Staffs and therefore you cannot put it again in the Assembly side, that is the main point that we are repeating that both in the Executive and the Assembly, but as to why the contract was signed in November before the circular come then one we cannot claim any responsibility, whoever signed that contract should be able to take the responsibility thank you.

Mr. Speaker (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): Yes Hon. Ochele I was wondering where you got the figure because I was trying to look at the figure that you have just stated of Kshs 19,928,242 and Kshs 10,500,000 (interrupted).

Hon. Moses Ochele: Mr. Speaker, before I started I said with me I have the Contract that was signed in November and it has a seal of the Kisumu County Assembly and I was not quoting from the report, I was only wondering if we are declaring deduction where is the remaining difference going and was the Kshs 19,928,242 that was signed in the contract and the one that covers the MCAs which was Kshs 10,500,000 and was Kshs 19,928,242 in the Budget and if it was reflected in the earlier Budget and the contract signed, now in this Supplementary not covering our Staff where is the remaining 9 million , why can it be reflected here in this Budget, I wanted the Chair to guide me on the deduction or increment, the Majority Leader is explaining why the staff where not covered, but my main worry is where it should be reflected, the deduction of medical cover.

Majority Leader (Hon. Samuel Ong'ow): But Mr. Speaker, even before the Chair Concludes I think it is common knowledge, Hon. Ochele is aware that the ceiling that was directed to the county Government was after the Budget was approved. Mr. Speaker our Budget of the Assembly was about Kshs 679 million and that is where the money was and the ceiling for the County Assembly was reduced to Kshs 371 million, so this deduction did not only affect the Kshs 9 million but it affected quite a number of vote heads and if Hon. Ochele want to know the vote heads that were affected then the Chair for Budget can explain that, thank you.

Mr. Speaker (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): Hon. Ochele I think now you are well informed, but I want the Chair to clarify further.

Hon. Willies Mindu (Chairman of Budget and Appropriation committee): Mr. Speaker I do not see me explaining further, we are all aware that the ceiling was reduced from Kshs 671 million to 371 million and this means that there were a lot of deduction, thank you Mr. Speaker sir.

Hon. Moses Ochele: Mr. Speaker I want to conclude, I was wondering if the Budget Chair can Assist me do some changes in my projects because I fill it will be right if I do it in the plenary, if the Chair agree I will be most obliged.

Mr. Speaker (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): you know the procedure of Amendments, you cannot do it in the plenary, and you will have to go to the committee, so you will have to hold on for a while.

Hon. Moses Ochele: Thank you very Much Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): Yes Hon. Pamela.

Hon. Caroline Owen: I also want to make some adjustments to some projects in my Wards and therefore I wanted your indulgence.

Mr. Speaker (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): Thank you let me allow the Hon. Chair for Budget to proceed.

Hon. Willies Mindeu (Chairman of Budget and Appropriation committee): Mr. Speaker I think we were here in the Budget committee in the morning to discuss the Supplementary Budget and anyone that had issue with the Budget was welcomed to give his or her input and some did and so I want to inform the House that having made the appropriation Bill it means that the changes that have already been made and this particular moment it will be hard to start putting the changes, I told them in the morning to write for my committee the changes but none of those who want changes wrote the names of their proposed projects thank you.

Mr. Speaker (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): You can conclude to reply.

Hon. Willies Mindeu (Chairman of Budget and Appropriation committee): Thank you Very Much I want to thank the Hon. Members for debating the report and foe accepting to adopt it in this House and I therefore request that the House adopts this report with Amendments therein and I request for a seconder.

Mr. Speaker (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): Hon. Chair, which Amendments are this? Yes Hon. majority Leader.

Majority Leader (Hon. Samuel Ong'ow): Thank you Mr. Speaker sir, there are no Amendments in the report, the report itself is an amendment but on the floor there have been no Amendments that have been done to the report thank you.

Mr. Speaker (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): That's why I want the Chair to tell me of the Amendments that he is talking about.

Hon. Willies Mindeu (Chairman of Budget and Appropriation committee): Mr. Speaker, I was confused with the issue with the Supplementary Bill and the report that I presented to the floor of the House, there is no any Amendments in this report because the report itself is an Amendments that we made in the Committee, I therefore want to propose that the FY 014|2015 supplementary budget (read for the 2nd and 3rd time) thank you Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): Hon. Caroline and Hon. Ochele you have heard what the Chairman of Budget has told you, I did not see any Amendments in this report.

