**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Oginga, Nominated Member): Yes, Honourable Geoffrey Warindu.

**Hon. Warindu** (MCA, Miwani): Thank you, Madam. I will move the motion on behalf of the Chairperson, Select Committee on Implementation Committee. The Honourable Members, I believe that you are all aware that, the comprehensive report was shared in our WhatsApp group.

Honourable Speaker, Honourable members, on the 15<sup>th</sup> May, 2024, this Honorable adopted the report of the Select Committee on Public Accounts and Investment on the matter of the examination of the Auditor General's Report on the Financial Statements of Lumumba Hospital for the year ended 30<sup>th</sup> June, 2022. This Hon. House, had Pursuant to the said report made resolutions adopting the Recommendations made by the Committee therein.

Consequently, in accordance with Article 185 of the Constitution, Section 8 and Section 9 of the County Governments Act, 2012 read together with Standing Orders No. 191, the resolutions made by this Hon. House stood committed to the Select Committee on Implementation to scrutinize, inquire into, investigate and report on the Implementation Status of the Resolution of the House on the matter of the Report on the Examination of the Auditor General's Report on the Financial Statements of Lumumba Hospital for the year ended 30<sup>th</sup> June, 2022.

Accordingly, the Committee convened a meeting on 2<sup>nd</sup> September, 2024 where it resolved to initiate the inquiry into the status of implementation of the Resolutions of this House made on the 15<sup>th</sup> May, 2024 as per the requirements of the Standing Orders. (*see annex I, a copy of the Minutes*)

Honourable Speaker, Honourable members, pursuant to Standing Order No.184 of the County Assembly Standing Orders and Article 153(4)(b) of the Constitution, the Committee on 23<sup>rd</sup> September, 2024 received a response from the Management of Lumumba Sub-County Hospital through the department of Medical Services, Public Health and Sanitation, on the matter of implementation of the County Assembly resolutions on the Auditor General's report on the financial statements of Lumumba level 4 hospital for the year ended 30<sup>th</sup> June, 2022

The response from the Management of Lumumba Sub-County Hospital was procedurally tabled before the Committee on Monday, 7<sup>th</sup> October, 2024 where it scrutinized the responses received and resolved to do a comprehensive Report for further consideration and adoption by this Honorable House.

This report therefore is a compilation of the findings and observations made by the Committee in regards to the response seized by the Committee in regards to the Implementation Status of the House Resolution on the report by the Committee on Public Accounts and Investment on

examination of the report of the Auditor General on the financial statements of Lumumba level 4 hospital for the year ended 30<sup>th</sup> June, 2022.

Pursuant to provision of Standing Order No.182, it is my therefore my duty and privilege and on behalf of the Committee on Implementation to present to this Hon. House, the report of the Committee on its consideration of the implementation status of house resolutions on the report by the Committee on Pic/Pac on its examination of the Auditor General report on the financial statements for Lumumba level 4 hospital for the year ended 30<sup>th</sup> June, 2022 and urge this Hon. house to adopt it.

#### Establishment and Mandate of the Committee

Honourable Speaker, Honourable members, The Select Committee on Implementation is established Pursuant to the provisions of Standing Orders No. 191 of the County Assembly of Kisumu.

The mandate of the Committee is further enhanced by Standing Order 184 that provides that within 60 days of a resolution of the County Assembly or adoption of a report of a select Committee, the relevant member of the County Executive Committee under whose portfolio the implementation of the resolution fall shall provide a report to the relevant committee of the County Assembly in accordance with Article 153(4)(b) of the Constitution.

Background information.

Honourable Speaker, Honourable members, the report of the Select Committee on Public Accounts and Investment on examination of the report of the Auditor General on the financial statements of Lumumba level 4 hospital for the year ended 30<sup>th</sup> June, 2022 was tabled before this Honorable House on 2<sup>nd</sup> May, 2024 and subsequently adopted on 15<sup>th</sup> May, 2024.

Pursuant to Standing Order No.184 of the County Assembly Standing Orders and Article 153(4)(b) of the Constitution, the Committee on Implementation on 23<sup>rd</sup> September, 2024 received responses from the Management of Lumumba Sub-County Hospital through the department of Medical Services, Public Health and Sanitation, on the matter of implementation of the County Assembly resolutions on the Auditor General's report on the financial statements of Lumumba level 4 hospital level for the year ended 30<sup>th</sup> June, 2022.

The Select Committee on Implementation at its meeting held on Monday, 7<sup>th</sup> October, 2024 scrutinized the responses received and resolved to do a report on the same for further deliberations and adoption by the House.

In their response, the management of the Lumumba Sub-County hospital informed the committee as follows,

**IMPLEMENTATION STATUS OF HOUSE RESOLUTIONS ON THE REPORT OF PIC/PAC COMMITTEE ON ITS CONSIDERATION OF THE AUDITOR GENERAL'S REPORT ON THE FINANCIAL STATEMENT OF LUMUMBA HOSPITAL FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30TH JUNE, 2022**

Honourable Speaker, Honourable members, the report of Public Accounts and Investment Committee had the following House resolutions;

1. That going forward, the Management must ensure that the financial statements reflect the true and fair position of the Hospital as required by section 164(3) of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012, on financial reporting.