Hon. Caroline Owen: Mr. Speaker I still seek your indulgence on what particular time shall be able to make the Amendments.

Mr. Speaker (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): But the Chair advised appropriately.

Hon. Willies Mindeu (Chairman of Budget and Appropriation committee): Mr. Speaker the members who has just resumed is a member of the Budget and Appropriation committee, it has taken us a very long time to do this report and the Members who is one of us would have use that time to do the changes that she is talking about, even today she was in the committee and she did not do the same, thank you.

Majority Leader (Hon. Samuel Ong'ow): Mr. Speaker as a matter of procedure which you have really reminded the Hon. Members on, we are all aware that one cannot do Amendments in the plenary and we are now in the plenary, the Budget committee sat and that is where the Amendments were supposed to be done and I am sorry that a member of that same Budget committee who signed this report to be correct want to Amend it her again (interrupted).

Hon. Caroline Owen: It is not about the Membership of the committee.

Mr. Speaker (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): Order! Hon. Member, Yes Hon. Ogosi.

Hon. Aggrey Ogosi: I have a point of clarification, since the Report was read in this House the only people that have been talking are the Member of the same committee that prepared the report, the Leader of Majority, the Chair of the Committee Hon. Mindeu and The minority Whip are the only one who are talking on the report, what is happening, they should let the other Members in the House ventilate on the report thank you.

Mr. Speaker (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): I want to tell the Minority whip that any Amendments that she wishes to do cannot be done in the plenary; it can only be done in the committee of the Whole House, yes Hon. Petronilla.

Hon. Petronilla Omondi: Thank you Mr. Speaker I rise to inform the House that when it comes to discussing the projects in the wards I do not think that there will be a time when the Members shall say that they do not want to change the Projects in their various wards and therefore I request the House that we get to a point that we come very responsible and accept that there must be a point where we need to stop and carry on the next stage and at the moment as we discuss now we all know that we only have this moment and June and that is what we are talking about and there are some projects that we already know and are maybe being done, and therefore I want to say why don't we give a chance to the projects of Kisumu County either that the projects of individual Ward, it will be better for us to give Chance to the projects that are already in this documents, thank you Mr. Speaker.

Hon. Benta Ndeda: Point of Concern Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): Granted.

Hon. Benta Ndeda: Thank you Mr. Speaker, the speaker who have just resume seems contented with the Projects in his ward and on the other side we are not so we need to speak out, the other time we were called t the Chief Officer for planning to give our development projects and I was having the list that was signed by the Planning officer and in the morning when I say this book some of the projects were omitted and when the Budget Chair requested us to bring the report before I handed over the names of my Projects he went to lunch and I do not know where he went to take his lunch because I would have followed him and handed him the list, with me I have my list and I can see that he is from lunch so I do not know how I will give him the list so that he can amend the Projects in my ward, other of my projects were omitted and I do not know what I will do please advice Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): Yes Hon. Chair Budget.

Hon. Willies Mindeu (Chairman of Budget and Appropriation committee): Thank you Mr. Speaker I think with due respect, the budget process have procedures and the Procedure require that any Change must be done in line with the Standing Order and the Constitution of Kenya, I would like to tell the Members to take the same correction to the Public for public participation so that it can be brought to the House for Amendments (interrupted).

Hon. Moses Ochele: Point of information!

Mr. Speaker (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): Yes Hon. Ochele.

Hon. Moses Ochele: Mr. Speaker, I want to inform the Chair of Budget when he talks of projects in the Supplementary budget to be subjected to public Participation, Mr. Speaker all this Documents before us then by the word of the Chair of Budget should be annuity because they were never taken to public participation, we are talking of Supplementary Budget which is neither for the Chair for Budget or this House but for Kisumu County, then if it is the necessity for it to go for Public participation then all this documents should go for Public Participation. Mr. Speaker the other day we were juggling with our projects did we go to the Public? Now that I have one correction to make, then that one should be taken to the Public participation Mr. Speaker. Mr. Speaker I think that one statement that goes to the Hansard can spoil the whole process, I represent the people and when my project is omitted I have to do something, I realized my project was omitted when I was given this book, if I was given this document earlier I could be able to detect it and act on the same but I got the document late so I have to state her for it o be changed. The mistake is not ours and the Chair for Budget should not be on our neck, he should be tolerant and accept that she have problems and see on a way of solving them (interrupted).

Majority Leader (Hon. Samuel Ong'ow): Point of Information Mr. speaker.

Mr. Speaker (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): Yes Hon. Yes Hon. Majority.