Implementation Status;

The Committee was informed as follows;

- i. That the Management of the Hospital was unable to balance the trial balance due to the errors of omission, Commission and original entry from the books of accounts,
- ii. That the issues were corrected and the right values imputed and the trial balance is now balanced. (*See annex 2, a copy of a trial balance*).

Committee Finding;

That during the time of Audit, the trial balance used to prepare the financial statements of the Hospital reflected a total debit and credit balance of Kshs.247,453,995 and 24,113,593 respectively, therefore did not balance.

That the Management of the Hospital has rectified the errors of omissions and Commission from the books of accounts and the rights values imputed.

2. That going forward, the Management must comply with Section 5(a) of the Kisumu County Health Facility Improvement Fund Act,2021.

Implementation Status;

The Committee was informed;

- i. That the management has since made a request to the Chief Officer of Medical Services, Public Health and Sanitation for the authority to open Facility Improvement Fund (*See Annex 3, letter to the Chief Officer*).

Committee Finding;

The Management of the Hospital is yet to open facility improvement fund account.

Committee Recommendation;

THAT, the County Executive Committee Member for Medical Services, Public Health and Sanitation immediately facilitate the process of opening facility improvement bank account for Lumumba Hospital and a report on same be submitted this Assembly within 30 days.

3. That going forward, the Management of the Hospital, must adhere to the requirements of section 164(1) of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012, on the preparation of its financial statements.

Implementation Status;

The Committee was informed;

- i. That since the management of the hospital had never prepared a financial statement before, it acknowledged and rectified the omission of dates, statements on corporate governance and performance objectives as captured in the Auditor General's report and commits to ensure the quality review of subsequent financial reports comply with the reporting template issued by the Public Sector Accounting Standards.
4. That the County Executive Committee Member for Finance, ICT and Economic Planning constitute a Task Force within 30days upon adoption of this report to ascertain the accuracy and the value of the Pending bill, as at 30<sup>th</sup> June ,2022.

Implementation Status;

The Committee was informed;

- i. That the Management of the Hospital had summarized all the payables of the hospital as at 30<sup>th</sup> June ,2022 (*See Annex 4, a copy of pending bill as at 30<sup>th</sup> June,2022*).
5. That the Accounting Officer, Department of Medical Services, Public Health and Sanitation demonstrate to this Assembly by way of a report corrective measures taken to adhere to the Kenya Quality Model for Health Policy guidelines within 90days upon adoption of this report.

Implementation Status;

The Committee was informed;

- i. That the matter of inadequate staffing was acknowledged and that the staff establishment has improved as per the attached staff establishment form (*See Annex 5, facility health workforce*)

Committee Findings;

The Committee noted that during the time of Audit the personnel requirement according to the Kenya Quality Model for Health Policy guidelines was as follows.

Following the response received on the implementation of the recommendation in this regard, the Committee made the following findings:

- i. THAT, the management hired an additional 6 community health workers bringing the total number to 21 and deficit of 54 required community health workers.
- ii. THAT, the recommendations made in regards to employments of additional Medical Officers, Anesthesiologists, General Surgeons, Gynecologists and Pediatrics had not been implemented at the time of tabling this Report.

Committee Recommendations;

THAT the department of Medical Services, Public Health and Sanitation be provided with adequate budgetary allocations to enable employment of additional Medical Officers, Anesthesiologists, General Sergions, Gynecologists and Pediatrics to the facility.

6. That the accounting officer department of Health initiates the process of transferring the title deed from defunct municipal council of Kisumu to Lumumba Hospital and a report on the same be submitted to this Assembly within a period of 90days.

Implementation Status;

The Committee was informed;

- i. THAT, the management of the hospital had written a letter to the Chief Officer Lands, Housing, Physical Planning and Urban Development through the Chief Officer Medical Services, Public Health and Sanitation to help survey the hospital land to establish the exact boundary and also help in acquisition of the title deed (*See Annex 6, a copy of the letter to chief officer Lands*).

Committee Finding;

That the process of transferring the title deed from defunct municipality of Kisumu to Lumumba hospital has not been done.

Committee Recommendation;

THAT, the County Executive Committee Member for Medical Services, Public Health and Sanitation immediately engage the department of Lands, Housing, Physical Planning and Urban Development to expedite the process of transferring the title deed from defunct municipal

council of Kisumu to Lumumba Hospital and a progress report on the same be submitted to this Assembly within a period of 30 days.

7. That the accounting officer initiates, with immediate effect, valuation of all land and buildings and a report on the same be submitted to this Assembly within a period of 90 days upon adoption of the report.

Implementation Status;

The Committee was informed;

- i. That that the Valuation of the hospital assets was jointly done by the National Government (ministry of Lands) and County Government of Kisumu under the supervised by Inter-Governmental County Assets Valuations and Transfer Committee and the report is yet to be received (*See Annex 7, a letter from the County Secretary to the C.E.O IGRTC*).

Committee Finding;

The valuation report of assets of the hospital is yet to be received from the Inter-Governmental County Assets Valuations and Transfer Committee.

Committee Recommendation;

That the CEC Member for Medical Services, Public Health and Sanitation immediately fast track the valuation report of assets of the hospital from the IGRTC and a report on the same be submitted to this Assembly with a period of 30 days upon adoption of this report.

8. That going forward, the management must adhere to Executive Order No.2 of 2018 and regulation 49(2) of the public procurement and Asset Disposal Regulation,2020.