Majority Leader (Hon. Samuel Ong'ow): Mr. Speaker I find Hon. Ochele out of Order, as much as he is saying that he is informing the House, he is forming the House based on an illegality. Mr. Speaker you have kept on reminding us on the issues of procedures on what stage we should make Amendments even if we talk the whole day that one remains. Mr. Speaker we are in the plenary and he requesting if the Chair would allow which cannot happen.

Mr. Speaker just has you have said that the Members of the Public can bring their input either directly or indirectly and Mr. Speaker this was done and that was why the public brought their views through their leaders and now why we in the Plenary I find the Hon. member out of order for insisting that we do Amendments in the Plenary thank you.

Leader of Minority (Hon. Edwin Anayo): Thank you very Much Mr. Speaker, I am socked because I am wondering why Hon. Ochele is fighting, Mr. speaker we had a Budget like this last year and we really put a lot of Budget in it and nothing was done, if I was Ochele I would have just this Budget be passed and move on with life because there is nothing that will be done in it thank you.

Mr. Speaker (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): I want the Leader of Minority to substantiate his Statement; it is a very serious statement.

Leader of Minority (Hon. Edwin Anayo): Thank you Mr. Speaker, in June last year we passed a Budget that contained lots of Development issues and until now nothing have been done and now we are here fighting and there is only five months remaining what can be dome within five months? We are wasting time let us pass the Supplementary Budget and move on.

Mr. Speaker (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): As a Member of the Budget and Appropriation committee you advice is that we pass it and go

Leader of Minority (Hon. Edwin Anayo): Yes.

Mr. Speaker (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): Thank you, Yes Hon. Kelvin.

Hon. Kelvin Oraro: Mr. Chair it is very unfortunate for one of the Leader in this House to talk like that, it means that he does not understand why he is in this Assembly and he does not know his role Mr. Speaker. We are oversight to the Executive and we are supposed to give reasons why the development are not taking place, but if he is talking of passing the Budget and going on, then he does not know what he is supposed to be doing.

Mr. Speaker I did not want to mention what a Hon. Colleague has said because mine was more on the issue of procedure. Mr. Speaker I tend to disagree with you on the procedure and in particular on the part of the Amendments Mr. Speaker. Whatever we were discussing was on the report of the supplementary Budget and that means that we are trying to report the entire document that we have and this is when we can amend the report on the things that we wanted to be indicated so that the Hansard can capture it and it can be recorded and later inserted to the document when we will be reading the Actual Bill, so I felt that through your chair or the Budget Chair, it is at this Stage that Amendments should be made or reported and included in this report so that as we proceed we deal with another issue thank you.

Mr. Speaker (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): Thank you, I agree with you but we should convert to the committee of the Whole House for us to affect the Changes, Yes Hon. Ogosi.

Hon. Aggrey Ogosi: Thank you Mr. Speaker allow me to give my input on the report, I want to support what the Leader of Minority has said that at times the intention ids clear even if you are not told that this is what you are expected to do and I circumstances like this what we are expected to do is one to pass the supplementary Budget and proceed. Mr. Speaker look at the report, it tells you that the Committee of Budget did not have time to do a report Mr. Speaker (interrupted).

Leader of Majority (Hon. Samuel Ong'ow): point of information Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): Order! Leader of Majority, Hon. Ogosi we are not going to go back to the report, I gave you humble time to discuss the report and you just sat there and never stood up and now that you have got information somewhere you want to take us back to report which I will not allow, yes Majority Leader.

Leader of Majority (Hon. Samuel Ong'ow): Point of Order Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): Granted.

Leader of Majority (Hon. Samuel Ong'ow): Mr. Speaker I have been very keen throughout the deliberation here and there are some members that are in a hurry to go out and their own things so they even do not know where we are. Mr. Speaker this report was tabled in this House, members went through it until you almost close the discussion of the report, but you opened it for a few Hon. Members here which I think the last person was Hon. Ochele then you called the mover of the Motion to reply and he went ahead and replied so I do not understand why some members are talking on the same report, Mr. Speaker I think he is out of Order thank you.

Hon. Aggrey Ogosi: Mr. Speaker I have a hearing problem, allow me to finish.

Mr. Speaker (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): Order! Hon. Ogosi please sit down. Hon. Chief Whip!