Implementation Status;

The Committee was informed;

- i. That that the Kisumu Facility Improvement Fund Act (2021) envisaged the management of finances as a fund. That the IFMIS system had not been rolled out to the health facilities during the audit period. That the management is in the process of establishing a financial management system in line with the new National Facility Improvement Fund Act (2023).

Committee Observation;

The hospital management is in the process of establishing an integrated financial management system (IFMIS) in line with the new National Facility Improvement Fund Act (2023).

Committee Recommendation;

That the CEC Member for Medical Services, Public Health and Sanitation to ensure that the hospital establishes a financial management system in line with the new national facility improvement fund act, 2023 and a report on the same be submitted this Assembly within a period of 60 days upon adoption of this report.

Summary of Committee Observations

Honourable Speaker, Honourable members, the Committee having considered the responses from the management of Lumumba level 4 hospital, made the following observation;

1. THAT, the recommendations made in regards to employments of additional Medical Officers, Anesthesiologists, General Surgeons, Gynecologists and Pediatrics had not been implemented at the time of tabling this Report.
2. THAT, the management has hired an additional 6 community health workers bringing the total number to 21 and deficit of 54 required community health workers.
3. THAT, the Management of the Hospital has rectified the errors of omissions and Commission from the books of accounts and the rights values imputed.
4. THAT, the Management of the Hospital is yet to open facility improvement fund account.
5. THAT, the process of transferring the title deed from defunct municipality of Kisumu to Lumumba hospital has not been done.
6. THAT, the valuation report of assets of the hospital is yet to be received from the Inter-Governmental County Assets Valuations and Transfer Committee
7. THAT, the hospital management is in the process of establishing an integrated financial management system (IFMIS) in line with the new National Facility Improvement Fund Act (2023).

Summary of Committee Recommendations

Honourable Speaker, Honourable members, the Committee having considered the Implementation status of House Resolution on the Auditor General's report on the financial statements of Lumumba level 4 hospital level for the year ended 30<sup>th</sup> June, 2022 made the following recommendations;

1. THAT, the CEC Member for Medical Services, Public Health and Sanitation immediately engage the department of Lands, Housing, Physical Planning and Urban Development to expedite the process of transferring the title deed from defunct municipal council of Kisumu to Lumumba Hospital and a progress report on the same be submitted to this Assembly within a period of 30 days.
2. THAT, the department of Medical Services, Public Health and Sanitation be provided with adequate budgetary allocations to enable employment of additional Medical

Officers, Anesthesiologists, General Surgeons, Gynecologists and Pediatrics to the facility.

3. THAT, the CEC Member for Medical Services, Public Health and Sanitation immediately facilitate the process of opening facility improvement bank account for Lumumba Hospital and a report on same be submitted this Assembly within 30 days.
4. THAT, the CEC Member for Medical Services, Public Health and Sanitation to ensure that the hospital establishes a financial management system in line with the new national facility improvement fund act, 2023 and a report on the same be submitted this Assembly within a period of 60 days upon adoption of this report.
5. THAT, the CEC Member for Medical Services, Public Health and Sanitation immediately fast track the valuation report of assets of the hospital from the IGRTC and a report on the same be submitted to this Assembly with a period of 30 days upon adoption of this report.

#### Conclusion

Honourable Speaker, Honourable members, it is now my honor and privilege, on behalf of the Committee on Implementation to move this motion before this Honorable House for consideration and adoption. May I call upon Hon. Were to second the report?

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Oginga, Nominated Member): Honourable members, now that the report by the Select Committee on Implementation on the Report on Implementation of House resolutions, on the Report of Public Investments and Accounts Committee on its consideration of the Auditor General Report on the Financial Statement of Lumumba Level 4 Hospital for the year ended 30th of June, 2022, has been presented, seconded, and as per the provisions of our Standing Orders, I want to propose a question, and I propose that this report is now open for debate.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Oginga, Nominated Member): Yes, Honourable Boitone member representing Nyalenda “A” Ward.

**Hon. Ratib** (MCA, Nyalenda “A”): Thank you very much Madam Speaker. We are talking about Implementation Committee. The Implementation Committee worked upon a report that was given to them by the select Committee on Public Investments and Accounts. Madam Speaker, I'm waiting for you to finish that consultation. You cannot multi-task Madam Speaker.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Oginga, Nominated Member): Honourable Ratib Boitone, I am all ears and again, I am allowed to consult because I need to make a decision.

**Hon. Boitone** (Nyalenda “A”): Thank you Madam Speaker. I arise to oppose this Motion. This House Committee is not informing this House whether or not they invited the County Executive Committee Member for Lands, Physical Planning, Housing and Urban Development, the County Executive Committee Member for Medical Services and Sanitation, and any other County Executive Committee Member to respond to what the Select committee on Public Accounts had already tabled in this House and approved by the Members of this County Assembly.

Madam Speaker, what they are informing this House here are stories pertaining to Land Transfers. They ought to have informed this House that they invited that County Executive Committee Member for Lands, Physical Planning, Housing and Urban Development and questioned him on why transfers have not been done. But not telling us that we give another recommendation that transfers should be done. Madam Speaker, until when shall we be moving in circles like this? Again, on matters that were highlighted by Public Accounts Committee on staffing, the Implementation Committee is still giving almost the same recommendation that were given by that relevant House Committee (PIC/PAC).