Hon. Chief Whip: Mr. Speaker allow me to say this. As I can see the mood of the House, some Members want to make amendments. The standing Order does not allow that we make amendments while in plenary. It is better we turn to the committee of the whole House and make those amendments that they want and we move on. What we are saying here in the plenary is not within the standing Order and I can see two or three corrections that the Members want to correct. Let's turn to committee of the whole House and make those amendments.

Hon. Aggrey Ogosi: I want to second.

Hon. Willis Ogonyo: Mr. Speaker I have a concern. I want to remind the Members that this same budget has had almost three months meetings in Nairobi, Kitale and Eldoret. Why didn't the Members utilize the time that was given by the committee. Mr. Speaker it is not right that this committee where I sit as the chairman we will be recycling amendments every now and then. I even gave chance this morning until noon that amendments be brought. Mr. Speaker I beg your protection.

Hon. Simba Opepo: Mr. Speaker it is in this House in the Morning when you were in chair and we were doing the amendments and most of the Members were just making noise not even giving chance for amendments of the projects. Mr. Speaker you know this is not a concern of the Members but a concern of the electorates in the wards. If we are going to live with the same system of changing things and this is what we did the last time during the budget making process whereby we had several books because today you change a new book comes, tomorrow you change again another book comes. Mr. Speaker these are the Members who were called at the executive to give their projects and they did give and signed the list and they are the same members coming again complaining for amendments. I am totally confused Mr. Speaker and I need your guidance.

Hon. Benjamin: Mr. Speaker the discussions we are having on whether to make amendments or not, to me amendments means a lot of things. Amendments will also include the spellings because when a project in my ward is misspell and taken the way it is then I think it is going to cause a problem. So, amendments to me do not only mean changing projects, changing values, it means a lot of things. Let's look for the right time and make the amendments but also have the degree of those amendments. Thank you.

Hon. Joseph Osano: Point of information! I want to inform the House Mr. speaker. I think the problem that we are having is that we are not prepared. Why am I saying this? Our standing orders states very well the time we are supposed to be given this report. Mr. Speaker how can we be given the report the same day the same time and they want you to debate it? I think we are also doing a bad thing for ourselves. Why couldn't we get the report earlier so that we go through it?

Hon. Chief Whip: Point of information Mr. Speaker. You know sometimes you talk as if you talk to someone in Nyalenda and you are here! You are ones who took the said projects to the executive and this document is your document. Let us go to committee of the whole House. You will look at the projects in your wards that you signed with the department of planning are there. If it's there it's okay and if it's not there then you see what to do. You are talking as if somebody else did it for you and somebody wants to interfere; and were not even there. This question of you was not there is the reason why some of you are not even popular where you come from. I am sorry to say that.

(Members amused!!)

Hon. Joseph Osano: Mr. Speaker what I am saying with due respect is that it is better you are given something earlier. I have not disputed this report.

Leader of Majority: Mr. Speaker sir, I think the Hon. Chief whip has already given us a way forward but it seems some Members here have their own hidden agenda. Hon. Osano is talking about what he already knows very well; even in the National assembly, there comes a time when there is an urgent issue and you can even sit upto midnight. We are aware Kisumu county is one of the counties which was not going to get their fund because they have not met the ceiling. Mr. Speaker this document we are talking about, this is not the first time we are meeting it. If you look at the report it's a 3 page report and it's very direct. The projects that the Hon. Members are talking about were their own recommendations to the ministry of planning and they can look at that at the committee of the whole House. If you see a Hon. Member coming here again with such a version that he needs to be given time for their discussions in other places, we are not going to entertain it while the county is still lagging behind. We know the procurement process is going to take almost three months and we are going to be left with four months. When will we have to pass this supplementary? Tell me at what stage and how long the procurement will take place and for how long will the projects be implemented? Let us not create confusion and then at the end of it we start complaining on the effect.

Hon. Chief Whip: Thank you Mr. Speaker. I propose that we turn to committee of the whole House so that we can tackle the issues in the budget.

Minority Leader: I second.

(House reverts from Plenary to Committee of the whole House)

Mr. Chairman (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): Order Hon. Members! Order! We are now in the committee of the whole House. Hon. Majority Leader!

Hon. Majority Leader: Thank you Mr. Chairman. We are aware this year we decided as a county to adopt the program budget and based on this it is important for certain issues to be addressed informally by a "Kamkunji" and therefore I want to propose that we revert to Plenary. I want to ask the Minority whip to second.

Minority whip: Thank you Mr. Chairman I second.

Mr. Chairman (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): I proposal has been made by the Majority Leader and seconded by Minority whip that we revert to Plenary and from there we will get our way forward.

(House reverts from Committee of the whole House to Plenary)

Hon. Majority Leader: Thank you Mr. Speaker Sir. Due to the small technicalities the Hon. Members feel they need to meet before they proceed and therefore I want to propose that the House adjourns for 10 minutes for a small discussion. I want to ask the Minority whip to second.

Minority whip: Thank you Mr. Chairman, I second that proposal.

Adjournment

Mr. Speaker (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): The Majority Leader has proposed that we adjourn for 10 minutes for housekeeping matters. I now adjourn the House for 10 minutes.

(House adjourns)

(House Resumes)

Mr. Speaker (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): Thank you Hon. Members. I think we have consulted and kept our House in Order by the nitty gritty that arose. We can now proceed to the business of the day and we are at the point where the chairman of budget and appropriation committee had read the report and I was to put a question for the adoption of the report. I do request the chair to start from there so that we can adopt that report.

Hon. Pamela Omino: Point of clarification! I had an issue to raise, so can I raise it here?

Mr. Speaker (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): No, let us convert first then you will raise it.

Hon. Willis Ogonyo: Thank you Mr. Speaker. Having gone through the consultations and agreed I therefore want to request that the report for budget appropriation committee be adopted by the House with the corrections therein. We are aware some of the Members brought some corrections and that is why I am saying it be adopted with the corrections therein. Thank you.

Mr. Speaker (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): Hon. Members the chairman of budget and appropriation committee has read his report which was well seconded and Members deliberated on it. I now want to put a question that as many as of the opinion that the report by the budget and appropriation committee presented to the House this afternoon be adopted with amendments say “Aye!”

Hon. Members: “Aye!”

Mr. Speaker (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): For those of the contrary opinion say “Nay!”

Hon. Members: *(Silence!)*

Mr. Speaker (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): The “Ayes!” have and the report is adopted with the amendments. Chairman of budget and appropriation committee!

Hon. Willis Ogunyo: Since those amendments do not appear in the supplementary budget I request that the Supplementary budget be read for the 2nd and 3rd time.

Mr. Speaker (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): The chairman of budget and appropriation committee has requested that the Supplementary budget be read for the 2nd and 3rd time. We should now get a proposal that we revert to committee of the whole House so that the clerk can read the Supplementary budget.

Minority Whip: Thank you Mr. Speaker. I propose that we revert to committee of the whole House.

THE KISUMU COUNTY SUPPLEMENTARY

APPROPRIATION BILL, 2014

AN ACT of County Assembly to authorize the issue of certain sums of money out of the County Revenue Fund and their application towards the service of the year ending on the 30th June 2015, and to appropriate those sums for certain public services and purposes.

ENACTED by the County Assembly of Kisumu, as follows-

1. This Act may be cited as the Kisumu County Supplementary Act 2014. Short Title

2 The County Treasury may issue the sum of seven billion, three hundred and four million, two hundred and ninety two thousand, and four hundred and sixty seven out of the County Revenue Funds and apply toward the supply granted for the service of the year ending on the 30th June, 2015.

Appropriation of the money granted.

3 The sum granted by section two shall be appropriated for the several services and purposes specified in the second column of the First Schedule, in the amounts specified in the third column of that Schedule.

Appropriation in Aid

4 In addition to the sum granted by section 2, the sum specified in the fourth column of the First and Second Schedules shall be applied for the several services and purposes specified in the second column of those Schedules, out of Revenue directed to be applied outside the County Revenue Fund under Article 207(1) (2) of the Constitution.

5. The supply granted for the services of the year ending on the 30th June, 2015, in respect of Votes 317-R01,317-R02,317-R03,317-R04,317-R05,317-R06,317-R07,317-R08,317-09,R317-R09,317-R10,317-R11 and 317-D12, in accordance with Appropriation Act 2014

Mr. Chairman (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): Where do you want it to be supplied?

Hon. Pamela Omino: That is upon the members now to take care of, because it has already been supplied in the Ministry of Land, Housing and Physical Planning.

Leader of Majority (Hon. Samuel Ongow): Thank you Mr. Chair, I don't think we should go to that direction at this particular stage because this is something that the County Government has even reached us as Members and should the National Government liaise with the County Government on this, I don't think the money will go to waste if it is a new requirement. If we rely on what is in the paper and make amendments and then it does not appear in the gazzettment then we shall have done wrong.