Madam Speaker, instead of informing this House, for example, that on a particular date, they invited the County Executive Committee Member for Medical Services and Sanitation and placed the requirement upon which the County Executive Committee Member ought to have done. What is it doing in terms of staffing of these facilities? Not coming here and telling us again that they are recommending the recruitment of more staff.

Madam Speaker, we cannot go on like this. This is what was done with the report on Assets. Madam Speaker, did they invite them or not. Madam Speaker, if we continue moving like this, our recommendations will go in circles until our time in this Assembly ends without being prudently active and doing anything that the Executive should do for the benefit of the people. Madam Speaker, this is not a report that should be supported in this Assembly. Thank you, Madam Speaker.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Oginga, Nominated Member): Yes, Honourable Caren Ajwang’, I have noticed you. Honourable Nyaoke and Honourable Obaso, I have equally noticed you

**Hon. Caren** (MCA, Kaloleni/Shaurimoyo): Thank you, Madam Speaker for the according me this opportunity to give my sentiments on this matter. Madam Speaker, I was very keen when Honourable Warindu was giving his presentation. At one point, I had to go back to check whether or not the report was from the Select Committee on Implementation or the Public Investments and Accounts Committee.

Madam Speaker, this House Committee has presented almost the same recommendations that were earlier presented by the Public Investments and Accounts Committee in this House. They would have informed this House what progress they have made as per the recommendation

provided by the Public Investments and Accounts Committee, and what has so far been done. Therefore, Madam Speaker, they ought to have done more. I do not support this report. Thank you.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Oginga, Nominated Member): Yes, Honourable Obaso.

**Hon. Obaso** (Nominated Member): Thank you Madam Speaker, I rise to strongly support the report before this House and as per my opinion, the report is just fine. Secondly, you know how sometimes the County works and everything has to be captured within the frame of Budget.

Madam Speaker, it is my belief that, the timeframe that has been given by the Implementation Committee on the implementation of those recommendations which I believe are just in order. Therefore, the Select Committee on Implementation should be given time to go back and revisit those recommendations to see if they have been implemented as per this Report. Thank you, Madam Speaker. I support strongly.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Oginga, Nominated Member): Yes, Honourable Oraro.

**Hon. Oraro** (MCA, Kolwa Central): Madam Speaker, you consult too much yet I wanted you to listen to what I have to say. Madam Speaker, it is not about your ears, but attention.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Oginga, Nominated Member): Honourable Oraro, you know I cannot stop this session for me to consult. So, kindly go ahead.

**Hon. Oraro** (MCA, Kolwa Central): Madam Speaker, there are two different House Committees involved in this Report, i.e. Public Investments and Accounts which is getting most of the information from the Auditor General. After which this House Committee is placed in a position where they can be reported in the Assembly. Upon reporting to the Assembly, the Select committee on Implementation, as per the knowledge of Members, was to ensure that they give us report of what is going on among the recommendation of various Committees in this House. You cannot just copy-paste recommendation provided earlier by a certain House Committee (PIC/PAC) which the Implementation Committee had done and you report the same to the Assembly and you expect this House to just approve.

Madam Speaker, the point is that the Implementation Committee is given a special task to make a follow-up and give the House a clear indication that something happening. But if you present the same report, then I do not know which House Committee is tasked to check on the implementation status. Therefore, it means that this House Committee really needs another induction so that they get the information right. We want to task this House Committee with serious recommendation from various House Committees, be it the Departmental Committee on Infrastructure, or either Water to follow-up so that they give those County Executive Committee Members or the concerned Officers pressure to ensure that any available money under Operations and Maintenance can actually do some small activities that is supposed to be done.

However, by the look of things, we will not accept as Members that a House Committee which we put our hopes on, will just bring a copy-paste report trying to sugarcoat the PIC/PAC Report for the purposes of reporting to this Assembly. Madam Speaker, It is my belief that the Chairperson or the mover of the Motion should kindly ask you that he withdraws the report, waiting for his Chairperson to consult, and the clerk to give direction so that this report is brought back another day, Madam Speaker. But by the look of things, if these are the reports we are going to entertain in this House, then I am sure we are heading nowhere.

Madam Speaker, I am kindly asking Honourable Warindu, who have been in this House for more than two and a half years now. If something is not working, just withdraw your report and do some amendments with proper explanation so that as a House, we believe that they are actually doing something, and the County Executive should feel the strength of the Select Committee on Implementation. If that is not going to be felt, then even some of the things that we recommend in this house will just be taken as a joke. That is my prayer, and I really oppose the report.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Oginga, Nominated Member): Yes, Honourable Tom Nyaoke, representing North Nyakach Ward.

**Hon. Nyaoke** (MCA, North Nyakach): Thank you Madam Speaker. I am amazed by some of the presentations which have been made by fellow members who have just contributed to this report. Madam Speaker, I want to make it abundantly clear that in as much as my colleagues are seeing that this is not a proper report; it may be because they have not read some parts of this report and I am able to demonstrate that.