Mr. Chairman (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): Thank you, it is a matter of concern and I can buy what Chair of Budget Committee has said that we can wait for Kenya Gazette notice. If there is any development that is going to be taken by the Land, Housing and Physical Planning in Kisumu City, then we are going to do that because the law allows us to do so. Yes Hon. Nereah!

Hon. Nereah Okombo: Thank you Mr. Chair. What has been proposed by Hon. Pamela Omino is a very good amendment. I think the County can confirm if this is true or not because I don't think the Ministry of Lands, Housing and Physical Planning would advertise something that is not there. As much as we want to oppose this, I want to request the house to give it a hear so that

we confirm this with the office of planning so that this money be diverted to other vote heads in development. I also want to concur because we have mechanisms to confirm this.

Hon. Willis Ogunyio: Mr. Chair, we are not trying to dispute this, even in Muhoroni/Koru there are areas which require such kind of development but our worry is, this is just indicated in the daily papers.

Mr. Chairman (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): I think we are just going to go with what our budget Chair is saying because we have to verify this before we decide to move this money to other development.

Hon. Pamela Omino: Chair, I object. I am not satisfied because I don't see why you want to supply where already it has been advertised and you are saying you are waiting for the authentication.

Hon. Caroline Owen. Thank you Mr. Chair, it is not correct to say that the budget is going to be done twice, for this particular budget is only one. You may have seen others in the papers that we do not know if it is budgeted for and just as the Chair of Budget has said, we were informed that supplementary budget can be made anytime and we will have time for that when it is authenticated but we cannot go with what is in the newspaper until we certain the facts.

Leader of Majority: Mr. Chair, We can only wait for something which is meant for us, if this is a function which is of the National Government and that is the way they want to do it, to liaise with the County Government, then we have to get facts, we are also not against this, we are saying that we wait and see what we are going to do, we will simply move the amount stated to the right vote after we have found the valid information.

Hon. Isaya Onyango (Chief Whip): Appoint of information Mr. Chairman

Mr. Chairman (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): Yes, Chief Whip

Hon. Isaya Onyango (Chief Whip): The issue that has been raised by Members is very pertinent but, I am afraid that there are some members who only want to be captured in Hansard. They raise issues and before we absorb her statements she goes out after saying I object. We are not going to allow this. What the Members are saying is this, we are not saying that we are going to supply twice but it is obvious we have auditors who will check how the County has issued the money. If you use the money twice you will be arrested. Two, if it is true and confirmed that the government is going to do this job and we have supplied, it will be moved to other vote heads. The Member has raised a good observation but before we exhaust, she has ran out and that is the way she is behaving all the time. We are not going to be fooled all the time

that when you want something and you find there is a road block now you run away. It is better we deal with issues as it is. Thank you.

Mr. Chairman (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): I think this is a matter of logics and I want to put members on notice, kindly do not just come to debate for the sake of it. It happened the other day, it happened yesterday, and it has happened now. You raise a pertinent question, people debate on it before we reach conclusion, you are on your way walking out. That is not a way of debating in an Honorable House. Because you only want your part to be captured then you say the House refused because they have a part in that money. This is a house of logics and we know the Controller of Audit will find out if it is meant for other developments. We cannot do duplication of projects so kindly when you want to debate, debate soberly having it in mind that you want to develop this County not political gains. Thank you. We are going to D07, D08, D09, D10, D11, D12.

Hon. Faridah Ahmed: Thank you Mr. Chair, on D12, the last bit- pending bills for County Assembly Headquarters, Now that we have already re- allocated this money to go for the Ward Development I don't know how it should feature here.

Mr. Chairman (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): Yes, Chair of Budget!

Hon. Willis Ogunyio Mideu: I also suggest that this item be put accordingly as per the relevant program and the correction be adopted. Thank you.

Mr. Chairman (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): That is why we were debating on the report because it will be affected by the amendment of this bill so how do you want it to appear here?

Hon. Willis Ogunyio Mideu: That is why I said with amendments.

Mr. Chairman (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): Hon. Ochele, in the bill of this nature, the standing orders should not be arising. Anyway, can you make your point of order.

Hon. Moses Ochele: Thank you Mr. Chair, you are trying to pre-empt what I wanted to say. This sitting officially should end by 6.30p.m and going by the look of things, we still have a lot to do, I hope the Majority Leader is taking note.

Mr. Chairman (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): Thank you for your notification and concern. We are going to take the amendments. Now we are in D13

Hon. Osumba Olum: I have something to say on D13, my concern is that the City of Kisumu should also be given something for the Development because the City is also doing a lot but I am

seeing it has not been allocated anything. That is my concern, the city has several things to do in this town and you all know that. So Chair of Budget do something.