Madam Speaker, it is true that on 15<sup>th</sup> May, 2024, this Honourable House adopted a report of the Select Committee on Public Investments and Accounts on the matter of the examination of the Auditor General's report on the Financial Statements of Lumumba Hospital for the year ended 30 June, 2022. Madam Speaker, according to Article 185 of the Constitution and Section 8 and 9 of the 2012 Government Act of 2012, and the provisions of Standing Order No. 191, the mandate of the Select Committee on Implementation as well spelt out. I am talking as a member of this House Committee whose report is presented to this House today.

Madam Speaker, pursuant to the relevant sections of the law, we are given directives on what we are supposed to do. Therefore, Madam Speaker, part of it is to investigate, look upon the recommendations which were given by the PIC/PAC committee. Last but not least, Madam Speaker is to provide the implementation status on those very recommendations from the Select Committee on Public Investments and Accounts. That is exactly what we did. What we are reading here, and what has been read by my colleague, Honourable Warindu on this report, is we are just giving this House, the implementation status in relation to that report of the Select Committee on Public Investments and Accounts and the recommendations.

Madam Speaker, as a House Committee we did indeed engage, as provided in the Standing Orders and the relevant sections of the law. The County Executive Committee Members from the relevant departments and this is the report that we came up with. If you look at the detail, forget about that, because my colleague was reading it in summary form, Madam Speaker, if you go to the details of the report, you will find proper reports in each and every step, touching on each and every recommendation that was given by the Select Committee on Public Investments and Accounts.

Madam Speaker, it may look the same to just ordinarily looking at the report. You may think it is the same as the report of the Select Committee on Public Investments and Accounts, but Madam Speaker, if you go to the details of this report, you will actually be able to identify the differences as has been outlined by the report. I therefore pray to my...

*(Hon. Oraro rises on a Point of Order)*

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Oginga, Nominated Member): Honourable Oraro, what is your Point of Order?.

**Hon. Oraro** (MCA, Kolwa Central): Madam Speaker, I want to inform the House and Honourable Nyaoke.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Oginga, Nominated Member): Okay, go ahead.

**Hon. Oraro** (MCA, Kolwa Central): Thank you Madam Speaker, I have keenly listened to what Honourable Nyaoke is stating about the report which was the Audited report for Lumumba Sub-County hospital for the year ended 30<sup>th</sup> June, 2022. This report was read in 2024, that was last year.

Madam Speaker, the implementation the members are talking about is the recommendation that was done last year May, 2024. One year down the line, the member is very comfortable saying that from all those things, he is just looking at the status. He does not care if it is done, as long as the report states otherwise. So, I wanted him to talk knowing that, we are not doubting whatever they have written. Our concern as a House is not about whatever they have written, it is about what is the County Executive is doing about the recommendation from the Auditor General, from the Select Committee on PIC/PAC approved by the Assembly, that is the report, so that they can inform us that this thing that you recommended, it has not been done. This is the position of the County Executive, unlike the idea of trying to give us the progress report, which can be done by the relevant House Committees of Medical Services. So, Honourable Nyaoke, just accept that this report was not well done, and ask for more time.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Oginga, Nominated Member): Yes, Honourable Nyaoke.

**Hon. Nyaoke** (MCA, North Nyakach): Thank you Mr. Speaker. I want to repeat that possibly my colleague, Honourable Oraro, has not taken time to actually comb through this report. Maybe, the reason is that the member arrived when we were starting the discussion on the report.

Madam Speaker, why am I talked about the status, is that is one of the core mandates of the Implementation Committee, to give this House the implementation status of those particular reports, Madam Speaker. We have actually gone step by step, as per the recommendations which were given by relevant House Committee at that time, and we are able to outline each and every step. The report is here, Madam Speaker. If my colleague, Honourable Oraro would want a hard copy, maybe we can request for the provision of the hard copy. However, all those items the member is talking about, having been omitted in that report, are in fact included and outlined step by step.

*(Hon. Boitone rises on a Point of Order)*

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Oginga, Nominated Member): yes, Honorable Boitone.

**Hon. Boitone** (MCA, Nyalenda “A”): Thank you, Madam Speaker. I want to inform the House about what Honourable Kelvin Oraro has just mentioned, and the direction that Honourable Nyaoke is giving is misleading.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Oginga, Nominated Member): What is it Honourable Ochele?

**Hon. Ochele** (MCA, East Kano/Wawidhi): Madam Speaker, the Member arose on a point of Order, and by beginning his statement, he diverted to informing the House. Is he on a Point of Order, if that is the case, what is it that is not in order? Or is the member informing the House? Therefore, he should be specific...

*(Hon. Oliver interjects with a Point of Order)*

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Oginga, Nominated Member): What is it Honourable Oliver?

**Hon. Oliver** (MCA, Kobura): Madam Speaker, Honourable Ochele is naked. I think he is still swimming from River Awach, Madam Speaker.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Oginga, Nominated Member): I would like to request the Serjeant-at-Arms to confirm if Honourable Ochele is actually naked. May Honourable Ratib Boitone continue. Although, let your point be on information.

**Hon. Boitone** (MCA, Nyalenda “A”): Yes, on a point of information. Madam Speaker, the mandate of the Implementation Committee is to interrogate the status of the reports that have been approved in this House. Upon interrogation of those reports, if there is a question or a matter that they need to get more information on, they need to invite the relevant authorities to get the correct information. Therefore, avoiding repetitions by giving same recommendation that had earlier on been provided by Select Committee on Public Accounts. Thank you, Madam Speaker.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Oginga, Nominated Member): Yes, Honourable Tom Nyaoke please continues, and it is my belief that you are appropriately informed.

**Hon. Nyaoke** (MCA, North Nyakach): Madam Chairperson, the information Honourable Ratib Boitone has given is misleading to some extent. Madam Speaker, the member is informing us like a Member of the Implementation Committee. Therefore, Madam Speaker, this report is self-explanatory.

Madam Speaker, there is no any ambiguity in this particular report, that is why I simply invite my fellow colleagues to read this report in details, and they will be able to see that what they are saying we did not do is exactly what we did, and that is why we have come with this particular report, Madam Speaker.

*(Hon. Okombo rises on a Point of Order)*

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Oginga, Nominated Member): Yes, Honourable Nereah Okombo.

**Hon. Okombo** (MCA, Manyatta “B”): Madam Speaker, allow me refer the House to the provisions of Standing Order No. 191, which talks on the Mandate of Implementation Committee. I want the Members of the Implementation Committee trying to defend the recommendation of this report, to keenly look at the mandate as outlined in our Standing Orders. Allow me to read, Madam Speaker.

- a) *There shall be a select committee to be known as the Committee on Implementation, comprising of the Chairperson and not less than eight or not more than ten other Members. The committee shall scrutinize the resolutions of the County Assembly, including adopted committee reports, petitions, and the undertakings given by the County Executive Committee, and examine; Whether or not such decisions and undertakings have been implemented and where implemented, the extent to which they have been implemented, and whether such implementations have taken place within the minimum time necessary.*

- b) *whether or not legislation passed by the County Assembly has been operationalized and where operationalized, the extent to which such operationalisation has taken place within the minimum time frame.*
- c) *Madam Speaker, lastly, the committee may propose the County Assembly to set assembly sanctions against any Members of the County Executive Committee who fail to report to the relevant select committee on implementation status of projects and programmes under his or her docket within justifiable reasons. Madam Speaker, we want to see this committee biting.*

Madam Speaker, this is a watchdog committee, and they should not do recommendations like any other House Committee. All House Committees, or any other House Committee, depend on the implementation Committee to actually have their resolutions or proposals implemented, and where they are not implemented, sanctions proposed by this House Committee.

Madam Speaker, there is a common word used throughout this report, that moving forward. Madam Speaker, we all know in this House that moving forward is a word, a term, mainly used by the select Committee on Public Investments and Accounts (PIC/PAC). Therefore, this House Committee, is merely copy-pasting what PIC/PAC has done, and I do not want to debate but was informing the House, that they should look at their mandates as per our Standing Orders and give us recommendations in line with their mandates. Thank you, Madam Speaker.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Oginga, Nominated Member): Honourable Nyaoke, I hope you are aware that your time limit for debate is almost coming to an end.

**Hon. Nyaoke** (MCA, North Nyakach): Madam Speaker, but I hope you also take cognizance of the interruptions that have occurred. However, all in all, this point must get into my fellow Members so that they are able to understand, Madam Speaker. Thank you for your indulgence.

Madam Speaker, the Deputy Speaker has talked about a very important section of the Standing Order No. 191. It is true that sometimes we need to bite, but we also have to bite within the Law, Madam Speaker. We do not just wake up and bite in any particular report that we find. But if we find that progress is going on, Madam Speaker, if there is nothing to bite, we don't just wake up to bite. We also have to do that within the confines of the law. Madam Speaker, how I wish, because even some of the steps that have been taken, when we look at even particularly the personnel recruitment, Madam Speaker, we went through with them and we saw, actually, what had been recommended by the Select committee on Public Investments and Accounts, at least is picking some steps, Madam Speaker.

Madam Speaker, we are all aware that even employing personnel cannot take one day, Madam Speaker. That is also some reasoning that we also have as members.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Oginga, Nominated Member): Yes, Honorable Moses Ochele. I hope you are well-dressed.

**Hon. Ochele** (MCA, East Kano/Wawidhi): Thank you Madam Speaker. Having gone through the report, and bearing in mind that Honorable Nyaoke who is my friend and my MCA, happens to be a member of that House Committee called the Implementation Committee, and I am finding Honourable Nyaoke eloquently defending the motion and kind of is carrying the burden of this House Committee on his shoulder. Madam Speaker, going by the adoption sheet schedule, there are members who declined to append their signatures.

Madam Speaker, when you decline to append your signature on a report that belongs to your House Committee then that implies that you are not in agreement. It is a fact that in the committee sittings where this report was manufactured, Honorable Nyaoke was in a disagreement. So, coming here now to start debating, starting to convince us while he was convinced at that plenary sitting of the House Committee that the report is bad, I think is completely out of order and it should not even be given time to debate. Thank you.

**Hon. Nyaoke** (MCA, North Nyakach): Thank you, Madam Speaker...

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Oginga, Nominated Member): Honorable Nyaoke, please talk through the Chairperson, you don't just rise and start talking. You must get permission from the Honourable Speaker..... Honourable Nyaoke, please conclude.

**Hon. Nyaoke** (MCA, North Nyakach): Thank you, Madam Speaker. Signing a document can be misconstrued to be having rejected the report, but Madam Speaker, I am fully behind the report. I want to confirm. It is only that the date of signing, I was elsewhere in an official duty. Otherwise, if the provision of Standing Order would allow me to sign now, I can even still sign it. Madam Speaker, I don't want to go any further on this issue, but I still pray that my colleagues see the sense of this report.