Hon. Faridah Ahmed: I second Mr. Chair

Mr. Chairman (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): Thank you, Hon. Olum is bringing a concern on D13 which is the development expenditure for City of Kisumu which has been seconded by Hon. Faridah Ahmed. He was requesting the Chair of Budget to allocate some funds to the City, what is your take Hon. Petronilla?

Hon. Petronilla Achieng: Thank you the Chair. This development fund of the city, all of us appreciate that we have a city. Even if we go to D13 and we raise it here, what are we going to develop?

Mr. Chairman (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): That is why it has come and I have to through a question for some concern to be put.

Hon. Caroline Owen: I tried to champion for this to be taken care of put it has been up to task. We have a city which we really appreciate and we all know that Machakos with no city is putting money in the budget because they have value for the city because the city has many things, many development issues. We looked about this in Eldoret when we had a meeting, we talked about it in Nairobi but indeed they all said that they appreciate the city but it doesn't seem so. As Assembly let us be sincere and say we want to develop our City and budget for it.

Mr. Chairman (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): Majority Leader!

Majority Leader (Hon. Samuel Ongow): Thank you Mr. Chair, I was expecting the Budget Committee to guide members. When we were in the Budget Committee allocating this money for the Wards we realized that Development for Wards are shared even for the Wards within the City. The city is budgeted for in terms of operations and maintenance and that is there. So when you talk about things which should be categorized under operations and maintenance it is there. We said that for the next budget it will be looked into if now in our budget we need to separate in the budget allocation if it is left for the city alone or for the wards within the city. In that respect, we also agreed that there are those projects which must be taken as the County Projects. I expect my colleagues who were in the Committee to explain to other members who were not there. Thank you.

Hon. Osumba Olum: Mr. Chairman, there is a reason why I am raising this issue. I know those who were working in the former defunct local authority who are now in the Executive are the ones who are behind this issue by denying the city allocation for development. This city is going

to sink, I am telling you. There should be at least something that they can use even to repair or do maintenance.

Mr. Chairman (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): There is a concern, let me hear what Hon. Were has to say.

Hon. James Were: Mr. Chair, city should be allocated, city needs development budget that they can also use to some small projects within the city. You cannot add operation on development budget. I want also to add my concern that they should be given some money for them to do development. Thank you.

Hon. Petronilla Achieng: Thank you very much Mr. Chair. I want everybody to know that I am really concerned about this city and I know without proper approach there will be no city but what I am saying this, we know the structure of this City is not complete, we need a city board and the city board will sit and know what they need to develop so that there is a clear cut road between the ward representatives and the board. When we were in Eldoret, this was said very clearly and when the time comes for doing the budget then the City budget will be presented to the Governors' meeting with the County Secretary at the Executive and the budget will come here and we pass it. What we are saying here again is, when today, today we are not making the budget but we are saying this city must have a budget, come next year, we want to see a city budget entrenched. That is what we agreed and no matter how much we speak here, whatever how much we raise our concern, sincerely this is not the platform, we cannot do a budget for the city now. What we should therefore fight for is to see that the board is constituted. I think that is my take.

Hon. Isaya Onyango (Chief Whip): Thank you Mr. Chair. My sister has spoken very well but whose, it is here that we passed that a person concerned should constitution the city board so whom are we blaming?, that is their own blame. Again the Secretary you are talking about, The TA was recalled long time ago, what is he doing here? According to what we agreed on, we said let us give city small amount that can make them run until next year which is June and what I saw here is 90m which 66 will go for salaries but I want to say this, we will fight it out. I know many of us do not accept this. For now, there is nothing we are going to do, but come next year, we shall put it in budget.

Hon. Nereah Okombo: Thank you Mr. Chair. Members of the Assembly within the city really need allocation for the city to make it run. City needs a board and they have constitutional right that was given to the people of Kisumu. If we cannot do it now, then the next budget should look into the city but even in this supplementary budget, the ones which are said to be double allocated can be taken to the city.

Hon. Simba Opepo: Thank you Mr. Chair, the members who are sitting in the budget are the same members here who are complaining yet they sat in the budget. It is a fact that the City must have allocation. Most of investors coming are coming in the name of Kisumu City so we must allocate money for its development come next financial year. Thank you very much.