Madam Speaker, this status report is very important. I am sure that the biting is going to be done later only if we fail to adopt this motion. But if you seriously want some biting to take place, I plead with my colleagues that we adopt this motion and then you see how biting is going to be executed in the near future. Thank you, Madam Speaker. I beg to support.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Oginga, Nominated Member): Yes Honourable Samuel Dede.

**Hon. Dede** (MCA, Kisumu North): Thank you Madam Speaker. I also rise to oppose this report. Going by the observation, which has been read by Honorable Warindu, the member or mover of the motion is informing this House that, there was rectification on the errors.

Madam Speaker, what is there any proof to show that there was rectification on the report which was read by the Select Committee on Public Investments and Accounts? Madam Speaker, we get that there were some issues pertaining the operationalization of the facility and still the House Committee is informing us that they have given a timeline of 30 days upon the adoption of the report, which was adopted by the Select Committee on Public Investments and Accounts, and is when they are going to work on the Facility Finance Act, which was operationalized, the same House Committee is informing this House that, in the coming 30 days upon the adoption of the report, Madam Speaker, if I may ask, when was the report adopted and the 30 days since the report was brought on board?

Madam Speaker, we are talking of getting the issue of land. We have seen that there was an invitation for the Department of Lands, Physical Planning, Housing and Urban Development through the Department of Medical Services. It was done on 10th July, 2024. Did they appear and testify over the invitation they brought?

Madam Speaker, again, this House Committee is informing this House concerning the additional recruitment of six staff and it is not stated well which department and the procedure which was followed to get the six staffs, which made them draw out to 21. We are not aware of that. If you proceed with this, Madam Speaker, the recommendations which have been given by the Select Committee on Public Investments and Accounts is just the duplication of what was earlier on provided by this House Committees, is then given here and back by the implementation Committee.

Madam Speaker, once more, if we go with this status, you see that we are just going to duplicate our duties and each and every House Committee has got a role to do in this House to play, Madam Speaker. By proceeding with this motion, it would have been prudent that Honorable Nyaoke, who is also a member of this House Committee, would have signed and be part of the report which is being read today, and I hope that is why, Honorable Warindu, so it is nice to appoint someone who was not a member of this House Committee to second the report. Madam Speaker, if that Honorable Were seconded the report, even though it was a report for the House right now, but the Honorable Member was a member of that House Committee who distanced himself from the report, is now debating supporting the report.

With those, Madam Speaker, we see that giving a report, being the report was for the House now, Madam Speaker, the time span at which the report was brought to the Assembly, it is too late, and even if you were to report, it was the report of the House, but it was circulated to the Members, very late at 13:16 Hours, which has been often done earlier in the day, 12:24 Hours before the report is being brought to us.

Madam Speaker, but again, I am not a member of this House Committee, it is now when I am seeing the report, and it was the report of the House being brought an hour to the debating time. So, I want to distance myself from this report, and if given time, they would have requested to go and fine-tune the report. Madam Speaker, I oppose the report. Thank you.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Oginga Nominated Member): Honorable members, I would like to inform the House that it was a ruling that was passed in this House, that once a document has been tabled, then it becomes a document of the House, and any Member is allowed to second. Honorable Dede, I hope you are informed on that.

**Hon. Dede** (MCA, Kisumu North): Thank you, Madam Speaker, for the information. That why I have said it has been given to a Member...

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Oginga Nominated Member): Honorable Dede, I asked you if you are informed on that point. Are you informed?

**Hon. Dede** (MCA, Kisumu North): Madam Speaker, I am informed, however I need more clarification on the information. Thank you.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Oginga Nominated Member): Honourable member, I believe that you need to go back to the sessions that that was passed. Thank you.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Oginga Nominated Member): Yes, Honorable Moses Ochele.

**Hon. Ochele** (MCA, East Kano/Wawidhi): Thank you Madam Speaker. The Select Committee on Implementation is the ultimate committee that does the final cleanup of the messes committed by all the other House Committees. Therefore, in my own understanding, the working committee, the implementation committee should be the working committee. Which should be showing us the progress of actual activity, which the committee or Select Committee failed to do, and more so to ensure that all the recommendations on the reports and motions from this House are effected. Therefore, Madam Speaker, it is in my understanding that a report brought by Implementation Committee should be as effective as a practical action. Madam Speaker, it is amusing to note that the Chairperson, though absent, is a member of the Select Committee on Public Accounts.

Madam Speaker, again, the mover, who is Honorable Warindu, is a die-hard supporter of the select committee on Public Investments and Accounts (PIC/PAC) because he was just moved there the other day. I believe that all members are always live to the ruling of the Honourable Speaker. When Mr. Speaker said that even if you did not send the report, you have room to second. But because this is a Public Investments and Accounts affair, Honorable Warindu didn't

get to a point. Honorable James Were, who is also a member of the Public Investments and Accounts Committee, upon reviewing the report, it is evident that the work of this House Committee is beginning to mirror that of the Public Investments and Accounts. This reflects a certain mind-set and signals a deviation from the committee's intended purpose.