Hon. Aslam Khan: Thank you. Mr. Chair, devolution doesn't mean within the rural areas. We used to have Councils and the city was maintained well. The income generated from these areas especially the tax payers is the highest. We want to retain the beauty of Kisumu City.

Leader of Majority: Mr. Chair, the way some of the members are debating, it is appearing as if there is no total allocation for the city which is not true. There is money for development leave alone the one for operations. It is money which is going to be shared by the Wards. What was agreed at the Committee level, that the other areas which were not captured under the sub county will be considered? The Ward that falls in the City has been already allocated money.

Hon. Nereah Okombo: Appoint of clarification Mr. Chair!

Mr. Chairman (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): Go on.

Hon. Nereah Okombo: Mr. Chair, I want to draw the attention of our Majority Leader to the County Government Act that the City and the County are distinct and it is autonomous so the budget to the County and City are separate.

Mr. Chairman (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): I know there is a concern to those who come from the City but remember the city belongs to all of us. I want to say that the concern has been raised and it is going to be considered. Let us be cautious next time in the next budget that the city gets its budget allocation. For now there is nothing much we can do about it. Let us move to the next item. It was brought by Hon. Olum and had been seconded by Hon. Faridah.

We are going to the total development expenditure. Anybody with a question there? None? Let's move to page eight. Order Hon. Members, we are still consulting.(consulting with the Clerks). (Committee resumes). Yes Majority Leader!

An ACT of the County Assembly of Kisumu to authorize the issue of certain sums of money out of the County Revenue Fund and their application towards the services of the year ending on the 30th June 2015, and to appropriate those sums for certain public services purposes, as many are of this opinion say , “Aye?”

Hon. Members: “Aye!”

Mr. Speaker (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): As many are of the contrary opinion say, “Nay?”

Hon. Members: (*Silence!*)

Mr. Speaker (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): The “Ayes” have it, the Supplementary and Appropriation Bill, 2014 has been passed. Yes Hon. Kadede.

Hon. John Kadede: Mr. Speaker what we are passing here, we have difference in figures with almost in excess of Ksh.10, 794,754 that is for recurrent, and we are just passing it without anybody noticing that.

Mr. Speaker (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): Hon. Kadede you are taking us back.

Hon. John Kadede: I am just registering that you didn’t know that we are passing the Bill with some money being excess in it...

Mr. Speaker (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): But I repeated it twice here, if there is anybody with problem in terms of figures, if somebody had made any calculations so that we can fix it.

Chief Whip (Mr. Isaya Onyango): Lets finish with the Bill then we will correct it.

Mr. Speaker (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): Hon. Members now that we have passed this and extended time, we need to supply the amount that has been factored in this House, the Chair of the Budget and appropriation to tell us what next.

Hon. Willis Ogunyo: Thank you Mr. Speaker sir (interruption)

Mr. Speaker (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): Anybody with the Standing Order to help the Chair of budget with.

Hon. Willis Ogunyo: Thank you Mr. Speaker, I now want to request that the amount of Kshs.7, 304,292,467 to be for the recurrent and development expenditure for year ending 30th June 2015, I now want to propose that we revert to the Committee of the Whole House.

(House Reverting to the Committee of the Whole House)

Mr. Chairman (Hon. Gabriel Ochieng): Now we are in the committee of the supply, Hon. Members remember that the patience pays, Hon. Members those who are the chairs of the sectoral committees or the deputies, you have your statements on different appropriations, so as we are going to start on the supply as per the Bill you have (supplementary and appropriation Bill 2014) Hon. Members I hope you have also been provided by this other document (the budget summary), we are going to do this under this procedure that when your sectoral committee is called, we know that the recurrent expenditure as per this (white document) summary of the budget document is not provided for, because in recurrent we have both personnel plus operation and maintenance and we are going to ask for the Clerk to do that arithmetic for us but for the development it has been done, so just read the figures for development under your sectoral committees, are we together in this ?

You know in the Committee of the Whole House the rules are flexed and relaxed, we are in the Committee of the supply and we want to supply the amounts that were appropriated in the Supplementary budget to deference sectoral committees, Hon. Members you know the procedure when your sectoral committee is called you mention the amount for the recurrent and for development, you will read them laud and then we approve it, so I call upon the clerk to read them , that is various sectoral committees that we have .

Asst. Clerk (Mr. Tommy Okaka): Committee of Governance and Administration.

Hon. Joshua Auko: Thank you Mr. Chairman, I rise to supply to the committee for Governance & administration county service board the sum of Ksh.375,568,636 for recurrent and for development is Ksh.82,827,811.