Madam Speaker, it appears that, this House Committee is being steered in the wrong direction, and I respectfully request that this particular report be set aside. Moving forward, I urge this House Committee to realign itself with its original mandate—as clearly articulated by the Honourable Member for Manyatta “B”, who also serves as the Deputy Speaker. Let us adhere strictly to the Standing Orders. The committee should clarify its scope of work and deliver substantive, original reports—not duplicates of work already done by other House Committees.

We deserve to be informed of the actual implementation status of the reports we table in this House. As it stands, Madam Speaker, I must express my disappointment. The chairperson of this House Committee has started off on the wrong foot. There have even been murmurs among members defending this report, suggesting that the previous chairperson was ineffective. But frankly, this report falls far short of expectations—even worse than previous ones.

Madam Speaker, I am left questioning why a capable leader was replaced with a member from Public Investments and Accounts Committee who has yet to present even a maiden report to this House. This is not a matter of being away on official duty—it suggests a lack of seriousness.

Madam Speaker, it feels as though the integrity of this House is being taken lightly. Therefore, Madam Speaker, I strongly oppose this report and urge the chairperson to reflect and correct course. Should there be no improvement, I believe the Selection Committee should reconsider and reinstate Honourable Bodo to her previous position. Thank you.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Oginga Nominated Member): Order!! Order!! Honourable members. Honourable members, we are still on the debate on the report.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Oginga Nominated Member): Yes, Honourable Okombo.

**Hon. Okombo** (MCA, Manyatta “B”): Madam Speaker, I’m trying to look at the mood of this House. And if you allow me to state the mood, Madam Speaker, the mood is that this report be shut down. And therefore, Madam Speaker, I call the mover to reply.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Oginga Nominated Member): Honourable Okombo, you are out of order.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Oginga Nominated Member): Yes, Honourable Obonyo, the deputy Whip.

**The Deputy Majority Whip** (Hon. Obonyo, MCA, South West Kisumu): Madam Speaker, I wish to call the mover.

**The Temporary Speaker** (Hon. Oginga Nominated Member): Yes, Honourable Warindu.

**Hon. Warindu** (MCA, Miwani): Thank you Madam Speaker. I also wish to extend my sincere appreciation to all Honourable Members for their contributions during this debate. From the discussions held, it is evidently clear that we often engage in debate without thoroughly reviewing the content of the reports before us. This particular report was scheduled to be moved on Tuesday afternoon, but due to lack of quorum, it had to be deferred.

It is surprising, Madam Speaker, to hear a member claim that the report was only posted moments ago. Such remarks suggest that our debates are often driven more by emotion than by facts. Some members have raised concerns, stating that the Implementation Committee made recommendations and resolutions without involving the management team of Lumumba Hospital. However, if one takes the time to read the Chairperson's foreword, it is clearly stated that the management of the Lumumba facility was indeed invited and engaged. The information presented in this report was obtained directly from them.

It seems there is an expectation that we should have called the County Executive Committee Member for Medical Services and Sanitation to validate that the interrogation took place. But, Madam Speaker, this engagement happened—between the Implementation Committee and the hospital's management team.

Honourable Members, I have listened to the debate, but I have not heard any arguments directly challenging the facts or findings outlined in our report. There were also suggestions that our recommendations mirror those of the Select Committee on Public Investments and Account. Please let me clarify: where such similarities exist, it is because we referenced to the recommendations of the Select Committee on Public Investments and Account to provide context. Our House Committee used them as a benchmark to determine whether corrective measures had been implemented.

Madam Speaker, for example, the Public Investments and Account had recommended that the hospital's financial statements must reflect a true and fair position in accordance with Section 164(3) of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012. During our interrogation, the management confirmed that this had been addressed—the issues were rectified, accurate figures were entered, and the trial balance now reconciles. Is that not a clear achievement attributable to the Implementation Committee?

Madam Speaker, there was even a suggestion that we should have attached the original trial balance sheet from Public Investments and Account Committee. But that is not our role—we are to assess implementation, not reproduce previous reports.

I truly wish that members had taken time to read both the Public Investments and Account Committee report and ours, and made informed comparisons before dismissing our work. Let us not debate simply to reject a report—let us debate on facts.

Madam Speaker, Honourable members, on the issue of staffing, it is widely known in Kisumu County that the Department of Medical Services does not directly recruit staff. Even the facility itself acknowledges it is understaffed. Our report recommends increased funding to support recruitment. That is a practical, forward-looking solution.

All of us participate in the budget-making process, yet we have never prioritized staffing in our health facilities. The report presents both the ideal staffing levels and the current numbers. These are not assumptions; these are facts from the facility, presented to us during our engagements.

Madam Speaker, Honourable members, regarding land ownership, we are all aware that, many public facilities—health centres and ECDs—sit on privately owned land. Transfers have yet to occur. Our report recommends that the Department of Medical Services work closely with the Department of Lands, Physical Planning, Housing and Urban Development to expedite this process. Ironically, even the Chair of the Departmental Committee on Lands, whose docket handles this matter, expressed concern about these very issues—ones currently under their jurisdiction.

Madam Speaker, it is the right of every member to debate and vote. However, my sincere plea is that we base our decisions on an informed understanding of the reports we receive—not summaries or assumptions.

We will abide by the decision of this House, but I urge Honourable members to recognize the effort and diligence the Implementation Committee put into this work. I respectfully request that this report be passed and adopted. Thank you, Madam Speaker. I now make my reply.
